

Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting Minutes Thursday, May 21, 2009 Colchester Town Hall Meeting Room 1 – 7:00 p.m.

- 1. Call to Order: First Selectman L. Hodge called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- 2. Additions to the Agenda: J. Malsbenden moved to delete item #13 and item #14, and to add a new item #13 ""Discussion and Possible Action on Stop Loss Letter Re: Anthem Insurance", and to add a new item #14 "Discussion and Possible Action on Smoke Blotters", seconded by R. Coyle. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 3. Approve Minutes of the May 5, 2009 Board of Selectmen Special Meeting: G. Cordova moved to approve the minutes of the May 5, 2009 Board of Selectmen special meeting as presented, seconded by R. Coyle. All members present voted in favor. MOTION CARRIED.
- 4. Approve Minutes of the May 7, 2009 Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting: R. Coyle moved to approve the minutes of the May 7, 2009 Board of Selectmen regular meeting as presented, seconded by G. Cordova. All members present voted in favor. MOTION CARRIED.
- 5. Citizen's Comments: None
- 6. Boards and Commissions Interviews and/or Possible Appointments and Resignations
 - a. Economic Development Commission (filling member vacancy left by Robert Boucher; new term to expire on 10/01/14): Kele Issa (interviewed on 05/07/09): J. Malsbenden moved to appoint Kele Issa as a member to the Economic Development Commission, filling the vacancy left by Robert Boucher, for a new term to expire on 10/01/14, seconded by G. Cordova. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.

b. Police Commission (filling member vacancies left by Bill Otfinoski for a term to expire on 11/01/09, Arthur Standish for a term to expire on 11/01/11, James Stavola for a term to expire on 11/01/10): Anthony Camilleri, Richard Kemmett, Scott Dubb, Robert Parlee, John Carroll (to be interviewed): The Board of Selectmen interviewed Anthony Camilleri, Richard Kemmett, Scott Dubb, Robert Parlee, and John Carroll. Selectman S. Soby joined the meeting as a voting member during the interview of Robert Parlee. The Board of Selectmen discussed appointing one member at this meeting so that the Police Commission could meet with a quorum. R. Coyle moved to appoint Anthony Camilleri as a member of the Police Commission, filling the vacancy left by Arthur Standish, for a term to expire on 11/01/11, second by G. Cordova. Following discussion, S. Soby voted against, all remaining members voted in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

First Selectman L. Hodge introduced Sgt. Mike Hassett, the new Resident Trooper Supervisor.

Coyle moved to approve the budget transfers (a) through (e) as presented and noted above (detailed transfer forms attached (12) total forms), seconded by S. Soby. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 8. **Tax Refunds & Rebates:** After review, G. Cordova moved to approve tax refunds in the amount of \$849.07 to Marcus and Rashale Burrus, \$30.78 to Sheila Mulka, \$79.81 to Russell Bruce, \$51.18 to Jamie Miller, \$43.93 to Valmont and Marcel Violette, \$9.27 to Danielle Smith, seconded by S. Soby. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 9. Discussion and Possible Action on Ice Cream Concession Bid: This item was addressed following item #10 so that Jay Cohen could be present. R. Coyle moved to award the bid to New England Soft Serve for the four dates that they could provide service for, and the remaining two dates to Scotties Frozen Custard LLC, motion died for lack of a second. J. Malsbenden moved the award the bid per the recommendation of the Parks & Recreation Commission (attached), seconded by S. Soby. Following discussion, R. Coyle voted against on the basis that the process was not followed. All remaining members voted in favor. MOTION CARRIED.
- 10. **Discussion and Possible Action on Reverse Auction Program Participation Agreement:** R. Coyle moved to approve the Reverse Auction Program Participation Agreement as presented, and to authorize the First Selectman to sign all necessary documents, seconded by S. Soby. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 11. **Discussion and Possible Action on Community Development Block Grant:** Town Planner Adam Turner presented on the Community Development Block Grant. (attachment) S. Soby moved to authorize the Town Planner to apply for a STEAP Grant for the Lebanon Avenue project instead of the Community Development Block Grant, seconded by G. Cordova. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.

- 12. Discussion and Possible Action on Connecticut State Library for an Historic Documents Preservation Grant Application, Resolution, and Nondiscrimination Certification: J. Malsbenden moved to approve the Historic Documents Preservation Grant Application, Resolution, and Nondiscrimination Certification as presented, seconded by G. Cordova. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 13. **Discussion and Possible Action on Stop Loss Letter Re: Anthem Insurance:** R. Coyle moved to approve the draft letter from the Board of Selectmen, Board of Education, and Board of Finance to the Connecticut Commissioner of Insurance regarding stop loss insurance coverage for the Town of Colchester, seconded by S. Soby. Unanimously approved. MOTION CARRIED.
- 14. **Discussion and Possible Action on Smoke Blotters:** First Selectman L. Hodge reviewed the bid process, award process, and the subsequent communications with Smoke Blotters.
- 15. **Citizen's Comments:** Gregg Schuster spoke gave his concerns regarding the approval of the application that came before the Planning & Zoning Commission to build a wind turbine on a residential parcel and his opinion on the possible splitting of the Planning & Zoning Commission into a Planning Board and a Zoning Board.
 - Kathy Steffens spoke regarding her opinion on the fairness of the ice cream bid award and the process for their submission.
 - Dawn LePage spoke regarding her opinion regarding the successful role that Dave Dander's business has played in the Town of Colchester and the importance of giving new businesses opportunities in town.
- 16. First Selectman's Report: First Selectman L. Hodge reported on Ellen Yacono's retirement, coffees held on the day before the budget referendum, the Board of Finance approved mill rate of 23.65, her work with the Town Hall Union to update job descriptions, the referendum results, her work on the Continuity of Operations Plan, Pan Flu meetings, Social Services policies for expenditures, the Lion's Night of Giving, the Salmon River Watershed Consortium Breakfast, Hazardous Waste Collection day (June 6th), her attendance with three veterans at the Armed Forces Day Luncheon, the Time Use Project for Parks & Recreation, Assessor, Town Clerk, Social Services, and Youth Services departments, progress with fire department, energy efficiency & conservation, JAG, and accident prevention grants, consolidation of probate courts, her meeting with TVCCA in early June to examine additional partnerships, the upcoming Memorial Day Parade on Sunday the 24th at 12:30 p.m., and the Youth Center Open House on Wednesday, June 3rd at 5:30 p.m.

 After working with the DECD for several months on the CDBG funding for Lebanon Avenue project we recommend to the Board that our efforts to fund the Lebanon Avenue streetscape project shift from the <u>CDBG program</u> to the <u>Small Town Economic Assistance Program</u> (STEAP).

DECD Process

- We had several pre application conferences with the DECD over the last several months beginning in January regarding the specifics of our streetscape project.
- DECD had issue with the Lebanon avenue project meeting their standards for being "primarily residential".
- We offered compelling evidence that it was residential (300 residents in a ½ mile* area). Our evidence was professional and clearly made our case in terms of:
 - o Area
 - o Character
 - o Land use type
- Selectman Hodge and I met with DECD Executive Director Lusardi two weeks ago
- DECD still hasn't accepted our submitted information as meeting their standards. DECD did not
 offer any rationale except concluding that their standards and practices have changed and to
 recommend that we shift our project funding focus to STEAP.
- We could still submit our project as a CDBG project but that will be contrary to the recommendation of the DECD and would likely be met with denial and then appeal.

STEAP

- In April of 2008, the Town became eligible for funding under the STEAP program. Previously Colchester had been classified as an Urban Action Area which is primarily a State guaranteed bonding program for larger areas (cities).
- STEAP funds economic development, community conservation and quality of life projects for localities that are ineligible to receive Urban Action (CGS Section 4-66c) bonds. This program is administered by the Office of Policy and Management.
- Projects eligible for STEAP funds include:
 - economic development projects such as (a) constructing or rehabilitating commercial, industrial, or mixed-use structures and (b) constructing, reconstructing, or repairing roads access ways, and other site improvements;
 - o recreation and solid waste disposal projects;

- social service-related projects, including day care centers, elderly centers, domestic violence and emergency homeless shelters, multi-purpose human resource centers, and food distribution facilities;
- o housing projects;
- pilot historic preservation and redevelopment programs that leverage private funds; and
- Other kinds of development projects involving economic and community development, transportation, environmental protection, public safety, children and families and social service programs.

Eligibility

- Localities may receive up to \$500,000 per year if
 - they are not designated as a <u>distressed municipality</u> or a <u>public investment</u> community, and
 - The <u>State Plan of Conservation Development</u> does not show them as having a regional center.
