 - A. Tony's Junkyard Update

J. CONSERVATION -

They are also working with the towns of Salem and East Haddam regarding the acquisition of a large piece of property near Day Pond. He also said that the Colchester Land Trust now has a seat with the Eight Mile River Watershed organization.

Chairman von Plachecki suggested that the Colchester Conservation Commission consider sponsoring local roads like the Town of Montville is doing. J. Gigliotti will contact someone in the Town of Montville to discuss the concept with them.
