July 28, 2014

The Agenda meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Charlton, Saratoga County, New York was held at the Charlton Town Hall and called to order by Supervisor Grattidge at 7:40 p.m. to set the agenda for the August 11th Town Board Meeting.

RESOLUTION #132 Abstract of Claims

DISCUSSION

The Sales Tax report is expected to be released tomorrow, and will be reported at the next meeting. The Mortgage Tax for June was \$8,910.00.

Supervisor Grattidge said that Victoria Hayner has completed the paperwork to be appointed to the vacant Assessor position. She would need to run for election in the fall to complete the term, and again in 2015 to begin a new tern. He would like the Board to appoint her to begin September 1st, and he asked Attorney Van Vranken to prepare a resolution for this purpose.

Supervisor Grattidge said that a month ago, a resident asked to park a tractor trailer in the Town Hall parking lot overnight, and last week another resident asked to park his tractor trailer overnight also. He has concerns that the trailer could damage the blacktop, and also Constable Parks has asked that there be a Town policy about using the parking lot. Attorney Van Vranken said his concern would be more about any liability if the trailer was damaged. He suggested that the Town have a no overnight parking policy. The Board asked Attorney Van Vranken to draft a resolution for the next meeting that would make a policy that there is not overnight parking without Town Board approval.

Supervisor Grattidge said that the Saratoga County Sheriff's Traffic Investigation Officer was examining the intersection of Route 67 and Jockey Street. He has new equipment that is used for accident investigations. Because of the high frequency of accidents at that intersection, he was preprogramming the machine with the

layout of the roads at the intersection. This will make future investigations easier because they will already have this information stored in their system. He was commenting on the reason for so many fatalities occur and felt that when drivers look at Jockey Street from the south, it appears that the Street keeps going because of the slight incline in the road. He suggested that the Town request a blinking light at the intersection. The Board agreed that they would like Supervisor Grattidge to send a letter to NYS Department of Transportation to request a blinking light.

Councilman Lippiello said that last week there was a water main break at the intersection of Stage Road and Charlton Road. Bellamy Construction had the problem fixed promptly and the 4 or 5 residents affected were not without water for too long. Councilman Grasso asked for the costs of repair, but the amount is not yet known.

Councilman Lippiello said that John Morgan is not comfortable with the Verizon data line at the pump house because the signal is not steady. He is getting quotes for a radio signal from a company in Glens Falls, The company has tested an antenna on the pump house and it did work. Supervisor Grattidge said that the Water Department has a Repair Reserve Fund that would cover the cost, and the expense would not come out of the general fund.

The final equalization rate for 2015 is 71%.

Highway Superintendent Mike Emerich said that he would like to buy a sickle bar mower for the Department's tractor. A new one would cost about \$10,000.00. He has found one on the Federal Surplus list for \$275.00 but it is located in the State of Illinois. He said that he has spoken with the Highway Superintendent from Galway about riding out together to pick it up. They would be using Galway's truck and trailer, so the only cost to our Town would be some possible gas money, hotel and meals. In order to purchase from the Federal Surplus, the Town needs to register for the program. The Board asked Mr. Emerich to try and get some additional pictures of the mower prior to the purchase.
