

**STATE ELECTION
NOVEMBER 4, 2014**

The State Election, legally warned, was held on November 4, 2014, in the Deep River Public Library Community Meeting Room from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Dale Winchell served as Head Moderator. A total of 1968 votes were cast: 1849 at the polls, 81 by absentee ballot, 2 by IVS, and 36 votes cast by Election Day Registrants. The total number of registered voters on the list on Election Day was 3144. Voter turnout was 63%. The voters were registered as follows:
