I am writing to kindly request your support for a research study that the Waquoit Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve based in Falmouth will be conducting this Fall. Since 1988 the Reserve has been engaged in research, education, open space preservation and wildlife protection, to support coastal communities. In 2001 the Reserve launched a Coastal Training Program (CTP) to provide science-based information to local decision-makers to assist them with making informed decisions about managing, protecting and using natural resources. The program offers training and technical assistance, at no cost or at very low cost to towns (see www.coastaltraining.org for details). The CTP has grown to be a valued provider of coastal training in this region. Overall, 98% of attendees report that our trainings help to increase their understanding of a coastal issue and that they intend to apply information learned.

The CTP is conducting a comprehensive needs assessment to identify the training and information needs of local officials from the Cape and Islands, related to managing coastal resources. This study will target elected and appointed officials, municipal staff, and local board members. The study will primarily involve an online survey and phone interviews. Results will be used to develop the next strategic plan for the CTP and ensure that we continue to offer relevant training that addresses your towns' priorities.

We need your help to make this a comprehensive study. To meet this goal we are kindly asking you to send us contact information (primarily e-mail and phone) for each member of any local board and committee with which you work closely so that we can include them directly in the survey. This information is needed because we must be able to accurately document who receives and participates in the survey so that we can draw meaningful conclusions. We understand that this may be a sensitive request but we assure you that this information will only be used for this study and will not be shared with others. We understand that you may need to get the permission of board members before forwarding their information to us.
