I have attached a memo and information from Mike Walsh, Finance Director, with information regarding the related debt service and tax impact that this referendum will have on taxpayers. He will also be at the meeting to answer any questions that may arise from this information.

G.E.I. Consultants, Inc. would like to make a power point presentation at the Town Council meeting. A representative will present what has been completed, where the next phase is likely to be worked on and how the \$7 million will be spent.

Included in this package is the letter from Robinson and Cole with the procedures to be followed for the issuance of \$7,000,000 bonds that needs to be submitted to the voters in the November, 2011 election. Also attached is the Resolution and other documents necessary for this process.

2011 Bond Referendum Request

The Town's next phase of the rehabilitation of the Flood Protection System (System) will address the existing deficiencies identified during the Periodic Inspection completed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) in 2010. Based on the USACE's guidelines and discussions with USACE staff, the Town will be given deadlines to correct the various deficiencies. If the Town does not meet the Federal deadlines, the USACE will remove the System from the list of active flood protection systems. USACE assistance during a flood fighting event and as well Federal assistance to repair the System in the event of damage during a flood event would not be available if this were to occur. The loss of active status would also result in the loss of FEMA Accreditation which impacts the flood insurance rates and the need for flood insurance for all of the properties protected by the System. Current funding for the project is insufficient to address the USACE's concerns noted in the Periodic Inspection.

The following provides the Town's current understanding of the USACE's unacceptable and minimally acceptable concerns and the current cost estimate to address the deficiency (if available).

USACE Periodic Inspection Deficiencies

The elements of the System which are considered unacceptable by the USACE include:

- Replacement of the Timber Bulkhead Toe Drainage System Replacement estimated cost = \$ 1,393,366
 estimated cost = \$ 3,077,300
- 3. Closure Structure Repairs estimated cost = \$ 255,000
- 4. Meadow Hill Storage Pond Dredging estimated cost = \$ 3,442,140

- 6. Pump Station Electrical System Testing currently under contract*

The costs associated with some of the items noted above will be determined once the Periodic Inspection is released and analyzed.

Project Schedule

Assuming a referendum in the amount of \$7 million was to be approved in November 2011, the following tentative schedule for the next phase of the project is proposed:

- 1. Timber Bulkhead Replacement
 - a. Permitting 2011 (currently under contract)
 - b. Vegetation removal along Connecticut River- winter 2012 2013
 - c. Construction summer 2013
- 2. Toe Drain System Replacement
 - a. Evaluation 2011 (currently under contract)
 - b. Design 2011 & 2012
 - c. Construction 2013
- 3. Closure Structure Repairs
 - a. Design 2011 (currently under contract)
 - b. Construction 2012
- 4. Meadow Hill Storage Pond Dredging
 - a. Design & Permitting complete waiting for funding
 - b. Construction 2012
- 5. Pump Station Repairs including trash racks
 - a. Design 2011 (currently under contract)
 - b. Construction Fall 2011
- 6. Pump Station Electrical System Testing
 - a. Testing 2011 (currently under contract)

The above mentioned schedule is subject to change as certain elements are beyond the Town's control including the necessary Federal and State permitting. It is anticipated that the funding level of the proposed 2011 referendum and the available project funding are insufficient to address all of the USACE's concerns resulting from the Periodic

Inspection. Assuming the referendum is successful, the funding should be sufficient to address the unacceptable elements and start the process to address the minimally acceptable elements. The Town will continue to work with the USACE to remain on the active list of flood protection systems.

November Levee Referendum Question and Related Debt Service

By way of this memo, attached please find an analysis of the town's existing debt service plus projections of additional debt service assuming the levee referendum question is sent to the voters and approved in November.

Related to the above, the mill rate and tax impacts for a variety of taxpayers starting with those who might own a home with a market value between \$150,000 and \$250,000 is modeled on page 4 of the attached analysis.

As a point of reference, based on the 2006 revalued grand list, the average taxpayer is defined as an individual who owns a home with an appraised/market value of \$178,431 which translates into an assessed value (70% of the appraised/market value) of \$124,902. This house, using the current mill rate of 34.42, pays an annual real estate tax of \$4,299.

I will be on hand at the next Town Council meeting to answer any questions on the aforementioned.



- 5. After approval by the Mayor, the resolution is published in its entirety within ten days thereafter.

- 9. In addition, the Town Clerk per Section 8.3 of the Charter is to publish the election and referendum notice in a newspaper of general circulation not less than 15 days nor more than 30 days prior to November 8, 2011, i.e. between October 8, 2011 and October 23, 2011.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF EAST HARTFORD:

Section 1. The sum of \$7,000,000 is appropriated, subject to Town Council approval of such appropriation, for improvements and repairs to the Town's flood control system to bring the system into conformity with federally mandated standards imposed on the Town by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Section 2. To meet the Town's share of said appropriation \$7,000,000 bonds of the Town or so much thereof as shall be necessary for such purpose, shall be issued, maturing not later than the maximum maturity permitted by the General Statutes of the State of Connecticut, Revision of 1958, as amended from time to time (the" Connecticut General Statutes"). Said bonds may be issued in one or more series as determined by the Mayor, Treasurer, and Director of Finance in the amount necessary to meet the Town's share of the cost of the Project, provided that the total amount of bonds to be issued shall not be less than an amount which will provide funds sufficient with other funds available for such purpose to pay the principal of and the interest on all temporary borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds outstanding at the time of the issuance thereof, and to pay for the costs of issuance of such bonds. The bonds shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or a whole multiple thereof, be issued fully registered form, be executed in the name and on behalf of the Town by the facsimile or manual signatures of the Mayor and the Treasurer, bear the Town seal or a facsimile thereof, be certified by a bank or trust company which bank or trust company may be designated the registrar and transfer agent, be payable at a bank or trust company and be approved as to their legality by Robinson & Cole LLP, Attorneys-at-Law, of Hartford. The bonds shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the bonds shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon. The aggregate principal amount of the bonds of each series to be issued, the annual installments of principal, redemption provisions, if any, the certifying, registrar and transfer agent and paying agent, the date, time of issue and sale and other terms, details and particulars of such bonds including approval of the rate or rates of interest, shall be determined by the Mayor, Treasurer, and Director of Finance in accordance with the Connecticut General Statutes of Connecticut.

Section 3. Said bonds shall be sold by the Mayor, Treasurer, and Director of Finance in a competitive offering or by negotiation, in their discretion. If sold in a competitive offering, the bonds shall be sold at not less than par and accrued interest on the basis of the lowest net or true interest cost to the Town. A notice of sale or a summary thereof describing the bonds and setting forth the terms and conditions of the sale shall be published at least five days in advance of the sale in a recognized publication carrying municipal bond notices and devoted primarily to financial news and the subject of state and municipal bonds. If the bonds are sold by negotiation, provisions of the purchase agreement shall be approved by the Mayor, Treasurer, and Director of Finance.

Section 4. The Mayor, Treasurer, and Director of Finance are authorized to make temporary borrowings in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds. Notes evidencing such borrowings shall be signed by the Mayor and the Treasurer, have the seal of the Town affixed, be payable at a bank or trust company designated by the Mayor, Treasurer, and Director of Finance, be approved as to their legality

by Robinson & Cole LLP, Attorneys-at-Law, of Hartford, and be certified by a bank or trust company designated by the Mayor, Treasurer, and Director of Finance pursuant to Section 7-373 of the Connecticut General Statutes. The notes shall be issued with maturity dates which comply with the provisions of the Connecticut General Statutes governing the issuance of such notes. The notes shall be general obligations of the Town and each of the notes shall recite that every requirement of law relating to its issue has been duly complied with, that such note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and that the full faith and credit of the Town are pledged to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon. The net interest cost on such notes, including renewals thereof, and the expense of preparing, issuing and marketing them, to the extent paid from the proceeds of such renewals or said bonds, shall be included as a cost of the Project. Upon the sale of the bonds, the proceeds thereof, to the extent required, shall be applied forthwith to the payment of the principal of and the interest on any such notes then outstanding or shall be deposited with a bank or trust company in trust for such purpose.

Section 5. The Town hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to §1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and anytime after the date of passage of this resolution in the maximum amount and for the project defined in Section 1 with the proceeds of bonds, notes, or other obligations ("Bonds") authorized to be issued by the Town. The Bonds shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Project, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The Town hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Director of Finance or his designee is authorized to pay project expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of reimbursement bonds.

Section 6. The Mayor, Treasurer and Director of Finance are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Town, to enter into agreements or otherwise covenant for the benefit of bondholders to provide information on an annual or other periodic basis to Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB") and to provide notices to the MSRB of material events as enumerated in Securities and Exchange Commission Exchange Act Rule 15c2-12, as amended, as may be necessary, appropriate or desirable to effect the sale of the bonds and notes authorized by this resolution. Any agreements or representations to provide information to MSRB made prior hereto are hereby confirmed, ratified and approved.

Flood Protection System Rehabilitation Project Request for Qualifications – Professional Services

As part of the professional service contract RFP #08-22 with GEI Consultants, Inc, Public Works has been successful in obtaining FEMA accreditation for the Town's Flood Protection System. FEMA has granted this accreditation and is in the process of updating the Flood Insurance Rate Maps to reflect this fact and the FEMA Accreditation Repair Project currently underway addressing various deficiencies is scheduled to be complete on June 15, 2011.

As we continue to move forward with the rehabilitation of the Flood Protection System addressing deficiencies noted in the Army Corps of Engineers Periodic Inspection (see the attached memorandum from Nick Casparino), we feel that this is the appropriate point in time to seek the necessary professional services for the remaining phases of the rehabilitation project.

Please request that an item be placed on the upcoming Town Council agenda which will authorize the Town to utilize a Request for Qualifications to secure professional services associated with rehabilitation of the flood protection system.

Bid Waiver Request for the Selection of Professional Services

Request for Qualification Process (RFQ)

Public Works has been successful in obtaining FEMA Accreditation for the Town's Flood Protection System (System) with the assistance of GEI Consultants, Inc. (GEI) as part of Request for Proposal (RFP) #08-22. The United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) completed a Periodic Inspection of the System in 2010 which has generated a list of System deficiencies that the Town will need to address. It is our understanding that the USACE will establish deadlines to complete the necessary repairs to System when the findings of the periodic Inspection are published. The periodic inspection is anticipated to be released later this year.

Public Works in consultation with the Corporation Counsel's Office has made a decision to complete the existing design work currently under contract with GEI as part of RFP #08-22. All future professional services associated with the design of the overall rehabilitation of the System will be completed by a firm to be selected. The Engineering Division recommends that professional services for the project be selected based on Qualification Based Selection Process (Request for Qualifications - RFQ). One of the reasons for the use of an RFO versus the RFP is the undefined scope of work associated with the corrective actions. The release of the Periodic Inspection will help to define some of the necessary work elements. The level of design effort associated with other System elements will be established as part of GEI engineering analysis and coordination process with the USACE which are currently under contract. (i.e. toe drain evaluation contract - the current engineering study will set the scope of work for the future work, analysis of the pump station's electrical systems - the current analysis may or may not require corrective action, etc.) The anticipated USACE deadlines to address the deficiencies are the second reason for the use of the RFQ. The use of a RFQ will allow the Town to commence the selection process and we will be better able to respond to the anticipated USACE's deadlines. The third reason for the use of the RFQ deals with the lack of funding and the timing for securing funding. Efforts for various design elements will not be started until the Town is convinced that sufficient funding has been secured to cover the cost of construction. Utilizing the RFQ process will allow flexibility in responding to the Federal requirements as well as result in a quicker response time.

Please request that the appropriate bid waiver request is placed on the upcoming Town Council's agenda to allow the use of a RFQ process for the selection of professional services associated with the design of the rehabilitation of the Town's Flood Protection System.

Appropriation and Fund Balance Transfer Resolution

Attached please find a list of interdepartmental budget transfers to be approved by the Town Council by June 30, 2011 to allow the Town to end the fiscal year "in the black" by department.

As an item to note, the budget freeze implemented in January of 2011 has resulted in approximately \$700k in budgeted expenses that will be available for transfer to other departments where the funding is needed as we end the fiscal year. However, unfavorable budget items detailed below will absorb that funding and additionally will require a Supplemental Budget Appropriation and Fund Balance transfer of \$500k for which a resolution is attached to balance the books.

General Fund - Transfers To:

Registrar of Voters - \$2k: This transfer will provide funding for higher than budgeted Election Official and Election Day costs experienced during the fiscal year.

<u>Library - \$10k:</u> This transfer will provide funding for higher than budgeted heating and electricity costs experienced during the fiscal year.

<u>Grants - \$25k:</u> This transfer will provide funding for expenses not reimbursed by the CDBG administrative portion of the annual grant.

<u>Police - \$175k</u>: This transfer will provide funding for higher overtime due to minimum staffing requirements imbedded in the Police Contract, vacancies (open positions, Worker's Compensation injuries, or military leave) that contributed to overtime, and ongoing investigations related to two triple homicide investigations.

<u>Fire - \$275k</u>: This transfer will provide funding for higher overtime due to minimum staffing requirements imbedded in the Fire Contract and vacancies (open positions, Worker's Compensation injuries, and one non-service related disability).

<u>Public Works - \$600k:</u> This transfer (\$500k from Fund Balance, \$100k from Interdepartmental) will provide funding for overtime paid due to unprecedented winter snow including night, weekend, and holiday premiums to haul snow from areas throughout town where safe passage was limited due to snow banking to unsafe levels. The amount requested is net of \$200k to be received from FEMA due to a Presidential Disaster Declaration related to January Storm Benedict. Higher expenses due to higher utilization of diesel, gasoline, oil, and electric due to the severe winter as well as market spikes in per unit costs also combined to create this unfavorable variance.

 $\underline{Senior\ Services-\$15k:}\ This\ transfer\ will\ provide\ funding\ for\ higher\ costs\ related\ to\ "Dial-a-Ride"\ costs\ (gasoline/diesel)\ and\ higher\ ridership.$

<u>Capital Improvements - \$1k:</u> This transfer will provide funding to balance the account.

General Fund - Transfers Out:

<u>Town Council - \$5k:</u> This transfer is available due to lower internal auditing costs paid than budgeted.

<u>Town Clerk - \$2k:</u> This transfer is available due to lower printing costs than budgeted.

<u>Mayor's Office - \$27k:</u> This transfer is available due to lower permanent services costs due to the partial year vacancy in the Mayor's Administrative Aid position.

Corporation Counsel - \$8k: This transfer is available due to lower costs than budgeted in a variety of areas.

<u>HR - \$25k:</u> This transfer is available due to lower permanent services costs due to the partial year vacancy in the Human Resource Director position.

Youth Services - \$5k: This transfer is available due to lower costs in a variety of areas related to the budget freeze.

Finance - \$180k: This transfer is available due to lower costs in a variety of areas related to the budget freeze.

<u>Inspections - \$10k:</u> This transfer is available due to lower costs in a variety of areas related to the budget freeze.

Parks and Recreation - \$40k: This transfer is available due to two open positions.

Health - \$15k: This transfer is available due to lower costs in a variety of areas related to the budget freeze.

<u>Debt - \$198k:</u> This transfer is available due to the timing of the debt sale compared to the original budget and the avoidance of note interest.

<u>Contingency - \$88k:</u> This transfer is available due to the return of funding related to unsettled collective bargaining agreements.

Office of Economic Adjustment Supplemental Grant

In October 2010, the Office of Economic Adjustment (OEA) at the Department of Defense awarded the Town of East Hartford along with the Connecticut Center for Advanced Technology (CCAT) a \$990,000, 12-month planning grant to frame a nationally replicable workforce development model to ensure continuity and retention of talent in the aerospace and defense manufacturing industry. This funding is available under Title 10 of the U.S. Code, Subsection 2391 (b)(1)(C).

The primary impetus behind the grant was to develop a strategic plan to counter the economic and workforce impact in Connecticut and Western Massachusetts due to the cancellation of the F-22 Raptor fighter aircraft. The engine for the Raptor is built by East Hartford's Pratt & Whitney Aircraft and is supported by supply chain companies in the region.

The OEA has contacted us to say that they will "entertain a supplemental application" from the Town, including the Connecticut Center for Advanced Technology (CCAT), for additional funding to further the work conducted under the original grant. We are working with CCAT to obtain up to \$1.5 million in additional grant funding from the OEA and extend the term of the amended contract to June 30, 2012. The funding application is due June 24, 2011. We anticipate a decision on the application as early as August 1, 2011.

The overarching goal of the grant remains unchanged - to preserve the regional and national defense industrial workforce. The strategies to achieve this goal include the creation of a nationally replicable model to support aerospace and defense dislocated workers during their transition period, to further diversify the regional economy and strengthen the aerospace and defense sector, and to support the development of a workforce pipeline that will increase the supply and versatility of the aerospace and defense workforce.

CCAT has learned that the total impact of the F-22 contract termination on the workforce and industry is minimal, however, there exists a significant lack of the skilled, high-tech workers needed to support the growth of the aerospace and defense manufacturing sector and economic diversity of the region. The grant proposes to enhance the original scope of work through additional research, data collection, and analysis, as well as field testing worker support models. This expansion is based on key learnings from the work completed by CCAT and its consultant contractors to date. The expanded scope will

support a more detailed set of recommendations in the final report and include specific plans that would expedite implementation.

The attached Resolution is meant to accomplish two goals. First, it will authorize you as Mayor to make application for supplemental funding on behalf of the Town, including CCAT, and to enter into agreement for this grant. CCAT will continue to be responsible for providing the 10% match of in-kind funding required by this funding proposal.

Second, the Resolution acknowledges the need to obtain a bid waiver for the consultant contracts CCAT currently has in place so that the scope of work and deadlines of these contractors can be extended to meet the performance objectives of this supplemental funding proposal.






