5. PUBLIC HEARINGS -

A. <u>HDC#15-001 – Lebanon Avenue, Stephen Fedus, applicant/owner</u>. Application for a Certificate of Appropriateness for property located on Lebanon Avenue within the Historic District. The applicant wishes to construct three (3) new single floor duplexes. Map # 16 Lot # 045-001. (Application received on 02/02/2015, Public Hearing opened and closed on 03/09/2015)

R. Benson read the Public Hearing legal notice published in the *Rivereast* on February 27, 2015.

Stanley Stefanowicz arrived at 7:06 p.m. and was seated as a voting member.

S. Fedus, applicant/owner of the property located on Lebanon Avenue presented his updated plans for three (3) single floor duplexes. He said that these plans show the area were the HVAC and propane tanks were enclosed so they would not be visible from the road. He explained the landscaping that would be used to buffer the area. He said a fence would be installed around the dumpster. He showed a picture of the proposed outside lighting and said that all utilities would be underground. He presented two options for the design of the duplexes which would make the houses more compatible for the Historic District. He stated that he would like to use vinyl siding as it is more economically feasible. He is not proposing any signage at this time.

Discussion followed regarding Section 3.2.9 of the Historic District Regulations. This section is regarding new construction and important considerations for new structures. The consensus was that the color scheme of grey and white was acceptable, but the proposed vinyl siding is not acceptable. The Commission was also concerned about the structures being one-story, as there is currently no one-story structures in the Historic District. They suggested that Mr. Fedus look at possibly making the structures two (2) stories to be compatible with the Historic District Buildings. The Commission also told Mr. Fedus that the windows and fencing could not be vinyl and the driveway should be gravel and not paved. Discussion followed.
