SCHOOL REPORT.

In presenting again the annual report of our schools, it gives us pleasure to be able to say that, with hardly an exception, the schools of the town have enjoyed a year of general prosperity.

We feel it to be our duty to employ the services of such teachers as are best adapted, by natural qualifications and education, to manage and instruct our schools, and whenever we have succeeded in doing this we feel that our efforts in behalf of education have been successful.

Teachers who intend to follow teaching as a profession should spare no time or reasonable expense in preparing themselves for the work. They should be able to teach the higher English branches as well as the lower, and to give instruction in a practical and business-like manner. Such teachers are, and always will be, in demand. We need not only good teachers, but good scholars as well. The good scholar is the one who is well trained at home, taught to respect and obey his teacher as well as his parents. When a parent or guardian sends a child to school, the authority to govern it goes with the child, and the teacher has the same authority to correct him for wrong-doing that the parents would have at home. The school board hold the teachers responsible for the order they have in the school-room, and will uphold them in all cases where they correct the scholars in a reasonable manner, and we expect the parents to sustain the teacher, and give her their aid in maintaining the order of the school. If parents have reason to think that the teacher is lacking in some direction, do not tell your children, but have a quiet talk with her

and the chances are more than even that the difficulty can be adjusted to the satisfaction of all concerned.

The ideal teacher is a fiction of the mind and never found in practical every-day school experience. Candidly, now, what would you think of a teacher (or any one else for that matter) who never made a mistake? None of us are perfect, but a kind word or act helps to do more real good than many severe or sarcastic ones, and the one who never makes a mistake is the one who amounts to but little in this world. Taken as a whole, the parents of the children have supported the teachers with respect; harmony has prevailed and mutual respect has been the result.

There are some children of the town who do not fulfil the requirements of the law relating to school attendance. A glance at our school registers will reveal the fact that absent, dismissal and tardy marks occupy a very conspicuous place there. Of course, it is taken for granted that many of them are caused by good reasons, still an effort should be made to let only good reasons keep the pupils away from school.

If there is one thing which should be encouraged more than another it is that the children attend school regularly. The best results can be obtained in no other way. We are all doing the best we can to give them an education which will, in after years, help them to make a mark in the world. More is being done for them than ever before. More money is being appropriated for schooling and, as a rule, more experienced and better fitted teachers are being employed. Never were the chances better for getting a good education than at the present time and never was a good education more needed. This is an age of progress and our town's children must be up and doing if they wish to be at the front. It is a general fact that we ourselves do not give enough candid, earnest thought to the cause of education.

There is no study of educational systems; no reading of educational journals, no attending educational conventions, and not enough of visiting schools.

At the present time there is no subject of such importance to the public welfare as a good sound education. Parents, visit the schoolroom as often as you can. Your interest will encourage your children to be more punctual and they will strive to attain a higher rank and a better record.

To the teachers of the past year we express our thanks for their earnest efforts for the welfare of our children while under their care; we also extend our thanks to those parents who, by their co-operation, have seconded our efforts in behalf of education.
