DEPARTMENT & COMMITTEE REPORTS

Dog Control - Councilman Verola reported that there were 2 dog related complaints in June.

Planning Board – Councilman Verola reported that the Board held a Public Hearing on June 17th and deliberated on 2 subdivision applications and had 1 pre-application conference.

Maintenance – Supervisor Grattidge said that Mr. Sturek is doing a great job keeping things in shape in and around the building. Mr. Sturek has requested a charge account at Lowes. The Supervisor also said that John Morgan has requested an account at Home Depot for the Water Department, and Mike Emerich wants to add the Highway Department to the account.

Constables: Councilman Lippiello reported that in June there were 27 patrols, 17 complaints, 4 911 calls, 1893 miles driven, 21 tickets issued, and 2 accidents responded to.

Library – Tom Shaginaw gave thanks to Senator Farley for obtaining a \$5,000 grant for the Library. He said that there are currently 85 programs being offered over the next 6 weeks and they have been well attended so far. There are 2 trustees that finished their terms and many thanks go to them for their service.

Historian – Marv Livingston said that he has contacted the Scouts regarding volunteer work. The Boy Scouts said that they would be willing to do restoration work, and the Girl Scouts are interested in mapping the cemeteries.

Highway – Mike Emerich said that the Department has the Crooked Street repaving project underway. They also have been working on replacing culverts and fixing water related problems. The zero turn mower is currently at the repair shop. There is no estimate yet of the repair cost. Today the Highway Department replaced the water faucet in Gideon Hawley Park. Mr. Emerich said he was thinking of painting the gazebo this summer. He is in the process of getting quotes for a new pick-up truck. He said that Cornell University is looking to end their association with the local roads program that is offered for training to Highway Superintendents each year. Mr. Emerich said that the septic pump at the Garage is broke. He received an estimate of \$1,200 to \$1,500 to replace and repair the problem from Charlton Septic. Supervisor Grattidge said that this expense would qualify as an emergency repair, and additional quotes are not needed.

ORDER FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON ESTABLISHMENT OF EXTENSION NO. 6 FOR THE TOWN OF CHARLTON WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 COUNTY OF SARATOGA, STATE OF NEW YORK, PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 12 OF THE TOWN LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

WHEREAS, a map, plan and report have been prepared in such manner and in such detail as is required by Article 12 of the Town Law of the State of New York and a petition pursuant to Article 12 of the Town Law of the State of New York relating to the establishment of Extension No. 6 for the Town of Charlton Water District No. 1, in the Town of Charlton, County of Saratoga, State of New York, has been filed in the Town Clerk's Office; and

WHEREAS, said map, plan and report was prepared by Lansing Engineering, PC, competent engineers, duly licensed by the State of New York, showing boundaries of the proposed District, general plan of the District and an analysis showing the costs thereof and method of operation; and, WHEREAS, said map, plan and report shows all facilities, including mains and transmission

lines, together with the location and the general description of all public works required; and,

WHEREAS, the boundaries of the proposed district are as described in Exhibit "A" annexed hereto; and,

WHEREAS, the improvements proposed consist of the construction of the infrastructure for Extension No. 6 to Water District No. 1 including, but not limited to, mains, laterals and transmission lines, in accordance with the map, plan and report now on file in the Office of the Town Clerk of the said Town of Charlton; and,

WHEREAS, the maximum amount proposed to be expended for said improvements is the sum of Three Hundred Sixty Thousand (\$360,000.00) Dollars; and,

WHEREAS, approval of the New York State Comptroller will not be required for the formation of Extension No. 6 for Town of Charlton Water District No. 1 inasmuch as the costs for all utilities and improvements will be paid entirely by the project owner/developer of the Heflin Durst Residential Cluster Subdivision; and,

WHEREAS, said map, plan and report describing said improvements are on file in the Town Clerk's Office for public inspection; and,

WHEREAS, the first year cost for full operation for the typical property within the District is \$205.00 for the water use fee and in addition residents of Extension No. 6 will be subject to the Town of Charlton Water District service charges and fees as set forth at Appendix I within the map, plan and report.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby **ORDERED**, that the Town Board of the Town of Charlton, shall meet and hold a public hearing at the Town of Charlton Town Hall, 758 Charlton Road, Charlton, New York 12019, in said Town, on the 29th day of July, 2013, at 7:00 p.m., local time, to consider said petition and the map, plan and report and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof as is required or authorized by law.

All that piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the Town of Charlton, County of Saratoga and State of New York, lying westerly of the existing Town of Charlton Water District No. 1, including certain properties, as described below, abutting Crooked Street between Swaggertown Road (Saratoga County Route 52) and the westerly boundary of said Town of Charlton Water District No. 1,

Water District Extension No. 4, and certain properties abutting said Swaggertown Road within the 24 lot subdivision known as "Heflin-Durst development", and being further bounded and described as follows:
