The Agenda meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Charlton, Saratoga County, New York was held at the Charlton Town Hall and called to order by Supervisor Grattidge at 7:33 p.m. to set the agenda for the July 8th Town Board Meeting.

DISCUSSION

Bill Ryan, Special Counsel to the Water District addressed the Board regarding Water District #1, Extension #6. He said that the map plan report was prepared by Lansing Engineering, and has been reviewed by Town Engineer Mike McNamara. It sets forth boundaries and typical costs to property owners. Mr. Lansing has made the recommended changes set forth by Mike McNamara. Mr. Ryan said that the way that that Town will be creating this Water District Extension is called Operative 12. The map plan report has been given to the Town Board and once the petition is signed by the Assessors and certified by the Town Clerk, a public hearing can be scheduled. This project does not need the approval of the State Comptroller because the cost to the homeowner is far less than other water districts. An escrow agreement needs to be drafted and then signed by the developer. Attorney Ryan did not want to comment on the terms of the escrow agreement until he has reviewed it.

The Sales Tax for the month was \$97,311.00. The monthly mortgage tax was \$11,329.00.

Supervisor Grattidge said that there was recently another bad car accident at the intersection of Jockey Street and Route 67. The Public Works Department said that they did a study of accidents through May of 2012, and they have decided that the appropriate action at this time is to put up larger stop signs, as well as adding stop ahead signs. Councilman Gardner said that there have been 3 deaths this year. He feels that something more should be done. He suggested better speed enforcement or possibly rumble strips on the road. The Board discussed it further and decided that they would ask the State for further review.

Supervisor Grattidge said that he received a quote of \$295 from Bay State Elevator for a new UPS power backup for the elevator. The company said that the average life of the UPS is 3 years and they would like to replace the old one as a precaution, during their normal maintenance call.

RESOLUTION #108

Authorization to purchase UPS from Bay State Elevator Company

BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board has authorized the purchase of a new UPS power supply from Bay State Elevator Company at a cost of \$295.00.

Supervisor Grattidge said that the water bill will be \$21,000 higher than last year. There will be approximately \$8,000.00 of that amount received from water billing. The Town will need to transfer money to cover the difference, probably from the Water Repair fund.

Supervisor Grattidge gave the Board a copy of the accounting of the Park fees. He said he thinks that the remaining park fees from 2012 should be designated to a Parks Reserve Fund. The Board will look into how to handle this.

Town Clerk Brenda Mills asked the Board how they would like to handle the retirement systems reporting of the appointed Court Clerk's hours. A resolution must be done the year following an election for Elected Officials hours, and every year that an appointed official is appointed. The State suggested making the court clerk's appointment the same as the judge's term. The Board decided that that was not a good idea for the Town. The Clerk will discuss the matter further with the State.
