

Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting Minutes Thursday, January 15, 2009 Colchester Town Hall

- 1. Call to Order: First Selectman L. Hodge called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m.

- 9. **Report on Town Hall HVAC System:** First Selectman L. Hodge reported on the town hall HVAC system and noted that the system should be repaired on Tuesday

- 10. Appointment of Jacqueline Langdon as a Deputy Fire Marshal for the Town of Colchester: G. Cordova moved to appoint Jacqueline Langdon as a Deputy Fire Marshal for the Town of Colchester per the recommendation of Tim York, Colchester Building Official, and to authorize the First Selectman to sign all necessary documents, seconded by S. Soby. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 11. Ratification of Colchester Hayward Volunteer Fire Company Annual Election Results for Chief Officer Positions for 2-Year Terms (William Standish and Kenneth McKenna): Chief Walter Cox introduced the chief officers. J. Malsbenden moved to ratify the Colchester Hayward Volunteer Fire Company annual election results for chief officer positions for two-year terms, including William Standish as Deputy Chief and Kenneth McKenna as Second Assistant Chief, and to authorize the First Selectman to sign all necessary documents, seconded by G. Cordova. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.

Soby moved to approve the Lego Engineering Program Proposal as presented, based on the advisory opinion of the Colchester Ethics Commission stating that approval of this proposal does not constitute a conflict of interest, and to authorize the First Selectman to sign all necessary documents, seconded by J. Malsbenden. Following discussion, all members present voted in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Malsbenden moved to approve the bond reduction of Subdivision Surety Bond No. 5023486 by \$210,105. of from an existing total of \$515,560. for Usher Swamp Road and Founders Way Owner/Developer Edward Development Co. LLC, Ed Riccio, as recommended by Sal Tassone, Town Engineer, and to authorize the First Selectman to sign all necessary documents, seconded by R. Coyle. Following discussion, all members present voted in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Coyle. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.



Re: Combined Town Hall Brochure

In an effort to improve customer service as well as promotion of Town Hall information and services, a number of community-focused departments are spearheading the creation of a combined brochure.

Rather than each department creating and distributing their own seasonal brochures, there will be one brochure delivered to every home in Colchester four times per year, similarly to Parks & Recreation's current brochure. This new brochure will include permanent sections for Parks & Recreation, Youth Services, the Senior Center, Cragin Memorial Library and Adult Education. Many other departments will contribute as appropriate, with Public Works and the Fire Department already expressing interest.

There will be many benefits to a combined brochure:

- Cost savings, as some departments would save money on production and distribution
- A one-stop-shop for the community looking for information
- Better coordination and communication among departments
- Increased bargaining power with publishers
- Less solicitation of local businesses for advertising

As this new venture will be a significant project, we will be requesting proposals from multiple local vendors. This project will be coordinated by staff from the above-named departments.

While the current Parks & Recreation brochure will serve as the model for this project, alternative proposals will be considered.

The goal is to have the first combined brochure out for the Spring or Summer issue.



The Town of Colchester is currently holding Subdivision Surety Bond No. 5023486 by Bond Safeguard Insurance Company for a total of \$515,560.50. It is therefore recommended that the bond be <u>reduced by \$210,105.00</u> leaving a bond balance of \$305,455.50
