# DEEP RIVER TOWN HALL

Regular Meeting -- May 22, 2012

This regular meeting was called to order at 6:34 pm by Dick Smith.

Minutes: Regular Meeting – May 8, 2012

Motion by McDonald, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Smith, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of May 8, 2012.

Motion by McDonald, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Smith, to approve the appointment of Sara Denegre to the Planning & Zoning Commission as an alternate member, for a term to expire December 1, 2013.

# Additions to Agenda: Tax Abatement / Transfers & Appropriation:

Motion by Smith, 2<sup>nd</sup> by McDonald, to add to the agenda for discussion and action tax abatement for PCI Medical.

APPROVED 2 -- 0

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**Tax Abatement:** Smith explained that Connecticut State Statute **12-65b** allows municipalities to abate taxes for businesses that renovate and / or expand their facilities at a cost of more than \$100,000. The abatement can be up to 50% of taxes levied, for up to three years, but is limited to taxes on the renovation / new construction only. Based on figures provided by the Assessor's Office the cost of the improvements on the PCI property at 6 Winter Avenue totaled \$703,290. The benefit of tax abatement, which the Town has employed twice before, is that it encourages new business to locate in Deep River, and older companies to expand their operations. Support by the Board of Selectmen is based on an increase in the tax base and higher employment.

Motion by McDonald, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Smith, to approve the tax abatement for PCI Medical for Grand List years 2012, 2013 & 2014, and to forward the proposal to a Town Meeting.

Motion by Smith, 2<sup>nd</sup> by McDonald, to add to the agenda for discussion and action transfers and appropriations for the current budget (Fiscal Year 2011-12).

APPROVED 2-0

Smith provided an accounting, **which is reproduced in its entirety below**, of line item transfers and one appropriation necessary for budget lines that have been over-expended due to unexpected expenses. He explained that all transfers would be from within the current budget, and that the appropriation of \$55,977.06 is entirely offset by proceeds of a grant. No funding from the Unappropriated Fund Balance will be necessary.

The Town Meeting adjourned at 7:12 pm, and the Board of Selectmen returned to their meeting's agenda.

WHEREAS, Federal monies are available under the Connecticut Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program, administered by the State of Connecticut, Department of Economic and Community Development pursuant to Public Law 93-3 83, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 127c, and Part VI of Chapter 130 of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development is authorized to disburse such Federal monies to local municipalities; and,

WHEREAS, it is desirable and in the public interest that the Town of Deep River make application to the State for \$500,000 in order to undertake a Small Cities Community Development Program and to execute an Assistance Agreement therefore, should one be offered.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Board of Selectmen

1. That it is cognizant of the conditions and prerequisites for State Assistance imposed by Part VI of Chapter 130 of The Connecticut General Statutes; and,

2. That the filing of an application by the Town of Deep River in an amount not to exceed \$500,000 is hereby approved, and that the First Selectman is hereby authorized and directed to file such application with the Commissioner of the Department of Economic and Community Development, to provide such additional information, to execute such other documents as may be required by the Commissioner, to execute an Assistance Agreement with the State of Connecticut for State financial assistance if such an Agreement is offered, to execute any amendments, rescissions, and revisions thereto, and to act as the authorized representative of the Town of Deep River.
