Status of School St./Eagle Peak Pump Station Improvements – Mr. Geremia reported that the shop drawings have been approved and the contractors will begin assembling the station. Mr. Geremia also reported that the easement has been granted. Mr. Geremia stated that the old stations will remain in operation during the construction process, so there will not be any interruptions.

**Status of Bella Restaurant Sewer Design Review** - Mr. Geremia reported the all reviews are complete and the office staff is just waiting for payment on the reviews.

**Status of Police Station Sewer Design Review –** Mr. Geremia reported that they are waiting for the drainlayer to schedule a date to do the connection.
