## SCHOOL REPORT.

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The board of education for Chichester School District, respectfully submits the following:

Time, in its never ceasing flight, has brought us to the close of another fiscal year, and according to the custom, in addition to the statistical report, the board presents some few suggestions that the citizens of the district may have a clearer understanding of the conditions as they exist in connection with the schools.

By looking back upon the work of the past year, your board sees wherein it has made mistakes, and is confident as well of much success. In the nature of things much must be experimental and results often uncertain, but we have earnestly endeavored to perform the duties of the office conscientiously and for the common good, and wherever we have failed we ask your indulgence.

### TEACHERS.

In the selection of teachers it has been the rule not to change more often than was necessary for the general benefit of the schools. It has also been our aim to secure those with good moral and thorough intellectual training, as well as a natural aptitude for the work. It is often necessary in our rural schools to engage those who have had but limited experience; and while the one chosen may seem to be especially fitted for success in the vocation, we are liable to be disappointed in unexpectedly finding an apparent lack of some specific quality essential to success in the schoolroom. But without particularizing, which is sometimes unjust and perhaps unkind, the work performed and results obtained by our teachers, as a whole, has been very satisfactory, and much credit is due them for their zealous efforts.

## TEXT-BOOKS.

At the commencement of the year it was decided to make a change in the readers and grammars, as those in use were much worn, and it was necessary to procure many new ones to take the place of those nearly or entirely gone. And those who have had wide experience in the training of young minds have done much in recent years, by careful study, for the improvement of our school-books and the methods and results of teaching.

The board did not take upon itself the responsibility of choosing from the many modern series to be had, but carefully considered the ideas of those superintendents and instructors who have made school work a life study, and whose opinions must necessarily be of value. Surely, the awakened interest resulting from the introduction of later books has more than repaid the expenditure.

In order that the pupils may get the most good from them, they are allowed to take books from the schoolroom, and it devolves upon the parents to see that they are not misused. A thoughtful person will be as careful in the use of property loaned by the town as he should be in the use of an article borrowed of a neighbor, and see to it that his children are impressed with the same idea.

## ATTENDANCE.

It is the parent, too, who is responsible for the unnecessary non-attendance. With the exception of sickness, good reasons are few which keep children away from school. A list follows of those who have not been absent or tardy during the different terms, as recorded by the teachers, but doubtless the number would have been much larger had it not been for the prevalence of epidemics common to children. It is hoped that the per cent of attendance may be increased in the future, for the progress of the child in his or her studies is very generally indicated by the scarcity of "black marks" after the pupil's name in the school register. By not insisting upon strict regularity, during the short period which our schools are in session, you are doing those under your care an irreparable injury.

## SCHOOLHOUSES.

The money intrusted to the board for repairs has been largely expended at Bear Hill, as there was more need of immediate improvement there than elsewhere. This, with the work done at the Kelley's Corner school last year, gives us two very neat and attractive schoolrooms. Both buildings, however, need painting and some minor repairs upon the outside. A considerable portion of the appropriations of the last two years has also been expended at the Center and Pine Ground. But there is much need of further improvements at both houses. At the Center more seats suitable for the larger pupils should be added at once, and certainly it would be economy to paint both this and the Pine Ground schoolhouse in the near future. These repairs, with the expenditure made a short time ago at the Horse Corner, would put the property of the district in very good condition.
