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### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$684.00, the State to give \$1,368.00 for State Aid Construction on Canterbury road, or to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$391.45, the State to give \$1,565.81 for class V assistance.

4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the town will vote to pay discount on all property taxes as in 1937.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for white pine blister rust control, to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, the state to give an additional 25% to amount appropriated. 7. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collectors' deeds.

8. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$215.00 for the purchase of new snow plow, said 215.00 being the balance due on purchase price of \$430.00, old plow and \$105.00 being already paid in as rental.

9. Any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

### To the School Board and Citizens:

The school year which is now half through has been both pleasant and profitable. The provision for more emphasis on music is well worth its small extra cost.

Eighty children have been enrolled this year, one more than for two previous years. The present membership is seventy, three more than for the two complete years past. The attendance Table for 1936-1937 as compared with 1935-36 shows two per cent more regular attendance, cases of tardiness reduced from seventy-seven to twenty, number not absent or tardy for the year six instead of one, a most commendable improvement.

The School Board's Estimate for the coming year should offer good news to both the taxpayers and the school children with its new item "Income from Trust Funds". The annual income which the district will receive from the Myron Leavitt Estate is estimated at \$2,700 or more. In these times of heavy expenditures by town, county and state, it is not unnatural or improper for this good fortune to be welcomed as a means of reducing the tax burden. It seems reasonable to assume, however, that the donor had in his mind that his bequest would also help to improve the quality of the schools, otherwise why was the school district rather than the town made the beneficiary?

At the present time the condition of the toilets in all three of our buildings does not meet the requirements for a standard school. The chemical toilets at Pine Ground are not working properly. They need to be better protected from the cold to prevent freezing. At Horse Corner the toilet is the old-fashioned outhouse of our grandfathers' day, unimproved except for a new seat now and then which the process of decay has made necessary. At the Center School conditions have long been especially bad, because of water standing in the vault part of the year. We have been notified that this condition cannot be longer tolerated. It will be necessary to provide satisfactory toilets during the coming summer.

Probably \$500 will be enough to "get by" if that is all the district wants. This should install two septic toilets, one at each end of the entrance hall where wood is now housed. The only place left for wood would be the small building now used for toilets, altogether too small to hold a year's supply of fuel. Additional money should be provided for a new wood shed and something better than the bare State requirement if the building is to continue in use for long.

It is hoped that some of the citizens and the parents of school children of this and the coming generation may begin to consider the opportunity now offered us to reduce our tax rate considerably and still provide, through a twenty year bond issue, a building modern, adequate, on a lot furnishing ample playground space, in some central location, to accommodate all the children in Chichester.

Anyone interested can now easily reach such buildings built in New Hampshire villages, of which the communities are proud. Getting the children into one group instead of three would make possible great improvement on the educational side as well as in physical conditions.

With all the children in one building they could be grouped under our three teachers in a way to economize in teacher time and add interest, both in the schoolroom and on the playground, that larger classes give.
