(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to rote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise sums of money as may be necessary to defry town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to pay a discount on all taxes.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for White Pine Blister Rust, the State to give 25% of any amount raised by town.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction \$612.00, the State to appropriate \$1,224.00.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$725.00, the State to appropriate \$8,700.00 for Trunk Line maintenance.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00, the State to appropriate \$1500.00 for State Aid maintenance.
- 8. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for Old Home Day celebration.

- 9. To see if the town will vote authority to selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To see what action the town will take in regards to the election of one road agent instead of three, if favorable to take effect in 1933.

During the school year ending June 30, 1931, 56 pupils were promoted to the next higher grade and only one, or 1.8 per cent, failed of promotion. This rate of failure was well below the state average of 6.7 per cent.

The following five pupils received certificates of admission to high school in June: John Marden, James Mobbs, Melissa Perry, Edgar Riel, and Evelyn Sherburne.

Three of these five pupils are attending high school.

These figures shown an appreciable improvement in regularity of attendance over the previous year and an increase of 3.2 in the average number of days each child was in school.

Major Accomplishments Since the Last Report

1. Adoption of a modern system of reading for the first grade. The new system was tried out in the Pittsfield village schools last year with such highly satisfactory results that it was selected for adoption in all rural schools in the fall of 1931. The progress being made by these

little folks in comparison with that of former classes is very gratifying.

- 2. Adoption of new social science textbooks for the seventh grade to replace the old badly worn and out-of-date geographies. I believe these books are making the most valuable contribution to the proper development of future mature citizens of any books I have ever known to be used in any school.
- 3. Adoption of new fifth grade American history textbooks which meet the recommendations of the state program of studies. The vocabulary of these books is very carefully graded so that even the slower pupils can readily understand them. Pupils have continually commented on how interesting they are.
- 4. Introduction of a system of music instruction, both singing and appreciation. A set of music books incorporating the very latest ideas in rural school music was purchased together with parts of two sets of correlating phonograph records and a portable orthophonic Victrola. Next year the second parts of the two sets of records should be procured to make the sets complete. The children are greatly enjoying the new subject and are learning much that will make their lives more pleasant and beautiful.

Conclusion

With grateful appreciation of the cooperation I have received from the school board, teachers, pupils and other citizens this report is respectfully submitted.
