The Board discussed the following items:

- Discussed purpose of meeting was to review reasons behind currently proposed zoning amendments (3/31/15 draft)
- Discussed next steps in re-zoning process
- Discussed unlicensed vehicles and suggestion to delete "Operational", reference Page 35
- Discussed pros and cons associated with proposed change to minimum lot size for the keeping of horses, from 3 acres to 5 acres
- Discussed consistency or lack thereof with Ag and Markets Law
- Discussed merits of requirement for Manure Management Plan and need to develop implementation policies and procedures
- Discussed previous consideration of subtraction of wetlands from minimum lot area
- Discussed previous consideration of buffer requirements for certain streams and wetlands
- Discussed proposed setbacks associated with ground mounted solar arrays and consideration of less restrictive setbacks

- Discussed request for more changes to farm stand requirements including review of farm stands on lots without primary agricultural use
- Discussed rationale behind change in percolation rate from 45 minutes per inch to less restrictive 60 minutes per inch
- Discussed unintended change in proposed new language on Page 6 regarding restricting any unlisted "activities" versus unlisted "uses"
- Discussed Exceptional Use permit process required for Banquet Facilities

Most attendees participated in the discussions. Everyone was provided an opportunity to be heard.
