Board of Health

- $\$ 11,000$ of animal control budget here for animal inspector/rabies control
- Animal inspector is a state mandated position
- No contract with visiting nursing services - may work with New Bedford
- Need volunteers for Medical Reserve Corps for vaccination for emergency plan
- Have regionalization with New Bedford and Fairhaven with tobacco control
- Trying to use UMass nursing students as much as possible
- $80 \%$ and $78 \%$ of necessary food inspections in past few years -
o Inspection costs covered by permitting fee
o Must pay for emergency inspections
o Fines for serious violations
o Peter: does fee schedule cover inspections?
- Bring in $70-80 \%$ of budget $-20 \%$ of budget covers $30 \%$ of work
- Fees are on high end as compared to other towns
- Increased risk of errors and omissions, exposes us to risk
- All inspectors cross-trained.
- Pete: talk of consolidation with Board of Health taking on more clerical work
- Ed: we may pool clerical support
- Regionalization for specialized inspection: pools, recreational camps
- Melissa: what are state requirements for animal inspections?
o Depends on demand for services - must meet demand
