Susan Kniep, 44-46 and 50 Olde Roberts Street, (1) asked the Council to refer §10-2 of the Town of East Hartford Code of Ordinances to the Ordinance Committee for review; (2) requested, under the Freedom of Information Act, that a list of the original appointment date for individuals who are appointed to the town's boards and commissions be made available to her; (3) requested, under the Freedom of Information Act, a copy of the minutes from meetings that prompted the letters written by Rich Kehoe, Chair of the Town Council, to both Debra Bouchard, Executive Director of the East Hartford Housing Authority, and Robert Keating, Chair of the Board of Commissioners of the East Hartford Housing Authority, both dated October 11, 2012; and (4) suggested that a letter from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, dated October 17, 2012, to Robert Keating, Chair of the Board of Commissioners for the East Hartford Housing Authority, be posted to the town's website.

COMMUNICATIONS AND PETITIONS

East Hartford Chamber of Commerce Update

Tim Coppage, Executive Director of the East Hartford Chamber of Commerce (EHCOC), addressed the Council on the recent changes to the EHCOC. Mr. Coppage stated that the financial stability of the EHCOC has been achieved by matching income and expenses for the upcoming year. Additionally, the Board of Directors of the EHCOC has made a significant investment in the infrastructure of the EHCOC i.e., new logo, new tag line, new website and other marketing strategies.

East Hartford Housing Authority Update

Chair Kehoe stated that the purpose of having the East Hartford Housing Authority (EHHA) on tonight's agenda is to provide the Council with an update on their latest endeavor, the Mayberry Village Scattered Site Program.

Deb Bouchard, Executive Director for the EHHA, (1) highlighted the four development projects that are being worked on: disposition of King Court, Mayberry Village Scattered Site Program, the rehabilitation of Veterans Terrace and the existing EHHA building site on Burnside Avenue; (2) noted that due to the Council's strong suggestion, the EHHA Board of Commissions have implemented evening meetings (every third Wednesday of the month) and are in the beginning stages of their own website, hoping to have it completed in February 2013; (3) stated that a revised recovery plan was submitted to HUD on November 15, 2012, which included a work-out plan and milestones; and (4) said that the EHHA has created a budget line item in the amount of \$10,000 per month to pay back to HUD the commingling of funds on the section 8 housing.

Peter Hance, of the Bridgeport Housing Authority and mentor for the EHHA, and Kelly McDermott, Senior Manager of Planning and Modernization, spoke to the development strategy for the four projects that the EHHA is working on.

Also present at the meeting were the following EHHA Commissioners: Hazel Ann Cook, James Patterson, James Kate and Prescille Yamamoto. Additionally, Joseph Regan, EHHA Finance Director was in attendance.

Resignation of Steven Hudak from the Historic District Commission

Chair Kehoe announced the resignation of Mr. Steven Hudak from the Historic District Commission and thanked him for his service to the town. He suggested that residents interested in serving on any board or commission call the Mayor or Town Council Office for further direction.

NEW BUSINESS

CRCOG Regional Performance Incentive Grant

Whereas Section 5 of Public Act 11-61 (An Act Concerning Responsible Growth) passed by the Connecticut General Assembly provides statewide incentive grants to regional planning organizations for projects that involve shared services; and

Whereas the Capitol Region Council of Governments (CRCOG) is acting as a convener and facilitator of service sharing projects around the CRCOG region; and

Whereas on October 24, 2012 the Policy Board of CRCOG passed a resolution authorizing development and submittal of an application package to the State Office of Policy and Management for funding under the Regional Performance Incentive Grant Program, on behalf of CRCOG's member municipalities, and municipalities of other regions, which are participating in CRCOG initiatives; and

Whereas the Chief Elected Officials and municipal staff of the Capitol Region have developed a list of service sharing project proposals that will be included in the application package, to the benefit of individual municipalities and the region as a whole; and

Whereas, the Town of East Hartford has expressed an interest in taking part in five such project proposals entitled: Code Enforcement Software, Human Resources Town Employee Portal, Call Handling and Response Triage (CHART), Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory and Regional Mutual Disaster Recovery.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the East Hartford Town Council does hereby endorse the above referenced Regional Performance Incentive Program project proposals and authorizes the Mayor, Marcia A. Leclerc, to sign all necessary agreements and take all necessary actions to allow for the town's participation in this program.

Eric Thompson wished all a Merry Christmas.

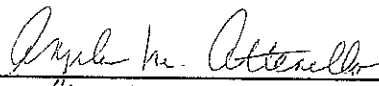

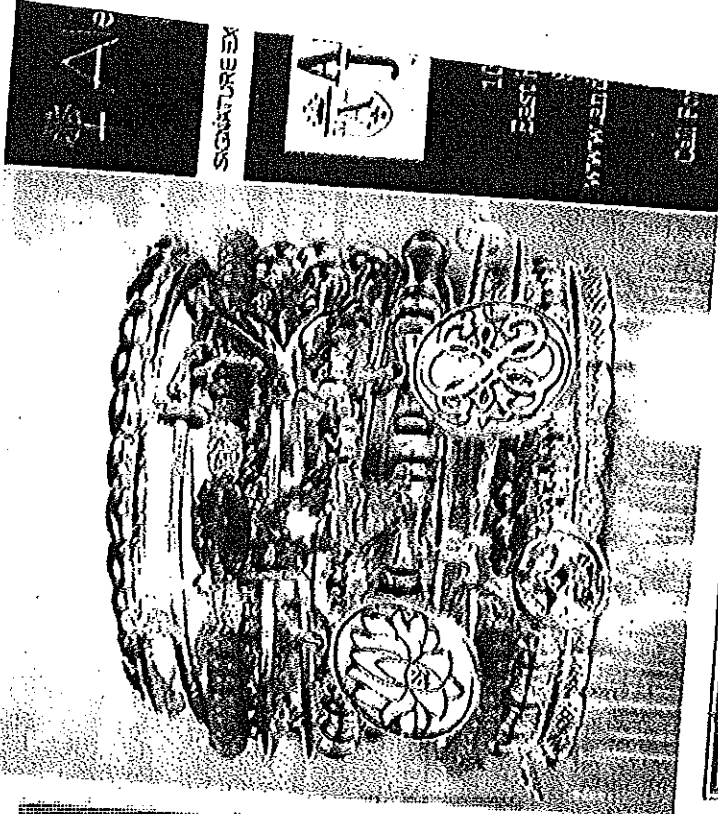

On behalf of myself, the East Lyme Board of Selectmen and the residents of the Town of East Lyme, I would like to express our sincere gratitude for the help you provided to our town in our hours of need.

It was truly a welcome sight and one that brought a sense of relief and a feeling that we were not alone in our mission to make our streets safe and passable. The crew that you sent did a tremendous amount of work and gave our overworked crews a big boost when they really needed it.

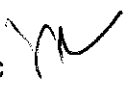

**RE:** Application of Ordinance 10-52 - OPEB Contribution

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In June of 2008, the Town Council adopted the following ordinance:

Section 10-52. Retiree Benefit Trust Fund.

(a) There is established a Retiree Benefit Trust Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide funds to meet long-term obligations of the Town of East Hartford regarding health benefits provided to retired town employees in accordance with provisions for such benefits contained in any agreement between town employees and the Town of East Hartford.

(b) Income to such fund shall include any amounts appropriated to such fund by the town council or as provided in this subsection and any return on investments of such funds. If, at the close of any fiscal year, the undesignated reserve fund for the town exceeds eight percent of the total budget appropriation for such fiscal year, the budget surplus in such fiscal year, as verified by the town auditors, shall be appropriated to the Retiree Benefit Trust Fund.

(c) Expenses of such fund shall include those expenses necessary for the maintenance and administration of the fund, including but not limited to actuary and consulting fees. Fund expenses shall not include compensation of any town employee or other general office-related expenses unless approved by the Town Council.

With respect to the aforementioned ordinance, specifically subsection (b), attached please find a worksheet which calculates the amount of transfer required from Fund Balance to meet the conditions of the ordinance. The transfer of \$1,143,680 will be processed in January and deposited into the OPEB Trust. Please forward this memo to the Town Council as a communication.

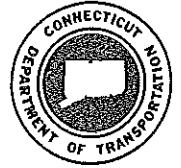

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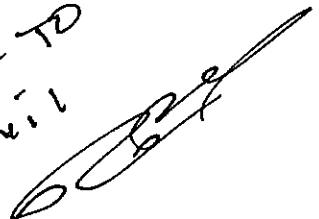
Yesterday, we received original supplemental agreements from the State of Connecticut, Department of Transportation for the design of improvements to Riverside Drive (see attached). The original agreement, dated January 13, 2012, was for a maximum reimbursement to the Town of \$291,000. This supplement, once final, will fully fund our agreement with Parsons Brinkerhoff for the design, which has a value of \$392,174. This is a 100% reimbursement agreement from the federal earmark for the reconstruction of Riverside Drive.

At this point in time, we are sending a copy of the agreement to Rich Gentile in the Corporation Counsel office for his review prior to your signature. The DOT also requires a resolution of the Town Council (see attached) confirming that you are authorized to sign the State-Town agreement. 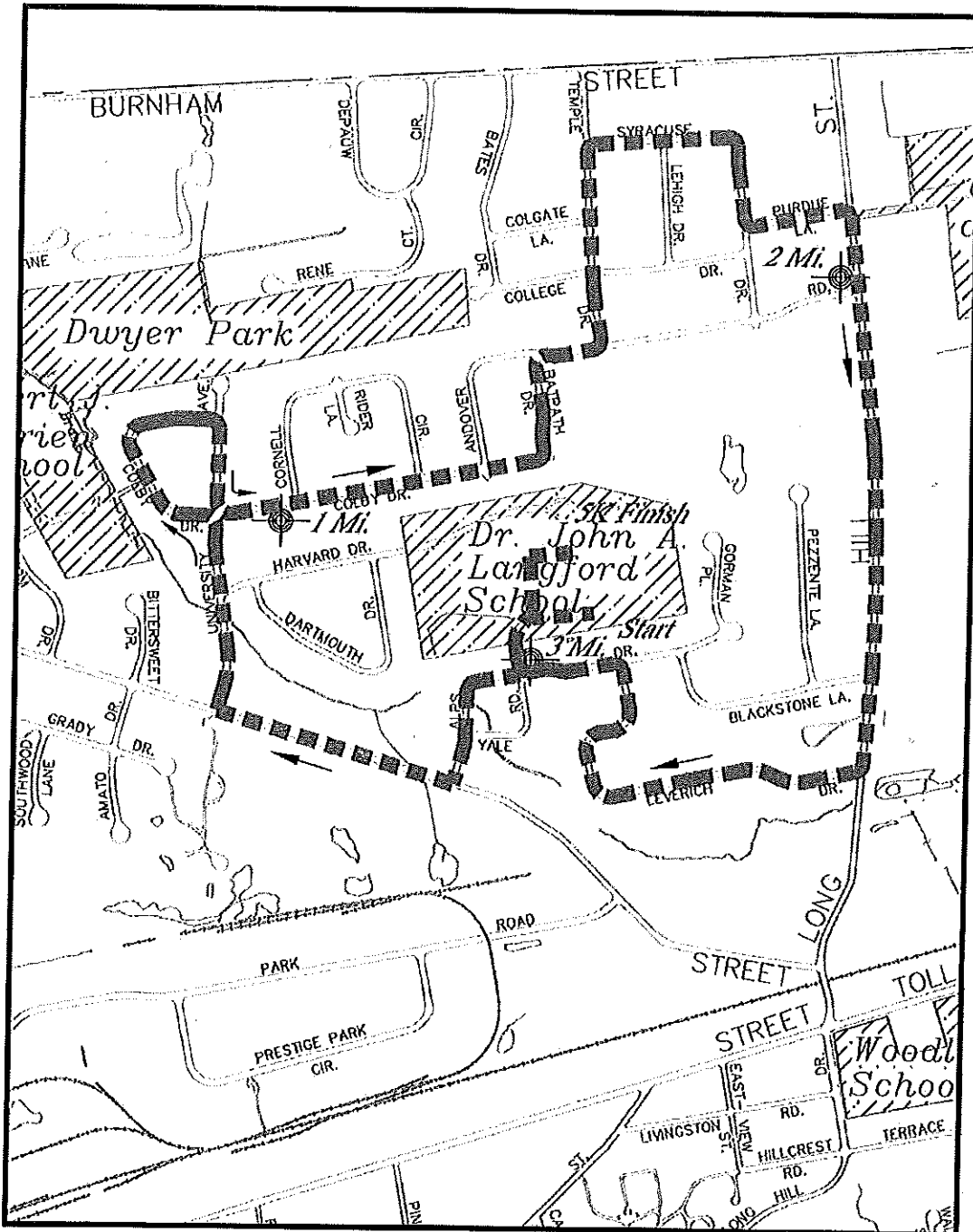
