## Town of Deerfield BOARD OF SELECTMEN February 27, 2017 MINUTES

## Call to Order

5:30p - Chairman Barry called the meeting to order.

## Tandy Road Project - Roscoe Blaisdell

Mr. Blaisdell, together with Attorney Peter Tamposi, described that the landowner on Tandy Road is looking for a variance to make improvements to the Class VI road and put in a 3 lot subdivision. Chairman Barry asked why the group was not first going before the Planning Board, Mr. Blaisdell responded that historically the Board's approval was required to fix up a Class VI road. Chairman Barry advised that the Board would look to the Planning Board to make a recommendation. Mr. Blaisdell indicated that they will be going to the Planning Board, but were generally looking to start the conversation in order to get a sense of whether the Town would be agreeable to the project. Selectman McGarry spoke that the Planning Board would typically require that the developer prepare specifications for the road, and assuming that all parties were in agreement, would then make a recommendation that the Select Board authorize the work to take place. At a minimum the developers would need to meet the Smyth Ordinance, with specifications including a road width of 50 feet, 18 inches of gravel and maximum grades of 9%. Mr. Blaisdell confirmed that they would schedule an informal meeting with the Planning Board to see whether the landowner feels it is viable to move forward.

## **Review of Correspondence**

The Franchise Fee of \$30,425.28 has been received from Metrocast.

The Road Agent has begun posting to roads for Spring travel restrictions.

Jim Spillane has identified another Color Printer to be donated to the Town. The Town Administrator confirmed that the equipment would be able to be put to use.

Public Service has filed for an abatement of taxes.

The Rockingham County Commissioner will be making a change to its Fiscal Year and will be updating the Town on the plans for transition.

The Board has been copied on a Southern NH Planning Commission study of the Rt 43/107 intersection at the Deerfield Community School driveway. The area is being evaluated as to the need for a traffic light, at this time it was determined there is insufficient need for the light.

The Board has received correspondence from a gentleman looking to open a Tattoo and Body Piercing Shop above Mr. Mikes. The Board has no regulations prohibiting such a business, but suggested the individual speak with the Code Enforcement Officer as to the viability of the space in question.

#### **Town Administrator's Report**

J. Harrington reported that Engine 3, Engine 4, Tank 2 and Rescue 2 have all required vehicle maintenance recently for a water pump, recall work, ignition switch and power steering and brakes respectively. All but Rescue 2 are back in service at this time.

### **Unfinished, Other or New Business**

Selectman McGarry advised that in the Board's packets are a write up he has prepared with additional comments regarding the Fire Department's updated Policies and Procedures. He asked members to review.

Additionally, Selectman McGarry poke that the Town has operated with the Smyth Ordinance setting the standards for Road Construction for some time, but that he believes a procedural adjustment is needed

as to how the matters are handled. He asked if it would be OK to raise the question with Town Counsel, the Board had no objections.

Chairman Barry asked that it be placed on the next meeting agenda to begin discussing how to move forward with finding a replacement for the Fire Chief and Building Maintenance Employee. Members agreed that the Town would likely need to form a Committee to help establish a plan for the January 2018 transition. The Town Administrator has been detailing the activities of the Building Maintenance role and mapping out various pipes and electrical infrastructure details of the Town Buildings.
