COMMUNICATIONS

Supervisor Grattidge said that the NYS Dept. of Transportation wants to meet with the Board to begin discussions of the bridge replacement on Peaceable Street. The Town has been awarded a \$998,060.00 grant from the NYS Bridge NY program for the Peaceable Street over Tributary of the Mourning Kill replacement. The planning will begin in 2019 and the actual work is planned for the summer of 2020.

- 10. Plowed and sanded roads multiple times
- 11. Our intern has left, worked six weeks
- 12. Mixing of salt sand
- 13. Shoveling and salting walks
- 14. Jenkins Road looking into quality problems with material
- 15. Marking road cross culverts for winter plowing

Emergency Preparedness – Councilman Robbins said that he and Marshall Heritage attended the Hazard Mitigation training in September and will attend the 2nd part this week. He also attended the Tier 3 Emergency management training.

Zoning – For the month of October, there were 12 Building Permits issued, 1 search completed, \$1,820 in fees collected and the permit value was \$96,500.00.

Town of Ballston Library – Colleen Smith reported: The annual holiday tree lighting was a big success with about 250 people attending. This great community event is made possible due to collaboration with the BH-BL Rotary, BH-BL BPA, BH Fire Department, and the Friends of the Library. The library's new outdoor drive-up book return is open at the rear of the building! This new service was made possible by a grant from the Southern Adirondack Library System and Bullet Aid received from the New York State Senate. Winter session programs are scheduled for December through February. Visit the library's website or pick up a flyer at the library to see all the great opportunities. The library will be closed on December 24 and 25 and January 1. The library will close early at 2:00 pm on December 31.

Zoning – In November, there were 4 Building Permits, 4 CCs and 1 CO issued, 1 search was conducted, and \$810 in fees was collected. The permit value was \$625,300.00.

Constables – In November, there were 37 patrols, 24 complaints, 15 911 calls, 11 accidents & 4 EMT calls responded to. 3,018 miles were traveled, and 35 tickets were issued (25 issued on Route 67).

Dog Control – In November, there were 9 calls (2 relating to other animals), 9 expired licenses followed up on, 6 dogs returned to owner, and 2 dogs taken to the Animal Shelter.

Councilwoman Heritage said that she attended a 100th birthday party for Jean Brinkman, who lived much of her life in Charlton. She gave Mrs. Brinkman a congratulatory card and letter from the Town Board.

Councilwoman Heritage said that the Town Board will host "Coffee with the Council" on Saturday morning January 5th from 9:30am to 11am at the Town Hall. Any and all residents that would like to discuss concerns or ask questions of the Board are invited to come and chat with the Councilman.

Planning Board – In November, the Board approved the Rossdeutscher subdivision on Vines Road. Councilman Grasso said that the Planning Board has spent the past six months working on a list of recommended changes for the Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations. Paul Borisenko has also compiled a list of minor wording changes. Possible changes will be done in 2019.

Cell Tower/Antenna – Councilman Grasso said that he spoke with the Attorney for Verizon to find what Verizon's intentions are. The Attorney said that the application for a cell tower on Charlton Road is currently inactive. Verizon has let the application go dormant. Verizon may move forward with application for the Charlton Road site in 2019. If they do, the tower would not be built until 2020. Councilman Grasso encouraged residents to write letters to Verizon to request the cell tower. He will get information as to whom the letters should be addressed to.

Historian - Marv Livingston introduced Daniel Wolczyn, the Eagle Scout that cleaned up the Degraff Road Cemetery as his Eagle Scout project. Daniel said that the cemetery was a real mess when he first started. Daniel cut weeds and cleaned out brush, removed an old fence, dug holes and installed a new split rail fence. Mr. Livingston said that the cemetery looks great now. It is an old Revolutionary War cemetery and has 5 – 10 headstones in it. The Town Board thanked Daniel for his hard work and the good job that he did.

WHEREAS, the above-referenced resolution included identification and receipt of an application from The Foundation of St. Mary's Healthcare Inc., said application dated October 3, 2018, applying for an exceptional use permit authorized by Article VII of the Town of Charlton Zoning Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has also received a site plan dated August 16, 2018 prepared by ABD Engineers, LLP; an owners list of neighboring properties to the subject parcel which are located within 1500 feet of the proposed site; a narrative of the exceptional use permit proposal; a Short Environmental Assessment Form, Part I; and a photo of a current St. Mary's Urgent Care facility for reference purposes, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board noted that at its October 9, 2018 meeting the Town Board considered this application with the applicant, consulted with the Town of Charlton Zoning

Enforcement Officer, consulted with the Town Attorney regarding issues required to be considered in processing this application according to Article VII of the Town of Charlton Zoning Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board voted to retain primary jurisdiction of this application as authorized by Article VII, Section 3(A) of the Town of Charlton Zoning Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board further declared itself as lead agency with respect to all matters involving the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) with respect to this application, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board did authorize the Town Clerk to submit for publication a legal notice for a public hearing, to be held on November 26, 2018, which notice was published in the Daily Gazette on November 15, 2018, a copy of which legal notice is attached to this resolution and made a part hereof, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board held a public hearing on Monday, November 26, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. regarding the application for an exceptional use permit, and

WHEREAS, during the public hearing the applicant made a detailed presentation as to the proposed site plan for 2370 Route 67, and

WHEREAS, members of the public in attendance and members of the Town Board were able to ask questions of the applicant's representatives regarding the proposed site plan, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has considered all of the documentation submitted to it with respect to the requested exceptional use permit, which documentation includes but is not limited to an updated site plan titled "Site Plan St. Mary's Charlton Urgent Care", prepared by ABD Engineers, LLP, originally dated August 16, 2018 and last revised November 15, 2018; original application dated October 3, 2018 which included a list of owners of real properties located within 1500 feet of the proposed urgent care facility; a detailed project narrative; a SEQRA Short Environmental Assessment form dated August 17, 2018, revised November 20, 2018; a building rendering; opinion letter from the Charlton Environmental Conservation Commission dated November 13, 2018; letter from the Saratoga County Planning Board dated November 19, 2018; advisory opinion from the Town of Charlton Planning Board dated November 24, 2018; opinion letter from Town Engineer Michael McNamara of Environmental Design Partnership, LLP dated November 1, 2018; Zoning Board of Appeals draft minutes from the October 30, 2018 meeting; and a complete SEQRA application prepared by councilman Joseph Grasso dated November 26, 2018, and

WHEREAS, acting in its capacity as lead agency for the SEQRA review, the Town Board has determined that this exceptional use permit application is properly classified as an unlisted action, that the Town Board did make a negative declaration relative to the environmental significance of the proposed land use subject of the application, and a copy of the resolution is attached to this resolution and made a part hereof, and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 1 of the Charlton Zoning Ordinance sets forth six criteria to be considered by the Town Board in determining whether or not the requested exceptional use permit should be granted, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board hereby determines that the granting of the requested exceptional use permit will not substantially endanger the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the neighborhood, nor adversely affect the environment (reference SEQRA review), and

WHEREAS, this project is appropriately located with respect to transportation facilities, water supply, fire and police protection, waste disposal and similar facilities, and

WHEREAS, the neighborhood character and surrounding property values are not substantially endangered by the issuance of the requested exceptional use permit, and

WHEREAS, the exceptional use proposed for the site will not cause undue traffic congestion or cause a traffic hazard, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board hereby determines that pursuant to Article VII, Section 6 entitled "Consideration of Effect on Neighboring Properties", the applicant has complied with such requirements and notified all property owners within 1,500 feet of the proposed urgent care facility site as required for professional buildings, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board hereby affirms that the 6 criteria set forth in Article VII, Section 1, General Regulations, are hereby in compliance; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board hereby requires the applicant to formally advise the Town Board in the event the urgent care facility is or will be closed for a period of exceeding one (1) year, and to cooperate with the Town Board in determining any future use of the subject property.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby grants the application of St. Mary's Hospital also known as the Foundation of St. Mary's Healthcare, Inc. for an exceptional use permit subject to the conditions as shown on the site plan as last revised, which is subject to all of the conditions and requirements as shown or described on the site plan as approved, subject to the determinations by the Zoning and Building Officers of the Town of Charlton with respect to compliance with the New York State Building Code.
