The Executive Administrator explained to the Board that he met with Mr. Ramsamodj owner of Ayur-Shri and explained what he needs to do and who he needs to see to resolve any issues of a decision of the Zoning Board of Appeals 1999 for that location. Mr. Cressman stated there are no issues pending.

After a motion was made by Selectman William Trimble and seconded by Vice-Chairperson Nathalie Dias, it was voted unanimously to approve the Application of Ayur-Shri for a Common Victualler License.

#### 6:50/Police Department to discuss Interim Police Chief.

Captain Gary Soares, Sergeant Robert Szala and Detective George Perry were present to discuss Interim Police Chief.

After a motion was made by Selectman Michael Watson and seconded by Selectwoman Lara Stone, it was voted unanimously to appoint Captain Soares as interim Police Chief and Sergeant Robert Szala as Interim Deputy Police Chief.

Detective George Perry will move in Sergeant Robert Szala's position.

Steven Sullivan, Supervisor of Water Pollution, presented the Board with a hand out which was a flow chart of why Dartmouth had to do a tier 1 public notification. He went through the flow chart step by step explaining about Total Coliform samples and how E Coli was found in a raw water sample at well D which trigged the water department to contact DEP and issue the tier 1 public notification within 24 hours of being notified from the lab about the problem water samples. Steve also spoke about the 5 additional water samples he was required to take at Well D and additional sampling that was taken on Smith Neck Road because of the Total Coliform positive samples. He worked with DEP to determine if a boil, non-boil or do not drink a non-boil was chosen by DEP. Steve told the BOS all 5 samples that were taken before the well was shut off, came back negative with total coliform and absent of E Coli.

Mr. Sullivan stated on December 1, 2009 water samples taken at wells, tanks distribution system and all active wells. On December 3, 2009 two samples on Smith Neck Road tested positive for Total Coliform and well D tested positive for Total Coliform and positive E Coli. Well D was sampled again five water samples were taken from this location, an additional 6 samples on Smith Neck Road were taken, 1 each at the original source of the Total Coliform hit and upstream and downstream samples were taken near original problem areas.

Mr. Sullivan mentioned that on December 4, 2009 Water Department issued Tier 1 notification to Radio Stations and the Standard Times. The lab notified Water Department that the five samples from Well D were negative Total Coliform and negative E. Coli. They also notified Water Department 5 of the 6 samples came back negative Total Coliform. Dartmouth notified DEP about samples the Water Department returned to take the three samples at the failed site and took the upstream and downstream samples again.

The Supervisor stated that on December 6, 2009 the last three samples on Smith Neck Road were absent of Total Coliform and on December 7, 2009, Dartmouth notified DEP all samples were clean and tier 1 notification was lifted by DEP. Well D was then restarted.

Wendy Henderson, Director of Board of Health gave the Board an update on Swine Flu clinic coming up for the month of December. We have scheduled a H1N1 Flu Vaccination Clinic to be held on Monday December 14<sup>th</sup>. The Director of Health mentioned there will also be another clinic to provide the second dose on December 21<sup>st</sup> for children under 10 years old, who received their dose at the November 20<sup>th</sup> clinic.

#### 7:00/Update on Town's new Website.

Michael Courville, Information Systems Manager, introduced to the Board the new Town website. Mr. Courville mentioned that Kevin Lee, Youth Advocate, and Steven Sullivan, Supervisor of Water Pollution, assisted in this task. Mr. Courville introduced to the Board some of the nice features of the website, News Banner, Area Special News and calendar to name a few. In Closing Michael Courville thanked all the Department Heads for there assistance.
