6:35 p.m. Conservation Restriction for "Birchfield Farms".

After a motion was made by Selectman Michael Watson and seconded by Selectman William Trimble, it was voted unanimously to approve the Conservation Restriction for Birchfield Farms.

After a motion was made by Selectman William Trimble and seconded by Selectman Michael Watson, it was voted unanimously to approve the Application of the Country Club of New Bedford for a One Day All Alcohol License for August 17, 2012.

Nstar Tree Removal

- Residents are concerned about the number of trees that are being trimmed and cut down by Nstar.
- 100 trees are currently marked by Nstar for removal.
- Nstar must cut all trees that are a danger to the wires, as this is mandated by the State. If a power outage occurred due to poor maintenance Nstar will be fined by the State.
- Residents can ask Nstar not to remove trees on their property.
- Nstar is currently contracted with Barnes Tree Service for the next two months.
- NStar will hold a Public Meeting within the next couple weeks, residents are welcomed to attend.
- Most of the trees along roadways and stone walls are dangerous because they are forced to grow around the power lines; in storms they are hazardous to residents.
- Preservation of the Scenic Roads is crucial.

Tree Removal Roads:

- Old Fall River Rd, Reed Rd, Hixville Rd, Collins Corner Rd, and side roads off of these main roads.
- State Rd, Chase Rd, Old Westport Rd, and side roads off of these main roads.
- Slocum Rd, Sharp St, and side roads off of these main roads.
- Tucker Rd, Allen St, Sharp St, and side roads of these main roads.

II. New Business:

- **A.** Filming of Planning Board Meetings.
 - Meetings will be filmed in September by DCTV.
- **B.** Sponsorship of Zoning Articles/Solar Farm Bylaw.
 - Large-Scale Mounted Solar Farms will be allowed in residential neighborhoods by permit only.
 - M.G.L Chapter 30A Section 3- Activities zoning cannot prohibit. This law states that no zoning can unreasonably prohibit or regulate photovoltaic arrays/solar installations.
 - Uses of land should be equal throughout residential areas.
 - Who will determine the protection of property values?
 - Board of Health should not need to be consulted to build solar farms.
 - The By-Law passed in April may not be legal. The Attorney General will provide the Select Board with their decision within a few months.
 - We need a compromise to move forward; banning all solar farms in residential areas is unreasonable.
 - Setback requirements need to be reviewed and revised.
 - Our current solar farms generate significant revenue annually for the Town.
 - August 27th -the Select Board will discuss this issue further.
- C. <u>Application of St. Julie Billiart for a Common Victualler</u> License for "Septemberfest".

After a motion was made by Selectman Michael Watson and seconded by Selectman William Trimble, it was voted unanimously to approve the application of St. Julie Billiart for a Common Victualler License for Septemberfest.

- **D.** <u>Potter School/ Community Center.</u>
 - The School submitted an application to be considered for renovation for the Potter School site.
 - Preliminary discussion to take place shortly.
- **E.** Dias Landing Boat Ramp Reconstruction.
 - August 28th -hearing will be held on the Dias Landing Boat Ramp.
 - The Harbormaster is seeking assistance for funding for reconstructing the ramp.

After a motion was made by Selectman William Trimble and seconded by Vice-Chair Shawn McDonald, it was voted unanimously to approve the authorization of David Cressman to send a letter on behalf of the delegation.

F. <u>Legislature's Final Energy Bill.</u>

• Legislation was passed to strike the section implementing a mandatory pilot for operating solar farms.

G. Massachusetts Municipal Performance Management Program.

- Sarah Concannon is heading up the MMPMP for the Town.
- Leadership strategy program for efficiency.
- Utilize performance management in a way that is best for the community.
- The grant is for 6 months.
- The analysis is done through excel and not a software package.

H. Conservation Restriction-106 Barney's Joy Rd.

Approved and passed around for signatures.

I. <u>Affordable Housing Trust.</u>

• The proposed trust was given to the Select Board for review.

After a motion was made by Selectman Michael Watson and seconded by Selectman William Trimble, it was voted unanimously to approve the Housing Trust and appoint the Select Board as Trustees.

J. Chapter 61A, Horseneck Rd., DeCosta.

- The Planning Board feels that the property should be preserved for conservation.
- Valuable land to purchase for the Town.
- Agricultural Committee wants to keep the land for agricultural purposes.
- A joint meeting of all three boards will need to occur to discuss the property.
- This will be put on the agenda for August 20th to discuss further.
