The November 14, 2016 meeting of the Deep River Fire Commission began at 7:01 P.M. with Lee, Spitzschuh, and Budney. David, and Bowden. Fire Marshal Kerop was also present.

The minutes of October 3, 2016 were reviewed. They were accepted as written. Moved by Bowden, 2<sup>nd</sup>, David. Unan

Some bills from last month were not posted. Otherwise the budget looks good.

Chief reported 17 calls. It has been a busy start to this month. Budney will fill out and submit paper work for the incident on State property.

This Sunday the Fire Department will host a Community Breakfast. This may be a good time to take time with the residents, to inform them of what the Department does, and their need and support for a new building.

Deputy reported that all maintenance has been done on the trucks.

Under Engineer's report, they are still waiting for hose testing.

Fire Marshal submitted and discussed his Activity Report.

There was some discussion on the call for the Becky Thatcher. One topic being if life vests were used, and which Organization it would be under.

He has been attending weekly meetings at Kirtland Commons.

The software at the Fire House was upgraded.

He purchased an I-pad to help with Inspections.

There was no Chairman's report.

Under Old Business, Lee presented a new contract for snow plowing this year. He will see if anyone from the Department would like to do it, before contracting an outside company.

There has been some movement on the land for the new building, with the Town receiving obtaining a verbal okay from the State. Now they are looking for a physical commitment before anything else is done.

Other Business brought up the topic of Middletown having a cascade system they would give to Deep River, for no consideration. The Department will look into how much it would cost to make this operational, verses, the purchase of a new system. Bowden has put together a letter on behalf of the Fire Marshal, which includes his time inspecting, among other things, the Reginal School Buildings. Also to confirm that the Fire Marshal in Deep River is paid substantially less than surrounding communities. The Chief reported that the Town must offer health insurance to Department members. He will be attending another meeting on this subject next week. They spoke more about Worker's Comp, and the existing claim, and where it was at this time. This will be looked into further by Town Hall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:03. Moved by Lee, 2<sup>nd</sup> Bowden. Unan.
