The average number of books taken out during the winter is 20; during the summer, much larger.

The whole number of persons that have taken out books during the year is 136.

SCHOOL REPORT.

As the fifteenth of February marks the close of another year of the town officials, the School Board, in performance of their duties, with a statement of their accounts, corresponding with the town's fiscal year, submit for your consideration a report of the past school year.

The School Board have endeavored to the best of their ability to procure teachers for the several schools that would do credit to the scholars and be appreciated by the parents, and in a measure we trust we have succeeded.

In former years the supply of teachers, both experienced and inexperienced, far exceeded the demand. Now, there are no applications from either, and we have to make quite an effort to secure them. If we are fortunate enough to secure a good one, we appreciate them, and retain them, if possible.

In most of our schools for the three terms, of ten weeks each, we have had excellent teachers whom, we hope, the scholars, parents, and all concerned appreciated. Good progress has been made in all branches of study.

At the commencement of the schools we tried to impress upon teachers and scholars the importance of reading correctly, noting the different pauses and giving the right emphasis, that they might better understand what they are reading about. At the close of the schools we noticed a marked improvement in that branch of study.

We have made it a rule to visit all schools several times during a term, and at times when we were least expected. Therefore, we could judge of the condition of the schools and the progress made in the different branches of study.

We notice by the registers the limited number of visitors in some of our schools. We mean the parents; or, to make it more emphatic and plain: the men. In some schools we notice the parents have taken interest enough in their children's

progress to visit the schools several times, but as a general rule there is a lack of interest which we very much regret. They should make a greater effort to visit the schools, at least twice each term, that they may encourage both teachers and scholars.

We think there are parents in town who have never stepped inside of their school-rooms since the new laws for running schools have been in operation. Be that as it may, we hope there will be a waking up and a greater interest taken by some of the parents; we include only those the coat fits.

We notice the roll of perfect attendance in some of our schools with great satisfaction and hope there will be a larger per cent. on the roll next year.

The prosperity of our schools in the future depends not only on our school board, but upon parents and teachers, with the school board. We always have enough to criticise and find fault about, but if they would live up to some of the suggestions we have made they would be relieved of some of their chronic troubles. But, alas, there are some people who are never satisfied with anything, and there is nothing that gives them relief but to "kick." We do not think the schoolhouses in town will hardly compare with our dwellings and we hope the voters of the town will keep on raising money until they are up to that standard.

The cost of maintaining schools in the several districts, exclusive of repairs and supplies, are as follows: Kelley's Corner, \$257.50, or \$12.46 per scholar; Bear Hill, \$197, or \$19.70 per scholar: Horse Corner, \$192, or \$25.04 per scholar: Centre, \$297.45, or \$12.39 per scholar; Pine Ground, \$236.25, or \$12.22 per scholar; New Dover, \$204, or \$16.54 per scholar.
