Chair Kehoe called the meeting to order at 7:18 p.m. He announced the exit locations in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes §29-381 after which the Council joined him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Chair gave a brief overview of the Mayor's recommended 2012-2013 budget which represents a 4.8% increase in expenses, or \$7.6 million. Of the \$7.6 million, \$3.2 million is going to the Board of Education; \$3.3 million is set aside for health benefits; \$845,000 is set aside for additional pension costs, which leaves only \$204,000 to cover the increase in the town's operating budget.

Due to revaluation, the Chair stated that the impact of this year's budget varies dramatically, whether residential or commercial, and therefore, it is difficult to announce the average tax increase to homeowners as has been done in the past. However, since the burden of the tax increase has shifted from residential property owners to business owners, the Chair stated that roughly 60% of all homeowners in East Hartford will see a decrease in their yearly property taxes.

Chair Kehoe announced that the Council, as a whole, is planning to set aside sufficient funds to provide the Board of Education with financial resources to keep the Synergy Alternative High School and the HeadStart program.

The following citizens came forth to speak on the impact that revaluation had on their property taxes:

<u>John Bezzini</u>, 92 Copper Beech Way, stated that his yearly taxes will increase over \$600, but his assessment decreased by \$12,000. Mr. Bezzini asked for the process that Municipal Valuation Services uses to obtain a fair assessment of residential properties.

<u>Paul Gallo</u>, 104 Jessica Drive, stated that the value of his home decreased by 9.3%, but his taxes will increase by 12.8%. When he received notice from the town in December of this change, he did not question it because the Mayor's budget was not yet available and, therefore, he did not know what impact the budget would have on his assessment.

The following citizens came forward to speak in favor of keeping the HeadStart program:

Maria Guzman, 812 Brewer Street; <u>Diane Stone</u>, Teacher at Willowbrook School, who also read a letter from <u>Georgia Clark</u>, 105 Smith Drive, in support of HeadStart; <u>Aphrodite "Dede" Koutsares</u>, Teacher at Willowbrook School; <u>Kimberly Pedneault</u>, Teacher at Willowbrook School; <u>Betsy Valentin</u>, 19 Margery Drive; <u>Victoria Starr</u>, 17 Chickasaw Drive; and <u>David Akai</u>, 50 Church Street.

The following citizens came forward to speak in favor of keeping the Synergy Alternative High School program:

<u>Shelly Nearing</u>, 377 School Street; <u>Angel Fontanez</u>, 49 Cannon Road; <u>Jennifer Wisnewski</u>, 1192 Forbes Street; <u>Betsy Valentine</u>, 19 Margery Drive; <u>Malcolm Freeman, Jr.</u>, 23 Higbie Drive; <u>Joshua Lam</u>, 106 Greenlawn Street; and <u>Nathan Allison</u>, Teacher at Synergy Alternative High School.

<u>Susan Kniep</u>, 50 Olde Roberts Street, (1) spoke in favor of keeping both the HeadStart and Synergy Alternative High School programs; (2) suggested that the Town Council hold another public hearing after they present their budget to the residents and before actually setting the budget; and (3) believes there should be a 3-year wage freeze on all town employees' salaries.

The following citizens came forth to speak on the impact that revaluation had on their property taxes:

<u>Janice Allison</u>, 97 Copper Beech Way, asked why 60% of homeowners had a decrease in yearly taxes, while 40% had an increase. Ms. Allison suggested that the increase in the budget should be equalized by disbursing the increase to all residential property owners.

<u>Susan Kniep</u>, 50 Olde Roberts Street, (1) suggested that the Town Council hold another public hearing after they present their budget to the residents and before actually setting the budget; (2) questioned the Governor's proposed \$1.7 million grant to the Board of Education; (3) commented on the 40% increase in health benefits for employees; (4) suggested a 3-year wage freeze for all town employees; (5) asked that the Council provide the source of funding for any wage increases and healthcare benefits that are in the 2012-

2013 budget; (6) believes that all union contracts should be subject to a public hearing before those contracts are fully executed; and (7) suggested that the Council hold a meeting and have the Town Assessor and Municipal Valuation Services – the entity hired by the Town of East Hartford to perform the 2011 revaluation – to explain how the assessments were formulated for homes in East Hartford.

The Chair announced that the next meeting will be held Tuesday, March 13th at 7PM in Council Chambers when the Council will set the 2012-2013 budget. The next regular Town Council meeting will be held Tuesday, March 20th.





Attached please find a copy of the amusement permit application submitted by the East Hartford Parks & Recreation Department by Jim Uhrig and the East Hartford Board of Education Physical Education Department. The applicants seek to conduct the 25th Annual Memorial Mile Road Race, on Monday, May 28, 2012 from approximately 10:20 AM to completion. The race will start at the intersection of Burnside Ave. and Scotland Road and finish on Hillside Street across from Hillside Cemetery. Race registration and check-in will take place at the VFW Post #2083 located at the intersection of Tolland and Bidwell Streets between 8 AM – 9 AM. **Race location will ultimately be determined by the parade route.**

Pursuant to Town Ordinance (TO) 5-3, a review of the application was completed by the Directors of the Fire, Health, Parks & Recreation, and Public Works Departments. The Fire, Parks & Recreation, and Health Departments approve the application as submitted.

The Public Works Department recommends approval with the following conditions:

- Approval is recommended based upon the submitted route sketch and the understanding that the event will be held in conjunction with the Memorial Day parade and the implementation of all necessary traffic control devices required for that event. Any changes to the proposed route will require additional review and approval.
- The event is proposed to take place on State Highway Rt. 44 and the applicant shall coordinate their activities with the Department of Transportation (DOT) and obtain all necessary permits.
- The DOT reconstruction project of Rt. 44 at Short Reach is expected to be active at the time of the event and may impact the proposed route. The applicant shall coordinate their activities with

DOT project representatives. Any changes to the proposed route will require additional review and approval.

The **Police Department** conducted a review of the application and the following comment/recommendation is made:

- The Police Department can provide adequate police protection for this event. The site is suitable for the proposed amusement, the crowd is of moderate to large size, and the area has sufficient parking available.
- As in the past, Police Officers will be required to staff pedestrian and traffic control posts.
- In the event that the police manpower required for this event exceeds the Department's normal patrol complement, some overtime hiring may be necessary. The number of officers and cost of such overtime hiring is yet to be determined.



I've reviewed this application and pursuant to Town Ordinance 5.3, I recommend that the application be approved with the following conditions:

- 1- Section 7 of the application states that the race route will depend on the parade route. Traditionally the race organizers rely on the parade committee to establish a route, obtain road closure permits, and install the required traffic control devices. To date, we have not seen an application from the parade organizers and we do not know which route they will utilize. Approval is recommended based upon the submitted route sketch and the understanding that the event will be held in conjunction with the Memorial Day Parade and the implementation of all necessary traffic control devices required for that event. Any changes to the proposed route will require additional review and approval.
- 2- The event is proposed to take place on state highway Rt. 44 and the applicant shall coordinate their activities with the Department of Transportation (DOT) and obtain all necessary permits.
- 3- The Department of Transportation reconstruction project of Rt. 44 at Short Reach is expected to be active at the time of the event and may impact the proposed route. The applicant shall coordinate their activities with DOT project representatives. Any changes to the proposed route will require additional review and approval.







- c. Parking Plan On Site & Impact on Surrounding / Supporting Streets:

 Parking will be at the Town Green Parking Lot. People may park in the downtown area and walk to the festival. Event parking will not be permitted on Main Street directly in front of the Green. Disabled parking will be provided in the Town Green Parking Lot.
- Noise Impact on Neighborhood:
 Noise levels are not expected to be disruptive to the surrounding homes and businesses.
- e. Trash & Litter Control Plan for the Amusement Site and Surrounding Community During and Immediately After the Proposed Amusement:

 Park Maintenance personnel will be available to provide litter clean-up during and immediately after the conclusion of the event.
- f. List expected general disruption to neighborhood's normal life and activities:
- g. Other Expected Influence on Surrounding Neighborhood;
 The department is hopeful that the event will gain support from the Main Street merchants.
 The department is optimistic that people will be attracted to the central business district of East Hartford as a result of this event.
- 12. Provide a Detailed Plan for the Following:
 - a. Accessibility of Amusement Site to Emergency, Police, Fire & Medical Personnel and Vehicles: Emergency, police, fire and medical personnel and vehicles will have immediate access to the event through the entrance located off Main Street and Robin Terrace.
 - b. Provisions for Notification of Proper Authorities in the Case of an Emergency: Event officials will bave cell phones and portable radios, which have Park frequency and Police frequency capabilities. In the event of an emergency, the proper authorities can be notified immediately.
 - c. Any Provision for On-Site Emergency Medical Services: In past years, on-site emergency medical services have not been provided. In the event of a medical emergency, personnel from the East Hartford Fire Department will be summoned. The event has no activities which present an inherent risk of injury to those in attendance.
 - d. Crowd Control Plan:
 - Park Rangers will assist with crowd control and parking.
 - e. If on Town Property, the Plan for the Return of the Amusement Site to Pre-Amusement Condition: Park Maintenance personnel will be on-site to control litter during the event. At the conclusion of the event, all litter and trash will be moved from the Town Green grounds and surrounding areas as required. The Town Green grounds will be returned to the same state that they were in propr to the operation of the event.


