### **Call to Order**

## **Scheduled Appointments**

## Monthly Reports - Building Inspector/Transfer Station

Rick Pelletier reported that the office of the Building Inspector had a busy summer with 25 new homes to date. He estimates that 10 or 12 remain to be built in Forest Glen and expects that work to be done by year end. Solar Panel installations have also been busy with thirty arrays installed so far and Granite Solar being book through 2016.

At the Transfer Station, Mr. Pelletier reported that the Wheelabrator contract expires in March and that he expects to receive a new five year proposal with a reduction from \$76/ton to \$72/ton in year one with a 3.3% increase each year. Mr. Pelletier expects that the plastic compactor will need to be replaced in the coming months and that he hopes to complete the paving at the facility. Additionally he anticipates needing to purchase another tractor trailer soon as the increased demand at the facility is pushing its capacity.

### Katie Libby - Veasey Park

Katie Libby asked that the Board approve of her coordinating a volunteer work day in the spring to clear the footpath for personal paddle watercraft at Veasey Park as was approved by Warrant Article in 2012. The Board was in favor of the idea, but asked that Ms. Libby coordinate with the Veasey Park Commission to formulate a specific plan of action. Selectwoman Hutchinson noted that the Commission is in need of additional members and asked whether Ms. Libby might consider serving. Selectman Robertson offered to serve as the Board's liaison with the Commission on the project. Ms. Libby will reach out to the Commission to see if the project can gain some renewed momentum.

## Correspondence

The Town received the February update from the Conservation Commission. The group voted unanimously to file for SEC Petitioner Intervenor status.

The NH Department of Revenue Administration reported to Deerfield on its annual equalization of assessed values. For the period from 10/1/2014 through 9/30/2015 the median home value fell at 100.2% of the 4/1/2015 assessed value. The overall equalization assessment to sales ratio for Deerfield was found to be 98.7%.

The Town has prepared a letter to send to Mr. Skip Sansoucy to state that all utility cases pre-2014 would fall under his representation, with AVATAR handling all cases from 2015, forward. The Board agreed to wait on sending the letter until Town Counsel has provided a legal opinion on the matter.

Notice was received that a new Verizon Tower will be installed in Salem, NH.

The State of NH Block Grant Aide for January was received in the amount of \$27,704.84.

DCS has sent \$600 for its portion of the Copy Sync invoice.

The Regional Signal Warrant Study, which studies traffic conditions, has asked the Town to identify potential intersections to be included in its study. The Board suggested that the crosswalk in front of the GBW Building and the area in front of DCS would be appropriate areas to put forward.

#### **Town Administrator's Report**

J. Foisy reported that Fred McGarry has asked that she attend the February10th Southern New Hampshire Planning meeting on regional purchasing of Heating Oil. Ms. Foisy reminded that

Town Offices will be closed February 15th in observance of President's Day. Work has begun on the installation of the handicap lift and lower bathroom renovations at the George B. White Building.

Members of the Board will need to be present at the Primary polls this week, J. Foisy asked for three members in the morning and evening and no less than one Board Member for the duration of the day.

J. Foisy updated that Erik Berglund has provided a description of Warrant Article 18 for the Voters Guide, the Board was OK with the language with J. Foisy's revisions.
