## CALL TO ORDER

Chair Kehoe called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m. The Chair announced the exit locations in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes §29-381, after which the Council joined him in the pledge of allegiance.

## OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL ON AGENDA ITEMS

Susan Kniep, 50 Olde Roberts Street, (1) is hopeful that the Municipal Tax Exempt Lease Purchase between the Town of East Hartford and the Board of Education regarding solid waste collection will reduce costs; (2) stated that there are significant financial issues at the state level that could affect the town's budget; (3) asked that the cell tower issue at Gorman Park, which was recently voted down by the Fees Committee, be brought before the full Council for a vote; and (4) strongly believes that the Council should create an ordinance permanently banning cell towers in any parks or school property in East Hartford.

<u>Franklin Kucza</u>, 87 Greenlawn Street, spoke to the waiver of qualifications for the Director of Inspections and Permits and inquired if the town is getting the best qualified candidate for this position and other director's positions.

Michael Kaluszka, 34 Prasser Drive, hopes that the cell tower issue in Gorman Park is a dead issue. He also stated that the Parks & Recreation department needs to allocate more time in cleaning up Gorman Park.

<u>Al Lavigne</u>, 30 Prasser Drive, asked that the full Town Council actually vote down the cell tower issue in Gorman Park.

Mayor Leclerc (1) complimented the Council on the refinishing of the dais; (2) stated that she has more information on the waiver of qualifications for the Director of Inspections & Permits that she'll share with the Council when that agenda item is discussed; (3) said that the Improving East Hartford Program, which is before the Council, will be discussed in detail tonight; (4) explained that Michael Walsh, Finance Director, will detail the cost effectiveness of the Municipal Tax Exempt Lease Purchase Agreement for the collection of solid waste from the Board of Education; and (5) reported that the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation sent a notice to the Mayor's office, which she shared with the Town Council, that Interstate 84 will be repaved in the East Hartford/Manchester area starting June 2012.

## Town of East Hartford & Board of Education: Solid Waste Collection

WHEREAS, the Town will budget \$90,000 in fiscal years 2013-2014 through 2016-2017 in a Special Revenue Fund to pay principal and interest on the purchases.

## U. S. Department of Energy: Better Buildings Challenge Program

WHEREAS, the Town of East Hartford has initiated a number of energy savings projects including:

- A TransCanada electricity purchase agreement whereby a portion of the electric generation is from hydro, a renewable energy source; and
- Two Energy Performance Contracts totaling \$12.2 million with \$6 million paid for with the proceeds of a
  Qualified Energy Conservation Bond that included a 70% federal interest subsidy; and
- The construction of a LEEDS certified Firehouse; and
- Two ARRA projects for LED traffic signals and a more efficient rooftop HVAC unit for use here at Town Hall, and

WHEREAS, the Town of East Hartford is currently exploring the competitive market for up to five solar canopy arrays using zero emission reusable energy credits as the partial funding source and will be exploring the competitive market for energy efficient streetlight replacements for our community, and

WHEREAS, based on the collective body of energy efficiency work completed and the unfinished body of work in progress, the U. S. Department of Energy has invited East Hartford to join the Better Buildings Challenge, a recent Presidential leadership initiative which seeks to create jobs through energy efficiency while preserving natural resources, and

WHEREAS, the Town desires to participate by committing to provide leadership to other communities, publicly pledging to improve energy efficiency by 20% by 2020, and by providing an initial showcase project within the coming year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor of the Town of East Hartford is authorized to enter into the Better Buildings Challenge Community Partnership Agreement. The details of the agreement shall be mutually determined between the Mayor and the U. S. Department of Energy, whose signatures will indicate approval of specific terms and conditions.

Councillor Rossi also thanked Lisa Beauchamp, principal of Hockanum Elementary School, for hosting the Arbor Day celebration, sponsored by the town's Beautification Commission, on Friday April 27<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Rossi also thanked Tony Russo, Parks Department foreman, for "helping" the children plant a dogwood tree in the courtyard and a mountain laurel bush in the front of the school.

<u>Marc Weinberg</u> noted the May birthdays of Mayor Leclerc, Councillor Eric Thompson, Mary Alice Dwyer-Hughes, and Marc's mother – Bernice Dame.

<u>Bill Horan</u> thanked the Park's maintenance staff and rangers for all the work they did for the East Hartford Little League's opening day and commented that the town's fields look the best they've looked in years.

**Energy Performance Contract - Johnson Controls I and II Presentation** 

As you may recall, via the Request for Proposal process, Johnson Controls, Inc. (JCI) was selected as the Town and Board of Education's (BOE) Energy Performance Contractor. An energy performance contract seeks to upgrade energy related capital items (called FIMs – Facility Improvement Measures) within a Town or BOE building in an effort to save energy costs in such an amount as to pay for the acquisition, installation, and related interest costs of the capital items.

Examples of FIMS provided under an energy performance contract include lighting, new burners, HVAC software, motor upgrades, window film, weatherization, a pool cover, cogen heat recapture, vending controls, computer controls, steam traps, pipe insulation, attic insulation, VFDs, solar panels, and burner controls.

In short, Town and BOE building infrastructure is updated without adding new costs to the operating or capital budgets while at the same time, the Town and BOE's carbon footprint is reduced by using less energy since the new equipment installed is significantly more energy efficient (33% overall).



WHEREAS, the Town was willing to explore coupling the ZEREC credits with a power purchase agreement in order to facilitate the design, construction, and maintenance of up to five solar canopy arrays to work seamlessly with the Town's existing TransCanada electricity power purchase agreement, and

WHEREAS, on April 11th, the Town held a mandatory meeting with CCM for the purpose of walking 30 prospective solar bidders through the five selected sites to allow the two best proposals to present their ideas to the Mayor in a May 3rd meeting so that an informed recommendation could be made to the Town Council.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of East Hartford, hereby approves
the purchasing of electricity through the CCM Energy Purchasing Solar PV Program to
take advantage of long-term fixed price electricity pursuant to a Power Purchase
Agreement with, a solar development company that has been
selected through a competitively bid Request for Qualifications and has agreed to install,
own, operate and maintain an on-site photovoltaic electric generation system or systems
that will supply electricity at municipal and Board of Education sites specified in the
agreement at no cost to the Town of East Hartford;
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the East Hartford Town Council hereby authorizes the
Mayor to execute the Power Purchase Agreement on behalf of the Town; the details of
the agreement shall be mutually determined between the Mayor and the company
whose signatures will indicate approval of specific terms and conditions.

RE: CCM Energy Purchasing Program Participation - Solar Applications

As you are aware, CCM recently approached the Town and asked us to participate in a CCM initiated solar RFP. East Hartford is one of three towns that affirmatively partnered with CCM and as a result, now have bona fide offers to build up to five solar canopy arrays at Norris School, O'Brien School, O'Connell School, EHHS, and the Public Safety Complex.

30 solar companies participated in a bid in April including a mandatory walk through of each facility and two were selected to complete a finalist presentation before the Mayor on May 3rd based on the strength of their initial presentations. Please see the attached Bay State Consultants memo dated April 30, 2012 for more information.

We expect to have the solar finalist as recommended by the Mayor detail their plans and project designs to the Council on May 15th in a short presentation.

By using CCM to select Town and BOE sites for solar applications and by executing a power purchase agreement (which was contemplated when we signed with TransCanada), East Hartford can enjoy the environmental benefits of solar power with no capital investment while enjoying a modest reduction in electricity costs.

Accordingly, we ask that you forward to the Town Council the attached Power Purchase Agreement Resolution which if approved will commit the Town to paying for electricity generated by a solar canopy at each location to the owner of the equipment. The owner in turn will use the committed revenue stream from the Town coupled with ZEREC credits to make the infrastructure investment on behalf of the town.

Because the State directed auction of ZEREC credits will occur very shortly, the Town's commitment to a solar provider must be in place by May 23, 2012 if we are to proceed. Even with the Town's commitment in place, the finalist must also win a portion of the ZEREC bid in order for the work to commence.

In closing, I want to apologize for the speed at which this process has accelerated, and want to assure everyone involved that the milestones involved with the successful approval of this resolution were entirely dictated by a State regulatory process out of our control.

Accordingly, I want to thank the Mayor, the entire Council, Tim Bockus, Gregg Verallis, Jack Martin, Rich Gentile, Paul Mainuli, Al Costa, Stan Staron, and Joanne Zatarain for their time as we quickly moved to take advantage of this time sensitive opportunity.

We are pleased to report that we are on track to shortlist two qualified finalists today at prices that are in line with the pricing targets established at the beginning of the process. For the sake of confidentiality, I will refrain from naming these two finalists in this memo. We have asked each finalist to focus on the following issues in the technical presentation on Thursday, May 3rd:

- 1) Track record for developing and financing similar projects;
- 2) Description of the arrays proposed for East Hartford (all sizes are still preliminary and will be finalized at the final engineering stage);
- 3) Description of the schedule proposed for East Hartford;
- 4) Description of the steps to be taken to coordinate with school schedules, etc.;
- 5) Description of the design features dealing with the safety of these arrays in a school setting.

We have asked each proponent to limit their presentation to 20 minutes and to allow 40 minutes for Q&A. To enhance confidentiality, we have asked each proponent to: a) use a power point format; b) refrain from handing out hard copies of documents; and c) refrain from discussing any pricing information.

## Schedule

We need to complete the procurement *and execution* of the power purchase agreement with the selected solar company by Wednesday, May 23. That date is driven by the timing of the CL&P ZREC auction. Although there is still not a published schedule for the CL&P auction process, we have reason to believe that the CL&P will start its ZREC auction in the middle of May. The selected company will need to have executed a power purchase agreement with East Hartford, in order to submit a bid in the ZREC auction using the East Hartford projects as the basis of a ZREC bid. The milestone dates for our procurement are as follows:

Shortlist Three Companies	April 23
Initial Negotiations	Week of April 23rd
Shortlist Two Finalists per Community	April 30
Technical Presentations	May 3

The final contract will be a 20 year agreement in which the company will agree to design, permit, finance, own, and operate solar arrays and provide solar power to the 5 sites in East Hartford listed below. East Hartford will need to agree to purchase the solar power generated for 20 years (for the life of the equipment). I hope to be able to submit the leading contract of the leading company in near final form to Rich early during the week of May 7. Given the tough deadlines we are dealing with, I would like to do whatever we can to make the municipal contract review as efficient as possible. I should probably reach out to Rich to discuss the best approach later this week.

The following are the sites where the solar arrays have been proposed:

High School CIBA
Norris School
O'Brien School
O'Connell School
Public Safety Complex

The sizing of the arrays is based on very preliminary analysis and engineering, and will be finalized when the project moves to the detailed engineering phase. To give you some feel for the magnitude of these projects, we expect these arrays to provide something on the order of 40% to 50% of the total consumption at the above listed sites in East Hartford.

## **Project Description:**

The proposed hazard mitigation plan will analyze flooding within a portion of the Willow Brook watershed and will formulate a plan to minimize the effects of flood waters within vicinity of the Silver Lane commercial corridor. The last detailed study of Willow Brook was done in 1977 and since that point in time, the brook's watershed has evolved into the present day commercial corridor. Along with the corridor's evolution, hydrologic and hydraulic analysis has evolved in the 35 years since the original computer model of watershed was built. The goal of this project is to apply modern and a more detailed analysis to the watershed to develop a combination of projects that aim to reduce the size of the floodplain which is a challenge to the corridor's redevelopment.

## **Description of Need:**

Willow Brook is a watercourse that drains the central portion of Town and flows generally along Silver Lane westward to the Connecticut River. The brook is a source of frequent flooding and its last detailed study was done in 1977. The brook is specified within the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) flood insurance study as the major flooding problem within the Town of East Hartford. It further specifies that the watercourse has undersized culverts, a very wide low-lying flood plain, and adjacent areas that are highly developed with large expanses of pavement which contribute to rapid runoff and local flooding problems.

## **Hazard Mitigation Plan Scope:**

The overall scope of the proposed hazard mitigation plan is intended to analyze the present condition of the brook, re-map and adjust the floodplain if necessary, and will identify potential projects to further reduce the likelihood of flooding to insurable structures along its main channel in the vicinity of Silver Lane. The project scope is anticipated to compile existing data using various means and field survey, develop computer models of the watershed and watercourse, develop and analyze alternatives for improvements to minimize flooding within the watershed, and prepare a hazard mitigation plan.

## **Project Funding:**

It is anticipated that the development of the plan will be funded by a grant from DECD. Funding for construction projects recommended by the study will be sought at a future date. This study is also anticipated to be utilized as tool and basis to apply for funding from FEMA and other grant programs.

At the regularly scheduled January 3, 2012 Town Council Meeting, the following motion was approved by the Town Council as it relates to tax liens the town is interested in selling.

Recommendation from Tax Policy Committee: Tax Liens Sales/Foreclosures: RFP

MOTION By Marc Weinberg, seconded by Bill Horan

to authorize the administration to conduct a tax lien sale by way of a request for proposal (RFP) and to seek and receive sealed bids pursuant to an invitation to bid on a number of tax liens held by the town on specific real property as listed on a "delinquent report" produced by Finance Director Mike Walsh dated November 10, 2011 and attached to a memorandum from Mayor Leclerc to Rich Kehoe, Town Council Chair, dated December 6, 2011 subject to the following four conditions:

- The Collector of Revenue shall notify the record owner of each property subject to a lien that is
  to be included in the tax lien sale, by certified mail, that the lien is being included in the request
  for proposal and invitation to bid, and that the owner should contact the Town immediately to
  pay the taxes or seek a payment plan if they wish to keep the Town's tax liens on their property
  from being sold;
- In order to qualify for a payment plan, the property owner must meet the following three criteria:
  - They must remit 25% of the outstanding amount due
  - They cannot have defaulted on a prior payment arrangement
  - Their property must not have active property code violations
- The letters from the Collector of Revenue to each property owner shall notify the property owner that the purchaser of the tax lien on their property shall have the right to foreclose on that property; and
- The Administration shall return to the Town Council with the results of the request for proposal and that the proposal for each tax lien must be approved by the Town Council before it is sold.

Motion carried 9/0.

With respect to the aforementioned motion, having satisfied the conditions of the process articulated by the Town Council, we need to return to the Town Council to seek approval to sell tax liens where the bids received by the Town through the request for proposal (RFP) process were satisfactory.

A master bid sheet representing the highest bid received as part of the RFP process is attached. We are recommending 52 bids to three vendors totaling \$1,176,506.06 on tax liens of \$1,138,227.40 representing a premium of \$38,278.66 or 103.4%.

In addition to considering approval of the master bid sheet, I would also like the Council to consider the sale of three mobile home liens that were part of a prior competitive bid but that the Town never sold due to the transition of the Rivermead Mobil Home Park to new owners. The new owners wish to proceed with the purchase of these three liens so we include them here for Town Council action.

35 property owners came forward during the RFP process and either paid their taxes in full or made arrangements to enter into a payment plan with the Town whereby their delinquent taxes will be extinguished within 36 months while they keep current on new taxes. With respect to the process, it is our sincere hope that the remaining 52 property owners will make appropriate arrangements to satisfy their outstanding tax bills prior to the Town selling their liens.

However, should any property owner fail to address this issue timely, they will again have an opportunity to redeem these liens from the new owner during a set period after the Town sells the liens. Based on these recommendations, I would respectfully request that this package of information be forwarded along to the Town Council for their approval.

- In the event that the police manpower required for these events exceeds the Department's normal patrol complement, some overtime hiring may be necessary. Attached please find the amusement permit application from Mark Paggioli, President on behalf of the Capital Velo Club Cycling Team. The applicant seeks to conduct a series of bicycle races on Sunday, June 24, 2012 from 9:30 AM – 3:30 PM from Founders Plaza and the following Streets: East River Drive, Pitkin Street, Meadow Street, and Hartland Street.

The applicant respectfully requests a waiver of the associated permit fee, under the provisions of (TO) 5-6(c), due to the Town of East Hartford. The event's proceeds are used to make a donation to the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Team in Training and to support youth cycling. At this time the applicant also requests that the Administration Fees (35% surcharge) portion associated with the East Hartford Police Department be waived.

Pursuant to Town Ordinance (TO) 5-3, a review of the application was completed by the Directors of the Fire, Health, Parks & Recreation, and Public Works Departments. The **Parks & Recreation** and **Fire Departments** approve the application as submitted.

The **Public Works Department** recommends the application be approved subject to the conditions set forth:

- Road closure permits must be obtained from Public Works Engineering Division.
- The deployment of traffic control devices for the road closures are to be coordinated with the Public Works Division. <u>All overtime</u> <u>labor costs incurred by Public Works shall be the</u> <u>responsibility of the applicant.</u>

The **Health Department** has no objection to this application provided that the applicant obtains a temporary food service permit at least two (2) weeks prior to the event.

The Risk Management Department states the cycling team will need to

submit a Certificate of Insurance for One (1) Million dollars general liability and name the Town of East Hartford as an additional insured.

The **Police Department** conducted a review of the application and the following comment/recommendation is made:

- The Police Department can provide adequate police protection for this event. The proposed site is suitable for the proposed amusement, the crowd is of moderate size, and the area has sufficient parking available.
- This event can be conducted with a minimal impact upon the surrounding neighborhoods and a near-normal flow of traffic on the streets adjacent to the site can be maintained.
- As in the past, Police Officers will be required to staff pedestrian and traffic control posts.
- Police manpower required for this event exceeds the Department's normal patrol complement and some overtime hiring will become necessary. The number of officers and cost of such overtime hiring is yet to be determined. As an event that is not Town sponsored, this expense will have to be borne by the applicant.

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of East Hartford wishes to encourage the improvement or repair of structures, or facilities appurtenant thereto or, in areas designated as rehabilitation areas within the Town of East Hartford, (such improvement or repairs constituting a "Rehabilitation" as defined under Connecticut General Statutes §12-65c(b)), and

WHEREAS, Connecticut General Statures §12-65e allows for the deferral of increases in assessments attributable to Rehabilitation, and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 12-65d, the Town of East Hartford wishes to designate the entire Town of East Hartford as a "Rehabilitation Area", as defined by Connecticut General Statutes Section 12-65c(a), and

WHEREAS, the Town of East Hartford wishes to set forth eligibility criteria for the deferral of increases in assessments attributable to Rehabilitation;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town of East Hartford hereby designates the entire Town of East Hartford as a Rehabilitation Area as defined by Connecticut General Statutes §12-65c(a).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town of East Hartford adopts the definition of Rehabilitation as set forth in Connecticut General Statutes §12-65c(b).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following criteria be established for eligibility of real property within the Rehabilitation Area for the deferral of any increased assessment attributable to Rehabilitation,

1. The proposed Rehabilitation must increase the assessed value of the improvements upon residential, or non-residential, real property by at least the percentages outlined in the assessment deferral schedules set forth herein.

- 2. For residential real property, the existing structure that is the subject of the proposed Rehabilitation must be at least twenty-five (25) years old. Improvements may be required to include exterior renovations. The construction of new multi-family rental housing or cooperative housing units will not be eligible for assessment deferral.
- 3. For non-residential real property, the existing structure that is the subject of the proposed Rehabilitation must be at least thirty (30) years old. Improvements may be required to include exterior renovations.
- 4. All necessary permits including building, zoning, wetlands and special use, shall be acquired prior to application for the assessment deferral.
- 5. The Rehabilitation must be completed within one (1) year of the approval of the application for the assessment deferral.
- 6. The Rehabilitation must be compatible with the East Hartford Plan of Conservation and Development and consistent with the Town's Subdivision, Zoning and Inland Wetlands regulations.
- 7. All taxes due to the Town of East Hartford for the applicable real property (and the improvements thereon) shall be current.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any owner of real property may prepare and present an application for deferral of increased assessment of real property resulting from Rehabilitation of real property in the Rehabilitation Area to the Assessor, who shall determine the existing assessment for the existing improvements thereon, and the proposed adjusted assessment based on the completion of the Rehabilitation as submitted. The Assessor will provide such determination to the Town's Development office, which will work with the Towns' Corporation Counsel to prepare a tax deferral agreement. Each application shall include a fifty dollar (\$50) non-refundable application fee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Assessor shall approve the exemption upon the issuance of a certificate of occupancy, if required, and the final inspection and certification by the Director of Inspections and Permits that the Rehabilitation and the structures or facilities being Rehabilitated are in conformance with these criteria and all applicable provisions of the State Building Code, state Health Code and all local Housing Codes.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, the deferral of increased assessment with respect to the Rehabilitation will be in accordance with the following assessment deferral schedules and conditions:

- a) Any such tax deferral shall be contingent upon the continued use of the property for the purposes stated in the application.
- b) The continuance of any such tax deferral shall be contingent upon the property remaining in compliance with all town ordinances and codes, including but not limited to building, housing, health and safety codes.
- c) The tax deferral shall cease upon the failure of the property owner to pay any taxes due on said property when due.
- d) Residential properties must be owner-occupied.
- e) Properties owned by not-for-profit organizations will not be eligible for the above tax deferral program.
- f) Improvements funded by the Town are not eligible for the above tax deferral program.
- g) Residential properties where the Rehabilitation does not meet the ten (10%) per cent increased value percent, but does increase the assessed value by at least five (5%) percent, shall have their Town Permit Fees waived with respect to the Rehabilitation.
- h) Non-residential properties where the Rehabilitation does not meet or exceed a twenty-five (25%) percent increase in value, but does increase the assessed value by at least five (5%) percent, shall have their Town Permit Fees waived with respect to the Rehabilitation

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, In the event of a general revaluation in any year after the year in which such Rehabilitation is completed resulting in any increase in the assessment on such real property, only that portion of the increase resulting from such Rehabilitation shall be deferred. Also, in the event of a general revaluation in any year after the year in which such Rehabilitation is completed, such deferred assessment shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the total assessment on such real property as a result of such general revaluation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this resolution shall take effect ten (10) days after publication in a newspaper having a circulation in the Town of East Hartford and shall automatically terminate five (5) years from said effective date, unless extended or renewed by action of the Town Council.
