REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The month of February marks the close of the town's business for another year, and demands of its officials a history of the past year that the people may be more thoroughly conversant with their future needs. Your School Board being among that number obligated to a faithful performance of their duties, submit herewith for your consideration a report of the past school year, together with a statement of their accounts corresponding with the town's fiscal year.

The public school, the pride of the American people, continues to make rapid advances in improving its methods of education; and it is by reason of these new methods that school boards should be well informed in school work cutside of their own town district. The education of the child depends on his securing the proper start in the school, hence in the common school, particular attention must be paid to employment of suitable teachers, and it requires no small amount of care in selecting teachers who fill the necessary requirements. Thoroughness in the school, is the first and most important principle in acquiring an education. It is time and money thrown away to attempt to educate a child, unless the teacher is capable of instructing all branches thoroughly. Parents should bear in mind that their children are not possessed of abilty necessary to determine their qualifications of advancement and govern the child accordingly.

It was thought best at the commencement of the town year to divide the district, that is, to assign to each member of the board two schools, that the board might perform its labors with better satisfaction. By reason of this change the schools have been kept supplied and in better working order than when entirely dependent upon the chairman to supply all the schools. The division in schools gave Mr. Geo. W. Lake, Bear Hill and Centre schools to care for, and New Dover and Horse Corner for Mr.

H. S. Kelley, and Pine-Ground and Kelley's Corner to the chairman, each member to report at the end of the year to the chairman the teacher's ability and success. Mr. Kelley being absent, the report of his two schools, as far as teachers' success, will not be embraced in the following reports of teachers.

Owing to the lack of attention and progress made in reading it was thought best to introduce new books for supplementary reading that the pupil might be encouraged to take a more active interest in this study. For this purpose, after making an exhausting and careful examination of samples sent us from different firms, it was finally decided to introduce Carpenter's Geographical Reader for the fourth and fifth classes, and Stories of American Life and Adventure in the second and third classes. A suitable exchange was also made in Arithmetics with but little more cost than would have been required to purchase new books of the older series. What was true of the Arithmetics was also true of Spellers, the cost of new books being but a small advance of the cost of supplying new books of the series in present use. Writing books were changed from slanting to vertical copies without any extra expense. No other changes were considered necessary at the present time.

Following you will find a report of the success of the teachers in each district together with the cost of conducting each school:

KELLEY'S CORNER.

Mrs. Jennie M. Perkins taught the school in this district during the past year. Mrs. Perkins needs no praise from the School Board, being a teacher of experience and ability and giving satisfaction in all respects. Expenses of district, \$222.41.

BEAR HILL.

Miss Florence A. Stevens, teacher. The past year has been a very successful one in every branch of study. We believe this school, for the ages of the scholars, is better than the average. Miss Stevens has taught this school six terms in succession, and has proved herself a good teacher. Expense for year, \$201.30.

PINE GROUND.

The first term teacher, Mr. John P. Brown, was a teacher of experience and one fully qualified in every way to fill the position

to which he was assigned. Mr. Brown gave by his thoroughness and discipline extremely gratifying results. The examination passed by the scholars of this school at its close placed it in the front rank of scholarship of any school in town. The second and third term teacher, Miss Blanche H. Emerson continued the good work begun by Mr. Brown and proved herself fully capable of doing credit to the school. Expenses for the year \$266.70.

CENTRE.

The three terms were under the charge of Miss Emma F. Griffin. Miss Griffin is an experienced teacher and conducted the school very successfully. Expenses for the year, \$297.05.

The expenses at Horse Corner and New Dover Districts have been \$367.35 for the year, which with an additional expense of \$75.00 at Pleasant Street for tuition of scholars, completes the total for 1898, making \$1,429.81.
