The June 5, 2017 meeting of the Deep River Fire Commission began at 7:07 P.M. with Lee, Budney, David, Bowden. Dube, excused. Fire Marshal Kerop was also present.

The minutes of May 1, 2017 were accepted as written. Moved by Lee, 2nd David. Unan.

The Financial Statements were reviewed. Everything looked good but, there are outstanding bills for ladder and hose testing. One account has a negative balance which Budney will look into.

There will also be a bill for the work on the fire boat.

Chief repots the ladder and hose testing was done last weekend with a new vendor. It went well. There was some hose that they did not test because it was too old. There was also more hose set aside to be replaced.

The ceiling at Winthrop Station will be repaired. It will be taken down and replaced with sheet rock. They are looking for quotes on this job now.

The last breakfast went well again. There was a demonstration with fire extinguishers. Next month they will do a different demonstration.

The boat will be back tomorrow. The electronics will be installed upon return.

Deputy stated a new electric water (pump) was installed at Winthrop Station.

Under Engineer's report it was again mentioned of the hose and ladder testing. Aerial and UL testing has also been done.

Fire Marshal submitted Activity Report.

He is still working with Kirtland Commons to implement fire protection and evacuation plans.

There was one open burning complaint.

There was also a discussion about the Fire Marshal's pay when he is working with the Reginal School District. Bowden will bring this up again with officials from the Town. Budney also asked for a run sheet from last year to use for grant money.

The Chairman reports he has not had an opportunity to get to Town Hall, but he will be resuming this action. He will ask them about health insurance for Fire Department members.

Under Old Business, the Chief is looking to get on the Board of Selectmen/Finance agenda to discuss a new building.

The person from Shipman's who was working on the compressor retired. It took a while to look through his notes, but Shipman's believes there are a few more options to try to get it working.

David said he could not obtain the necessary information needed to distribute to the members looking to collect on the pension plan. Efforts from the Town also failed. The Commission will now send a formal letter to request this information.

Under Other Business, the Chief revisited compliance of paperwork needed for the Department. He would like to find out how other entities handle this problem. Bowden recommended to have an evaluation done to see what the need to do to be in compliance. He will take this issue to the Town as well as the other issues previously mentioned. The Fire Marshal discussed an opportunity and need to have a (new) Deputy, due to circumstances witch have developed. He has someone in mind. There was some discussion on opening this opportunity to the Department. Hand-outs will be made to give to interested members for the July meeting. In principle, the Commission is willing to sponsor the person the Fire Marshal is interested in, to go through Fire Marshal training.
