#### CHICHESTER TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L.S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Chichester, on Tuesday the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$682.50, the State to give \$1,364.00, for State Aid Construction on Canterbury road or to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$389.61, the State to give \$1,558.44 for Class V assistance.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to pay discount on all property taxes as in 1941.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Old Home Day.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for new tar construction at Horse Corner.

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8. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

9. To see if the town will vote to construct any water holes for fire protection and appropriate money for the same.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for control of white pine blister rust.

11. To see what action the town will take about increasing the pay of laborers and trucks during the war emergency.

12. Any other business which may legally come before said meeting.
