Basil Welch loved Martha's Vineyard. He loved hunting, fishing, walking the back fields, and finding old forgotten barns, shacks and tired farm equipment from another era. Always with a camera, he photographed his beloved island every chance he got.

He loved the history of the Six towns and he knew stories about most every one and every place. Dad preserved the memories and history of his island by collecting and copying the old photographs and glass plates he had, or borrowed from those who also collected history that would have been lost forever.

Dad spent many years with the old photos, identifying the people who stare back at us without smiles, the old farm house, the name of a pond hidden in the woods, and the dates they were taken.
