REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

In accordance with the school law of New Hampshire, the school board would herewith submit the following report:

The schools for the past year have, on the whole, been fairly prosperous, as far as the school board is able to judge. The terms have been short, owing to the limited amount of money we had for school purposes.

Teachers who have earned a place in the first rank by faithful work in the schools in town, and those who have a well established reputation, have been employed whenever it has been possible to secure their services with the limited amount of means at the hands of the school board. Some of them we have retained the whole year. We think that the longer such teachers are retained the more valuable their services become.

Some of the smaller schools have been supplied with teachers just commencing in school work, willing to give their best services for a small compensation, and ambitious to earn a reputation which will secure them better pay in the future. It is often safer to risk the school in the hands of a beginner than to try a teacher whose only recommendation is experience.

Good health has prevailed quite generally in our schools. All visits, and the closing of the schools, have been very satisfactory. We would strongly impress on the minds of teachers the necessity of good order in and out of the school-room, for, in our opinion, whenever a teacher is unsuccessful it is, in a large majority of cases, from lack of discipline.

We regret to say that during the past year, as in former years, there has been a lack of interest in some of our schools on the part of parents. To have good schools requires not only good teachers but the hearty co-operation of the parents with the teachers. There are those in town who take no interest in school affairs other than to find fault with the teachers. We should not expect any greater degree of perfection in teachers than in any other class

of people. Generally parents get their ideas of the school from the children. As a rule, children are not competent to judge of the merits or demerits of a teacher. We believe that if parents would only visit the school that nine times out of ten they would find it much different than represented by the child.

Temperance has been taught in our schools, and reading in the Testament and repeating the Lord's prayer have been the daily exercise.

We thought it advisable, under the present custom of transporting scholars, to send a part of District No. 1 to Loudon, and save transporting the same. [For charges, see treasurer's report.]

We hope that at the coming school meeting the intelligent men of Chichester will vote to raise money, in addition to what the law requires, for the purpose of educating our children, who so much need more schooling.

The prosperity of the schools for the coming year depends not only on your school board, but upon the hearty co-operation of parents and teachers with the school board.
