To the inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$664.50, the state to give \$1,328.00 for State Aid Construction or to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$396.36, the State to give \$1,585.46 for Class V assistance.
- 4. To see what action the town will take for winter breaking in the future.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 to purchase a wing for snow plow.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to pay discount on all property taxes, as in 1935.

- 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collectors' deeds.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purchase of a truck chassis for a fire truck or other equipment.
- 10. Any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

#### To the School Board and Citizens:

A comparison of statistics for the school year 1934-35, printed on another page of this report, with those of the previous year, shows an increase of twelve in number of pupils registered, and of seven in average membership, with cases of tardiness reduced to fifty-nine.

Schools opened in September with no change of teachers. A much needed new floor had been laid at Horse Corner School during the summer. During the year some new books have been bought in arithmetic, geography and history and considerable new reading material.

At the time of the last annual meeting the Pine Ground School was so crowded that it seemed necessary to provide some means to reduce the number of pupils there. The district voted to add \$500 to the School Board's budget. It was estimated that this amount, together with the State Aid we hoped might be secured, would finance the opening of a fourth school, if necessary.

In September it was found that by transferring five pupils in grades seven and eight from Pine Ground to the Center the number of pupils in the two schools could be made equal. The cost would be considerably less than opening another school and State Aid could be secured. Under this arrangement the Center and Pine Ground Schools each had twentynine pupils in September. Since then the Center has lost two and the Pine Ground, seven.

Citizens will note, in comparing the School Board's budget for the coming year with that submitted last year for the year ending next June, that a small increase in teachers' salaries is provided for and \$135 more for transportation than in the original budget for last year. Also, an additional amount of \$375 is asked for the payment of high

school tuition. The total budget submitted calls for a tax of \$472.50 less than was finally raised last year. This comes about from the fact that the extra \$500 raised last year has not been expended and this is estimated as a cash balance at the close of the school year in June, to be applied to next year's expenses.
