To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$672.00, the State to give \$1,344.00 for State Aid Construction on Canterbury road, or to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$391.15, the State to give \$1,564.61 for Class V assistance.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to pay discount on all property taxes as in 1936.
- 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to buying or renting the Fire House from individual owners, and appropriate money for same.

- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for white pine blister rust control, to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department.
- 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collectors' deeds.
- 9. To see what action the town will take with reference to Paragraph numbered 9 of the will of J. Myron Leavitt and the trust thereby provided for the support of Schools in the Town of Chichester.
- 10. To sense the opinion of the qualified voters to wit: "Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?"
- 11. Any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

- 10. To see what action the district will take with reference to paragraph numbered 9 of the will of J. Myron Leavitt and the trust thereby provided for the support of schools in the Town of Chichester.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
