

A Proclamation

Whereas, Historically, many destructive and deadly tropical storms and hurricanes have made landfall in, or impacted New England; and

Whereas, During the Atlantic Hurricane Season, which occurs June 1 through November 30, coastal and inland communities in Massachusetts are at risk of being impacted by powerful tropical storms and hurricanes; and

Whereas, Massachusetts is at highest risk of being impacted by a tropical storm or hurricane in the later part of the Atlantic Hurricane Season, with most of the major storms occurring between August and October; and

Whereas, The high winds, storm surge, coastal erosion and inland flooding associated with these storms threaten the lives and property of our citizens; and

Whereas, Advance planning and preparation by citizens, businesses, communities and government safeguards lives, protects property, mitigates impacts and enhances the Commonwealth's resilience; and

Whereas, The Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency recommends that individuals, families and businesses take important steps to prepare for the next major storm, including creating a disaster plan, building an emergency supply kit, preparing homes and businesses, and learning whether you live or work in a hurricane evacuation zone and developing an evacuation plan,

Now, Therefore, I, Charles D. Baker, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim July 15th to July 21st 2018, to be,

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS WEEK

And urge all the citizens of the Commonwealth to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
