I. Appointments:

II. New Business:

- A. Town Administrator Evaluation- Chairman Michael Watson has compiled all the comments along with the ratings to one sheet to be signed by the Board and placed in David Cressmans permanent file.

After a motion was made by Selectman John George Jr., and seconded by Selectman Shawn McDonald, it was unanimously voted to approve.

- B. Padanaram Village Update- Through the efforts of the Department of Public Works and their Board, Northern University will be doing a Keystone Project on our Padanaram Village as it relates to traffic, parking and pedestrian needs. This will be completed sometime at the end of April and we will invite them to a meeting to give us a presentation.

He will meet with Chief Lee to discuss the space needs of the department and also a site we would like to focus the study on. The next meeting is on February 24, 2015.

V. Announcements

The Town Clerk has mailed out the Census, please complete and return within 10 days. This process is how we record your residency and maintain our active voters list.

The Town Clerk has mailed out Dog License renewals. All dogs must be licensed by March 1, 2015. After March 1, 2015 you will be charged a \$5.00 late fee per month. The Animal Control Officer has the authority to issue citations for unlicensed and unvaccinated dogs. Failure to pay this citation will result in a criminal complaint, paying the citation does not excuse you from licensing and vaccinating your dogs.

The Board would like to commend the efforts of the DPW for its great work in keeping our streets safe. We will also be looking into Federal Aid for the last storm. Remember to keep your sidewalks as clean as possible especially in the 1.5 miles around schools where children have to walk to and from school.
