## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

To the people of the town of Chichester we submit our annual report. Our schools have been running very smoothly the last year and in a satisfactory manner. The most of our teachers have been with us a number of years, and are worthy of praise—one, only lacking one term of five years in succession. We aim to retain the services of our experienced teachers, as the progress of the schools depends largely upon the instructor. In two schools we secured the services of strangers; we find their scholars advancing in a satisfactory manner. We feel proud of our school children, they are bright scholars, and the visiting parents and friends cannot help being rarely entertained by being with them often. It also helps the teachers and scholars so much to have the interest shown in their work, for the work of our children at school means as much to them as does ours at our various homes, and we know what a word of interest from our friends means to us in our work. Time flies, and the children of today in a short time will be taking our places. The parents should impress upon the children the importance of a good education, and by a prompt daily attendance, and without being late, or unnecessary dismissals, for each mark upon the school register must be recorded by the school board and returned to the Superintendent of Public Instruction of the state in the month of July of each year. So let every school endeavor to have their registers as clean of marks as possible. The superintendent will note with satisfaction the number of forty-four names upon the roll of honor in the town of Chichester in the 1907 report of the town. The members of the school board are the servants of the school district, and are ever willing to use their judgment in adjusting any difficulty which may arise, if you will advise them of it.

## OUR REPAIR WORK.

We have shingled the Lane schoolhouse with a good quality of shingles, and it should last many years. The expense will be found within the appropriation for same.

At the Horse Corner schoolhouse we have laid a new floor, and inside painting has been done, also four thousand shingles are at the schoolhouse ready to be laid when the season will permit. A coat of paint to the outside is needed. We have new seats for this school to take the place of the old-fashioned benches, which will add very much to the comfort of the scholars and the beauty of the schoolroom.

The Dover schoolhouse is in good condition, and the new seats are there ready to be placed in position; they will take the place of the old-fashioned plank bench, the last one of the kind used in town. This schoolroom will present a very neat and attractive appearance, and will not need any very extensive repairs for a number of years.

The Center schoolhouse is in need of some work. What has been done to the inside looks very well, but the plastering is coming down in patches, and it should be sheathed to keep it in place, also other work there, and on the outside a coat of paint.

At the Kelley's the plastering is in about the same condition.

The Bear Hill needs quite a bit done, and the seats are not very comfortable.

The Pine Ground schoolhouse is in very good condition. The seats are the same here as in the Bear Hill school.

We have not used the full amount of the appropriation for repairs. There have been many bills in excess of last year, and our total expenditures are a little more than last year. The people of our town are very interested that our schoolhouses may be kept in good repair, and we thank them for the amount which they annually raise for that purpose. We have four or five weeks less schooling than our adjoining towns. Providing ordinary expenses were about the same, there would need be about ten dollars for each week of school,

or for six schools, about two hundred and fifty dollars in excess of present amount. This is wholly in the hands of our taxpayers. The present year the cost to the town for each scholar is about sixty-five cents a week.
