Regular Meeting – June 24, 2014

Plattwood Industrial Park:

Selection from among the six companies expressing interest in locating on the land acquired by the Town of Deep River was tabled pending final engineering studies.

First Selectman's Note: as reported in previous minutes, the Town recently acquired land abutting the Plattwood Industrial Park sufficient to accommodate three additional buildings. Six companies have expressed interest in participating; the Board of Selectmen will choose three.

Union Negotiations:

There having been no recent negotiations, an executive session was not necessary.

Addition to the Agenda:

Oliveria moved, McDonald 2nd, to add to the agenda for discussion and action an appointment to the Region 4 Board of Education.

Appointment – Regional School District #4 Board of Education:

Laurie Tomlinson has submitted her resignation from the Region 4 Board effective July 31, 2014. Following brief discussion, Oliveria moved, McDonald 2nd, to approve the appointment of James Olson to fill the unexpired term. His service will commence on August 1, 2014 and extend until the municipal elections of 2015.

Audience of Citizens – Any Other Business to Come Before the Board:

Margo Hilfinger asked for an update on the Kirtland / River Street sewer expansion. Smith explained that six bids were received, but all had exceeded the Town Meeting authorization of up to \$ 4,000,000, which includes proceeds of a grant and a long-term low interest loan from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA).

Smith reported that the USDA had been contacted to see whether the grant and / or long-term, low interest loan can be augmented to the extent that the entire project can go forward as proposed. We are awaiting their decision. If additional funding does not become available, another option would be to postpone the River Lane portion and one emergency generator, which would effect a savings of approximately \$400,000;

Smith noted that the Parks & Recreation Commission's carnival, held at Devitt Field June $26^{th} - 28^{th}$, had generated revenue of \$3,758. Following past practice, Parks and Recreation will request that the funds be transferred to their budget.
