Operation of the Harbor Sewage Pumpout Station

The Harbor Department will write a Pumpout Rules Sign for boat owners that includes:

- fee information
- Hours of Operation of pumpouts
- Instruction on cooperating with harbor staff to facilitate pumpout

The Harbor Department will designate a Staff Member who is responsible for up-keep of the equipment. This person will be familiar with the Installation and Operations Manual, will conduct a weekly check of the equipment and all components, conducting a pump performance test as recommended by the manufacturer and will ensure that all staff members assigned to run the pump are trained in the following operating procedures:

1. Make Sure Hydrant Ball Valve Is Open & Hose 90° Ball Valve is Closed. (see Manual p.10 – Pump out hose)

2. Prepare The Waste Deck Fitting On the Boat.

- Remove the cap from the deck fitting.
- Screw in a deck adapter, 1 1/2" or 1 1/4".
- If neither fit, clamp the universal nozzle to the hose.
- If pumping out a portable holding tank or bucket, clamp the potty wand to the hose.
- 3. Turn On The Pump Out System. (Push the green start button)

4. Connect the Hose To The Boat

- Unwind the hose all the way from the hose stand.
- Clamp the hose to the deck adapter or hold the universal nozzle in the deck fitting

5. Open The Ball Valve Slowly & Pump Out.

- When the holding tank is empty, close the ball valve.
- Instruct the owner to pump water through the toilet into the holding tank.
- Pump out again. This procedure rinses the entire system and helps to prevent odor.
- Close The Ball Valve & Disconnect The Hose

6. Flush the Hose.

- Put the hose into water & open the ball valve for 10 sec.
- Lift the hose and close the ball valve.
- Push the Red Stop Button.

7. Clean Up.

- Curl the hose onto the hose stand.
- Secure the boat deck fitting.
- Rinse the deck and pump out with water.
- Wash your hands
