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ANNOUNCEMENTS & COMMUNICATIONS

The Town offices will be closed December 24th and 25th for the Christmas holiday.

The Town Board scheduled the 2016 Organizational Meeting for January 4, 2016 at 7:30, preceded by swearing in ceremony of newly elected officials at 7:00 p.m.

The Ballston Lake Business and Professional Association will hold their State of the Towns breakfast at the Charlton Town Hall at 8:00 a.m. during the first week of January. Supervisor Grattidge will verify the date and post it on the Town's website. The Town Board and the public are invited.

The Saratoga County Planning and Zoning Conference is scheduled for January 27th. Planning and Zoning Board members are encouraged to attend the training.

The Board has received a letter from Dan Dixon regarding his concerns with a facility at the corner of Crane Street and Charlton Road. The Zoning Officer has been asked to look into the concerns. The Board will follow up on the issue.

Supervisor Grattidge said that he has spoken with the Highway Superintendent, the Chief Constable and the Saratoga County Public Works Commissioner about the request from a resident for a speed reduction on Stage Road. None of them had any reports of concern of excessive speed on this section of road, but the County is leaving it up to the Town if they want to request a survey by the D.O.T. or not. The Board may discuss the issue at the Agenda meeting.

DEPARTMENT & COMMITTEE REPORTS

Zoning – In November there were 13 Building Permits issued and \$3,708.92 was collected in application fees. 7 CO/CUs were issued with a total value of \$91,000.00.

Dog Control – In November, there were 11 complaints, 6 expired licenses followed up on, 2 unlicensed dog seized and returned to owner, and 4 Court appearance tickets issued. Supervisor Grattidge said that Ag & Markets send a Dog Control Officer Report and rated our Officer as satisfactory.

Constables – In November, there were 26 patrols, 25 complaints, 14 911 calls and 1 EID responded to, 2,003 miles traveled, and 28 tickets issued.

Water- John Morgan is still waiting for installation of parts from the Phoenix Group to replace the borrowed parts for the radio telemetry system.

Charlton Seniors – Marv Schorr reported that the Seniors are closing 2015 with approximately 200 members which is about the same as 2014.

Discussion: Supervisor Grattidge asked Maria Trabka from Saratoga Plan to speak regarding this resolution. She stated that this will be entered as 3 different applications. Saratoga Plan will be the applicant, Anderson Acres, Arnold's Fresh Produce and Eildon Tweed Farm will be the operators. Under the Arnold's Fresh Produce application, the land would be a portion of the Szurek farm land and all of the Vanderhorst farm land. The other two applications would be a portion of the Szurek farm land. Maria gave the Board a copy of a map showing the land. She confirmed that the value of the land is subject to appraisal. Councilman Grasso asked what would happen if not all of the applications were awarded the grant. Maria stated that she hopes that that Ag & Markets will approve it so that there are two easements, one for the Szureks and one for the Vanderhorsts, but it may be awarded as three for the Szureks property, or they may only do one or two. Councilman Grasso said that nothing is binding for the landowners until after the appraisals are done and the easement documents are written. The Councilman commended all of the parties involved for their efforts in keeping agriculture alive. He thinks that agriculture and the farmers of the Town are what really defines the most important cultural aspect of Charlton. Jason Arnold of Arnold's Fresh Produce said that land is essential to farmers, and every acre conserved is important. He thanked the Board for their support of the conservation efforts. Gary Vanderhorst said that the Arnolds have farmed his land for many years, and he feels that they are excellent farmers and great to work with. He feels that it is important to have substantial farm people in Charlton. Supervisor Grattidge thanked the Szureks and Vanderhorsts for wanting to conserve their land.

COUNCILMAN REPORTS

Councilman Lippiello thanked the many volunteers and people that have worked with the Town and gotten so many things done over the years.

Councilman Grasso said that he feels that the Board should solicit bids from other website hosting companies for the Town's website. The Town is currently paying about \$2,400 per year, and he feels that we could maybe get a more favorable rate if we had bids from other companies. Councilman Hodgkins said he has a list of companies to contact, and suggested a scope so that they are looking at the same thing.

Councilman Lippiello said that the feels that the Board should take a look at what the Town is paying for electric supply, as the company that we are currently using is charging over 8 cents per kw and National Grid is charging 4 cents per kw. He also feels that the Board should look at computer support providers for the Town as well.

Councilman Grasso said that Airosmith Development, who is putting together an application for the Verizon antenna for the water tower, is expected to submit a draft lease and application materials within the next month. Once received, he will get copies to the Board and feels that it would be prudent to have a public information meeting to review the documents.

Councilman Grasso said that he would like to see reimbursement reports along with the fuel vouchers when fuel is being sold to thefire departments. Councilman Hodgkins will work with the Highway Superintendent to improve the billing/reporting process.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Ron Serapilio, resident, said that he moved to Charlton in 1976 to the property located next to Gideon Hawley Park. He said that he understands that there are plans for the Ethel Maloney property next door to him to be changed to commercial from residential which it has always been. He has concerns about his quality of life and the quality of life for the residents of Charlton if the banquet house is approved. He stated that he will be sending letters to the Town Board shortly regarding this matter.

Carol Schweitzer thanked Bob Lippiello for his years of service on the Town Board and for the calm manner in which he handled himself, even in turbulent times.

Supervisor Grattidge said that the Board needs to go into Executive Session to discuss possible litigation.
