NEW BUSINESS

MHC Survey and Planning Grants (relating to Inventory project)

John reported re new grants available from the MHC.

The 4 criteria for receiving funds are:

- 1. Completion of a cultural resource inventory
- 2. Nomination of significant properties to the registry of historic national monuments
- 3. Complete community-wide preservation plans
- 4. Other types of studies, reports and projects for the protection of significant historical properties

The Town has to match any received funds. CPA funds are a typical source for the match but DOR ruled last year that unlike other towns we can only use CPA funds for bricks-and-mortar projects. John will talk to Kayce to find other town funds. Inventory Project still on hold.

Two letters from MHC / Brona Simon

2 letters were received from Brona Simon(State Archeologist) related to proposed construction projects within the Town.

1st letter: Brona said that the Pocumtuck Ridge site for an AT&T tower would require an archaeological survey. Subject is moot because that area is not zoned for cell towers by the Town.

2nd letter: Eaglebrook School's request for an addition to the music and arts building was approved.
