

Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting Minutes Thursday, March 5, 2009 Colchester Town Hall Meeting Room 1 at 7:00 p.m.

- 1. Call to Order: First Selectman L. Hodge called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- 2. Additions to the Agenda: S. Soby moved to add a new item #6b "Fire Department: Bay Door Seals", new item #16 "Executive Session Regarding Notice of Pending Claim / Intent to Commence Civil Action", and move item #12 before item #8, seconded by R. Coyle. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 3. Approve Minutes of the February 19, 2009 Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting: G. Cordova moved to approve the minutes of the February 19, 2009 Board of Selectmen regular meeting as presented, seconded by J. Malsbenden. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 4. Citizen's Comments: Dave Dander commented on the issues that had been published in the newspapers regarding the Police Commission, his experience from working on Colchester building committees and their processes as well as his concerns about the resignations of two Police Commissioners.

Gary Avery spoke regarding the history of the Colchester Hayward Volunteer Fire Department, the need for a new fire truck, and his idea for the creation of a sinking fund for the ambulance revenues to assist with the replacement of fire equipment.

Tim Edwards spoke on the Colchester Police Union's opinion on the recent issues with the Colchester Police Commission.

Following discussion, S. Soby withdrew his motion, G. Cordova withdrew his second. J. Malsbenden moved to authorize First Selectman L. Hodge to ask Arthur Standish and John Jones to reconsider their resignations, seconded by R. Coyle. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.

Hodge reported on the hiring of Kelly McNamara to fill the open admin position at the CHVFD, her ongoing work with insurance carriers on proactive initiatives to manage and decrease premium increases, safety issues with the trees on the town green (#1-10), the increasing of our wellness programs through the Health and Safety Committee, her meeting with Adam Turner and town farmers on the agriculture viability grant, the status of the ruling on *John F. Fedus ET AL. v. Zoning and Planning Commission of the Town of Colchester*, the results of the budget survey, the modifications to the budget meeting schedule, and the Board of Finance special meeting called for 03/11/09.
- 15. Liaison Reports: Selectman Cordova reported on the Youth Services Advisory Board. Selectmen Malsbenden reported on the Colchester Housing Authority and the Planning & Zoning Commission.

February 18th 2009

1. At this time our existing housing remains the same.

Dublin Village has forty apartments, sixteen one room efficiencies and twenty-four one bed room units.

Ponemah Village has thirty apartments, twenty-four two room efficiencies and six one bed room units.

The Housing Authority administers a rental assistance program to keep housing affordable for our residents and employ's a Resident Service Coordinator to help our residents access all outside services they may require to stay independent for as long as possible. Both of these programs are funded through the DECD. The physical condition of our developments is good.

- 2. No new construction is underway at this time.
- 3. No housing has been sold, leased or transferred
- 4. The new fire alarm system at Dublin Village is nearly complete. We currently have fifty three applicants on our waiting list. We have had an unusually high rate of apartment turnovers this year along with major repair expenses to our sewer ejection system and a hard winter. As a result our current budget is considerably off and we won't be adding as much to our reserves as predicted. I'm currently finishing up the annual rent re-determinations will soon be putting the 2009-2010 budget together which will include my very best guesses as to what may go wrong in the upcoming year.


