Regular Meeting - March 12, 2013

NOTE: in deference to Michelle Connelly, Heart Safe Coordinator for the State of Connecticut, the Board invited her to speak before continuing with the meeting's agenda:

<u>Department of Health Presentation</u>

Ms. Connelly presented the Board of Selectmen with a certificate designating the town of Deep River as a Heart Safe Community, in recognition of the Town's installation of Automatic Electronic Defibrillators (AED) in town buildings, and for training Town employees in the use of AEDs as well as in CPR. The program began in the early 2000s, when the Town applied for and received a grant to purchase several AEDs.

The Board gratefully accepted the certificate.

WHEREAS, Federal monies are available under the Connecticut Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program, administered by the State of Connecticut, Department of Economic and Community Development pursuant to Public Law 93-3 83, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 127c, and Part VI of Chapter 130 of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development is authorized to disburse such Federal monies to local municipalities; and,

WHEREAS, it is desirable and in the public interest that the Town of Deep River make application to the State for \$600,000 in order to undertake a Small Cities Community Development Program and to execute an Assistance Agreement therefore, should one be offered.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Board of Selectman

- 1. That it is cognizant of the conditions and prerequisites for State Assistance imposed by Part VI of Chapter 130 of The Connecticut General Statutes; and,
- 2. That the filing of an application by the Town of Deep River in an amount not to exceed \$600,000 is hereby approved, and that the First Selectman is hereby authorized and directed to file such application with the Commissioner of the Department of Economic and Community Development, to provide such additional information, to execute such other documents as may be required by the Commissioner, to execute an Assistance Agreement with the State of Connecticut for State financial assistance if such an Agreement is offered, to execute any amendments, rescissions, and revisions thereto, and to act as the authorized representative of the Town of Deep River.
