8. Discussion and Possible Action on Outdoor Wood Furnaces

S Soby stated that the board has done quite a bit of research and they understand the issue. The board is empathetic to the concerns but as they read through the Energy and Environmental Protection language, as well as DEEP, their standards, experience, requirement, and enforcement process would be hard for the town to replicate. There are

currently 13 furnaces in town that do not have a complaint listed with Planning & Zoning. The board agreed in unison that the town does not have the expertise or enforcement available to monitor. The board thanked the Alderman's for bringing the topic to their attention and bringing awareness.

14. Discussion and Possible Action on CGS §8-24 Review of WJJMS/Senior Center Project

R Coyle moved to resolve that the Board of Selectmen refer to the Planning and Zoning Commission of the Town of Colchester the following project for a recommendation pursuant to the provisions of Section 8-24 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, Revision of 1958, as amended: The William J. Johnston Middle School Project at the site of the existing William J. Johnston Middle School at 360 Norwich Avenue, including renovations and additions to the middle school, renovations to the Office of Pupil Services, and renovations to the existing gymnasiums, substantially as described in the "WJJ Middle School Study" dated February 5, 2015. The building committee established for the project shall be authorized to determine the scope and particulars of the project and to reduce or modify the scope of the project, and the entire appropriation may be expended on the project as so modified or reduced. The appropriation may be spent for design and construction costs, testing and permitting costs, relocation costs, demolition and installation costs, equipment, furnishings and fixtures, materials, land and easement acquisition, site improvements, utilities, engineering fees, management costs and fees, legal fees, net interest on borrowings and other financing costs, and other expenses related to the project or its financing, seconded by K Frantzen. Unanimously Approved. MOTION CARRIED.

15. Discussion and Possible Action on 2015-2016

S Soby reported that the presentation went well. Funds have been put away to maintain effort on capital improvements and roads so that we don't slide behind. Department heads did a good job along the way by presenting ahead to the Board of Finance. The higher level presentation was a good review. K Frantzen mentioned that a graph showing over the last 15-20 years on the number of personnel that are employed by the town might benefit the public understanding. Starting on the 9th of March there will be a public hearing and Board of Finance workshops. If there are adjustments to be made to the proposed budget it will be ready by the 18th at the next Board of Finance meeting.

16. Citizen Comments

D Mrowka, registrar, mentioned that both registrars will be going to the hearing for GAE, looking for Town Clerks and Selectmen to send a letter opposing the one appointed registrar in a proposed bill. S Soby has submitted the letter. R Coyle commented that this is a radical changed based on one specific issue and location.

R Coyle moved that Colchester Board of Selectmen oppose the one appointed registrar in the proposed bill, seconded by D Mizla. Unanimously Approved. MOTION CARRIED.

17. First Selectman's Report

Crews continue to do amazing work with the snow; Department heads did a great job on the budget process, particularly Maggie Cosgrove and Tricia Dean for putting together the budget book; Food Hub and United Way have grant funding

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for a feasibility study. Advisors have done forty food hubs across the country since 2009. School café facility can do distribution on a decentralized basis. Real potential and see what they come up with in terms of feasibility; Generosity of people is amazing, Freezin for a Reason collected \$10,600. That was the highest collection since they started. Raised \$42,000 in six years.

18. Liaison Reports

D Mizla reported on Park & Recreation – no egg hunt for dogs in April, will incorporate it in the Pet Expo on May 3rd. Discussion came up regarding dogs at the park and rec field R8, since there are only six football games it would make it difficult to post and enforce. Summer concerts on the green have been scheduled for every Thursday, July 2nd through the 30th; Youth Services Advisory Board – Community Conversation will take place 3/25 to discuss opiates for parents and grade 6-12th students at Bacon. Summer Palooza will be June 13th.

R Coyle reported on Commission on Aging – Special meeting to discuss strategies to get their message out. No quorum. Will have a series of letters in the Rivereast; Building Committee – Planning an outreach program to get the message out, will finalize at the next meeting. Tours at WJJMS to be conducted for the public, a virtual tour will be available as well online.

19. Discussion and Possible Action on Tentative Agreement

R Coyle moved to approve the tentative agreement for Local 1303-254 of Council 34, seconded by D Mizla. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.

RFP 2015-01 Fire Department Pavement Services- Contract Recommendation

Responses for the RFP #2015-01 Fire Department Company One Pavement Services were received and opened on February 24, 2015. The general description is the milling of 4" of deteriorate surface pavement from the front ramp area, and repaving with 4" of Class I Bituminous pavement. The scope of the job is approximately 1000 Sq. yards. of area.

Responses were as shown on the attached Bid Results sheet.

The apparent low bidder for the project is B & W Paving and Landscaping, LLC from Waterford, CT with a bid price of \$34,500. The only local vendor that would qualify under the Purchasing Policy Local Vendor Consideration (Section B.5.) was Annelli Paving from Colchester, CT however their bid of \$36,800 is 6.67% higher than the low bid, and therefor beyond the 5% limit required in the Purchasing Policy.

References were contacted; Windham had very favorable reports and noted that they had contracted with B & W for the exact same scope of work (mill and pave of a Windham Fire Dept. apron) as the Town of Colchester Project. The Town of Manchester had a good recommendation for the scope of work for the Town of Colchester project. East Hartford and Groton also reported no issues with the company.

Contact was made with the bidder and they are willing to provide the required certificates of insurance and bonds at this point and are looking forward to conducting the project. The scheduled dates for the asphalt plants to open for the season is likely to be the second week of April.

Based upon the submitted bids, Purchasing Policy of the Town of Colchester, and reference checks conducted; I would recommend the award of RFP 2015-01 Fire Department Company One Pavement Services be made to B &W Paving and Landscaping, LLC and that the First Selectman be authorized to enter into a contract and sign all necessary documents to conduct the work.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this ______ day of March, 2015, by and between B&W Paving and Landscaping, LLC, herein after called the "Contractor", and the Town of Colchester.

WITNESSETH, that the Contractor and the Town of Colchester for the bid sum of Thirty Four Thousand Five Hundred (\$34,500.00) and considerations stated herein mutually agree to provide for pavement services as described in RFP 2015-01Fire Department Company One Pavement Services and submitted response by the contractor.:

- Article 1. Statement of Work. The Contractor shall furnish all supervision, technical personnel, labor, materials, machinery, tools, equipment and service, including utility and transportation service, and perform and complete in an efficient and workmanlike manner all work required for the pavement services in strict accordance with the Contract Documents, including all Addenda, thereto, all as prepared by the Town of Colchester.
- Article 2. The Contract Price. The Town of Colchester will pay the Contractor for the performance of the Contract in current funds for the total quantities of work performed at the unit prices or lump sum prices stipulated in the Bid for the several respective items of work completed subject to additions and deductions as provided in the section.
- Article 3. Contract Documents: The executed contract documents shall consist of the following:
 - a. This Agreement & Bonds
 - b. Addenda
 - c. Invitations for Bids
 - d. Instruction to Bidders
 - e. Signed Copy of Bid
 - f. General Conditions

- g. Supplemental Conditions
- h. Special Provisions

- k. Notice of Award

THIS AGREEMENT, together with other documents enumerated in this Article 3, which said other documents are as fully a part of the Contract as if thereto attached or herein repeated, form the Contract between the parties thereto. In the event that any provision in any component part of this Contract conflicts with any other component part, the provision of the component part first enumerated in this Article 3, shall govern, except as otherwise specifically stated.

RFP 2015-02 Fire Department Company One Roof Replacement- Contract Recommendation

Responses for the RFP #2015-02 Fire Department Company One Roof Replacement were received and opened on February 24, 2015. The general description is the covering of the existing steel roof with ISO Board insulation and then placing a rubberized (EDPM) Membrane over the entire roof area, edging, new gutters, and snow guards.

Responses were as shown on the attached Bid Results sheet.

The apparent low bidder for the project is C & M Roofing Company, LLC from South Windsor, CT with a bid price of \$59,000. There were no bidders that qualified for the Purchasing Policy Local Vendor Consideration (Section B.5.)

References were contacted;; Griswold, East Hartford and Private Construction Firms all had very favorable reports. The Borough of Jewett City project (Griswold) was a similar scope of work for the A.A. Young Hose and Ladder Company.

Contact was made with the bidder and they are willing to provide the required certificates of insurance and bonds at this point and are looking forward to conducting the project. Scheduling will occur within April once temperatures are conducive for EDPM layout.

Based upon the submitted bids, Purchasing Policy of the Town of Colchester, and reference checks conducted; I would recommend the award of RFP 2015-02 Fire Department Company One Roof replacement be made to C & M Roofing Company, LLC and that the First Selectman be authorized to enter into a contract and sign all necessary documents to conduct the work.

Scope: This contract shall be defined as, but not limited to:

- a. The general scope of the project is as follows: The existing building of Fire Company One at 52 Old Hartford Road is steel framed, metal sided and sloped metal roof building, typical of the pre-engineered metal buildings constructed in 1987-1988. The roof has developed multiple connection hardware rusting leaks over the lifespan of the roof that a membrane roof system has been determine to be the most effective means to ensure the effective weather proofing of the building. The building is rectangular with dimensions of 160 feet long and 70 feet wide. The ridge line is centered and 160 feet long.
- b. Should funds allow or become available, additional work may be added to the project. The Town also reserves the right to deduct estimated work as required. 
We are also looking into getting a hot dog cart to sell hot dogs during the event. We would obtain Board of Health approval.
