SPECIAL TOWN MEETING December 13, 2011

Present were Dick Smith and Angus McDonald (Selectmen), Amy Winchell (Clerk), Russell Marth, Margo Hilfinger and Jack White. Also present were Jonathan Burton (Middletown Press) and Charles Stannard (Local Online News.TV).

Dick Smith called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. A motion to appoint Angus McDonald as moderator was made by Dick Smith and seconded by Russell Marth. Motion carried. - DISCUSSION: This is a 15 year renewal of a 25 year contract the town has had with this recycling company. The fees have remained the same at \$70 per ton tipping fee and the town earns \$10 per ton for recycled items. 70 Connecticut towns receive these services from CRRA which currently has no debt and has recovered from the Enron Scandal. Lisbon also has a facility for similar fees but the distance made hauling too expensive for Deep River.

There being no further discussion, item 1 was APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY.
