7. Budget Review

Discussion was held about the memo from Sgt. Mercer regarding Patrol Rifle purchase. He would like to purchase rifles and equipment that will ensure that all officers are equipped to handle a vast array of emergencies. The cost would be \$16,000. He would like to purchase the items with the funds obtained from the sale of the Colchester "DARE" Corvette.

First Selectman Schuster explained the procedure to transfer funds for the rifles or CARD program from the Capital budget to the appropriate Department budget line item. Sgt. Mercer will contact M. Cosgrove, CFO about transferring these funds.

The Commission discussed the 4 to 5 year hiring plan and coverage of the midnight shift on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights during the summer months. First Selectman Schuster asked the Commission to do a presentation on the hiring plan at the Board of Selectmen meeting scheduled for March 6, 2014. He suggested that Commission members attend the Board of Finance meeting to explain the plan and rationale.

Discussion took place about the volunteer staffing of the 3rd shift during the summer months. Commission Parlee asked First Selectman Schuster to speak with the Town attorney about the voluntary staffing of the midnight shift during the summer months and its effect on the Collective Bargaining Agreement. He also asked the officers present to speak with the other officers about the staffing of the midnight shift on weekends during the summer months.
