Dear Chief Pacheco,

The Dartmouth Waterways Management Commission wishes to highlight recent outstanding performances by officers of the Dartmouth Police Department. The Dartmouth Waterways Commission has been working for many years toward remediation of the D.E.P. controlled Brownfield site on the water edge of Rogers Street

in Dartmouth: As site construction began, an individual unlawfully dumped a large pile of (un-related) construction debris on Rogers St at the entrance to the Brownfield site. It was a disheartening and potentially expensive set-back to the recent site progress. The outstanding efforts of Officers Sean McGuire (who investigated and identified the purchase place of items within the pile), Peter Canuel (who carefully dug through the debris to extract an invoice with information that ultimately led to identification of the perpetrator), and John Rose (who meticulously photographed the large pile to identify the debris), led to a responsible party being identified. The pile was removed by the responsible party without further taxpayer expense, and the court process was initiated by these officers.

The extra efforts of these officers, as well as those individuals who dispatch and support them, are greatly appreciated. It is from their dedication to public service that the Dartmouth Waterways Commission finds renewed energy to continue their volunteer efforts toward improving the quality of life for Dartmouth residents. Quality performance deserves distinctive recognition. It is our hope that these remarkable officers, with your entire Department supporting tem, understand the gratitude of our Waters Commission and Department.
