Chair Kehoe called the public hearing to order at 7:10 p.m.

LEGAL NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that the Town Council of the Town of East Hartford, Connecticut, will hold a public hearing on **Tuesday, August 20, 2013 at 7:00 p.m.** in the Town Council Chambers, 740 Main Street, East Hartford, Connecticut, regarding proposed revisions to the Town of East Hartford Code of Ordinances as follows:

- 1. Section 2-3: Mayor's Salary
- 2. Section 3-30 (c): Relocation of Billboards at 275 Connecticut Boulevard

Any person(s) wishing to express an opinion on this matter may do so at this meeting. Drafts of these revisions are on file in the Town Clerk's office.

Angela Attenello Town Council Clerk

Chair Kehoe explained that the last increase to the Mayor's salary was in November 2008. The proposed revision to the Mayor's Salary will have a twofold purpose. First, it will raise the current salary by 50% of the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) – all urban consumers – for the five year period from 2008 until present, which is 6.9% total. This would equate to a salary of \$87,012. Second, the Mayor's Salary – absent any action by the Town Council – would then increase every November by 50% of the increase in the CPI – all urban consumers – for the previous calendar year.

Chair Kehoe explained the relocation of the billboards located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard. Presently, there are three billboards with four billboard facings at the Martin Motors site. The proposal is to remove those billboards, and in exchange, erect

one billboard with two facings on the Freightliner site (Roberts Street) bordering I-84 with the facings not visible to the property owners on Roberts Street. It was noted that the residents on Roberts Street have been notified of this proposal and of tonight's public hearing. If the Council approves this relocation proposal, the billboard owner would still need to obtain (1) site plan approval from the town's Planning and Zoning Commission; and (2) a permit from the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation. Additionally, Chair Kehoe stated that one of the restrictions in the ordinance is that no adult entertainment businesses can be advertised on the billboards.

The following citizens spoke:

<u>Anita Morrison</u>, 47 Woodbridge Avenue, a candidate for Town Council, was in favor of an increase to the Mayor's salary for this year, and going forward, but not retroactive to the last five years. Ms. Morrison also is not in favor of the electronic billboards, which she finds very distracting.

Susan Kniep, 44-46 and 50 Olde Roberts Street, (1) believes that the Mayor is doing a good job managing the town, but does not agree with an increase to the Mayor's salary at this time due to poor economic conditions. Ms. Kniep stated that any increase to the Mayor's salary approved by the Town Council should be considered year to year, rather than a blanket approval for the years to come. (2) suggested the Town Council hold a forum on healthcare costs for town employees; (3) not in favor of the proposed billboard relocation due to the electronic disposition of the billboard; and (4) said that the property on Connecticut Boulevard where the billboards are presently located should be considered blighted and asked for a list of properties in town that are designated as blighted, if such a list exits.

OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL ON AGENDA ITEMS

<u>Susan Kniep</u>, 44-46 and 50 Olde Roberts Street, asked for clarification on what has been received by the East Hartford Police Department under the Equitable Sharing Agreement Certification Report.

Mayor Leclerc (1) congratulated the recipients of the Beautification Awards that were given out this evening and also recognized the efforts of the Beautification Commission; (2) announced that the town's Social Services Department recently distributed 229 backpacks to school-aged children, K-12, which is an increase over the 170 distributed last year; (3) said that the Highway Division of Public Works is repairing curbs and restriping stop lines on the town's streets; (4) reminded all that there are only two "Sounds of Summer" concerts remaining this year and also stated that the Parks and Recreation Department is getting ready to distribute their Fall Programs brochure after Labor Day; (5) showed the Council the gold medal won by the East Hartford team at the Dragon Boat Race sponsored by Riverfront Recapture defeating teams from the MDC, City of Hartford

and Riverfront Recapture; (6) the East Hartford Police Department issued a safety warning to all residents to be aware of the beginning of the school year on August 28th, the first day of school, by slowing down and stopping for school buses; and (7) there will be two ribbon cuttings soon: the new Holiday Inn East on August 28th and Farmington Bank on September 12th.

Beginning November 11, 2014 and annually thereafter, the Mayor's salary shall increase by fifty percent of the increase in the consumer price index-all urban consumers for the preceding calendar year, provided that the Mayor's salary for November 11, 2013 shall be increased by fifty percent of the consumer price index-all urban consumers for the calendar years 2006 through 2012 inclusive.

OPPORTUNITY FOR COUNCILLORS TO DIRECT QUESTIONS TO THE ADMINISTRATION

Pat Harmon (1) noted the outstanding job that the lifeguards and staff do at Gorman Park; (2) reminded all that the first day of school is August 28th and asked that everyone be aware of children walking to and from school and school buses; (3) inquired on the recent event held at Rentschler Field that generated calls from residents on the noise level from that concert. The Mayor responded that the new managers of Rentschler Field, Global Spectrum, were not aware of the procedures to follow when holding events with loud music at the stadium. This event was a fundraiser for the March of Dimes which attracted thousands of families. She has since met with Global Spectrum and alerted them to the procedural rules to follow, including compliance with town noise ordinances and notification of town officials of such events. (4) asked if the speeding/noise issues that were previously experienced in the Central Avenue neighborhood have been addressed. The Mayor replied that her office has not received any complaints and that the police continue to monitor the situation. (5) inquired on when the window wall replacement at the East Hartford Middle School will begin. The Mayor said that she would have to ask the Board of Education, since it is a school project, not a town project.

Ram Aberasturia suggested having a town-wide bulk waste pick-up on the first Monday in April and October based on funding availability, which would help those residents who could not afford the bulk waste permit fee. The Mayor stated that this issue would have to be referred to the Town Council's Fees Committee for discussion.

Esther Clarke (1) believes that the bulk waste permitting process is not working – people are not aware that a permit must be obtained from Public Works. Councillor Clarke also suggested fining those people who are not in compliance with this ordinance. The Mayor stated that this is an on-going problem, and is working on a possible solution with Tim Bockus, Public Works Director and will likely be presenting this to the Town Council in the near future. (2) asked if the solar panels have gone through the permitting process. The Mayor said she believes that the majority have gone through the permitting process and is hopeful that they will begin the construction process by October.

OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO SPEAK

Travis Simpson, 119 Naubuc Avenue, a candidate for Town Council, thanked the Town Council and the Mayor for their commitment to the town. Mr. Simpson was concerned about the intent of the town to demolish the former Firehouse on Bissell Street, due to its poor physical state. Mr. Simpson asked if the town has a plan for use and maintenance of its real estate and capital assets. The Mayor stated that the town has in place a continuous plan for its real estate and cultural assets. Mayor Leclerc recapped the work done under her administration to improve and maintain all town-owned structures.

Susan Kniep, 44-46 and 50 Olde Roberts Street, (1) has requested copies of letters, agreements, invoices, etc., regarding the services outlined in the contract between the East Hartford Housing Authority (EHHA) with the Bridgeport Housing Authority (BHA) and the status of those bills or invoices. Ms. Kniep will file an FOI request for same, unless the Town Council invites her to review the documentation requested; (2) questioned the relationship between the BHA and the New Haven Housing Authority (NHHA), which was recently appointed overseer of several Housing Authorities that included the BHA; (3) to date, the EHHA has not released any information regarding the purchase of King Court by Goodwin College and asked if the Town Council would put this issue on the next Town Council agenda. Chair Kehoe stated that an update from the EHHA would be scheduled for one of the Town Council meetings in October and that he was aware that the EHHA has not received any invoices form BHA.

Esther Clarke asked the Mayor what the plans were for the Firehouse 5 on Main Street near Brewer Street. The Mayor indicated that the building would eventually be demolished, due to its poor condition - contamination and flooding in the basement. Presently, the Red Cross van is being housed in this location.

Barbara Rossi asked if library books being moved from Raymond Library during its renovation were being stored in Firehouse 5. The Mayor indicated that library books were being professionally stored and not at Firehouse 5. Councillor Rossi also commented on the beautiful landscaping at 364 and 398 Silver Lane, both of which were honored at tonight's meeting with a Beautification Commission award.

<u>Pat Harmon</u> is concerned that the town may be liable for any mold remediation at Firehouse 5 since the basement floods and the Red Cross van – which is not a town vehicle – is stored there.

<u>Bill Horan</u>, a member of the Town Council's Real Estate Acquisition & Disposition Committee, stated that the demolition of a town building is a very expensive undertaking and the town does the best it can with the money it has.

Marc Weinberg noted the landscaping at 398 Silver Lane, owned by the Hahn family, which received a Beautification Commission award this evening.

Ram Aberasturia noted the passing of Lillian Peterson, mother of Councillor Linda Russo and the passing of Patrick Walsh, father of Finance Director Michael Walsh.

DRAFT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF EAST HARTFORD, MARTIN MOTORS, LLC, THE O'MEARA FOUNDATION AND THE 1900 CORPORATION RE: RELOCATION OF BILLBOARDS

June 5, 2013

This agreement is made this _____ day of June, 2013 by and between the Town of East Hartford ("Town") and The 1900 Corporation, Martin Motors, LLC and The O'Meara Foundation, Inc. (collectively referred to as "1900 Corp").

WHEREAS, the 1900 Corporation will secure the outdoor advertising rights at certain properties in the Town as the assignee of Martin Motors, LLC and The O'Meara Foundation, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the billboards where such outdoor advertising rights exist currently impact the appearance of certain residential and/or commercial districts;

WHEREAS, the Town desires to reduce the overall number of billboards in town through the elimination of existing billboards at the end of their useful life;

WHEREAS, the Town's longstanding policy, as articulated through its ordinances, is to reduce the overall number of billboards in town through the elimination of existing billboards at the end of its useful life;

WHEREAS, the 1900 Corp is willing to permanently extinguish the outdoor advertising rights it has secured at the existing locations on Connecticut Boulevard, provided it can transfer rights to other locations along portions of Interstate 84 as authorized by Town ordinance and the East Hartford Zoning Regulations; and

NOW, THEREFORE, The Town and 1900 Corp hereby agree as follows:

1. Permission to Erect a New Billboard: The Town will grant an exception to the prohibition against construction of new billboards pursuant to Town of East Hartford Code of Ordinance Section 3-30 (c) to allow construction of one billboard structure with two electronic display panels, one electronic display panel facing east to westbound traffic and one electronic display panel facing west to eastbound traffic, to be located on property located at 199 Roberts Street, ("New Billboards") on the location indicated on the attached Site Plan (Exhibit A). The New Billboards will be no larger than 14 feet by 48 feet. In addition, each New Billboard allowed under this Agreement will be subject to the billboard zoning regulations effective August 30, 2006, as amended, a copy of which are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B, including but not limited to any necessary site plan approvals.

- 2. Extinguishment of Rights: Prior to constructing the New Billboards, 1900 Corp will provide to the Town documentation from the owner of the property where the existing billboards are located. Such documentation shall be in a form satisfactory to the Town and will provide evidence of the property owner's intent to permanently extinguish any and all outdoor advertising rights at the following locations:
 - a. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard (approximately 14' by 48', or 672 square feet);
 - b. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard on Connecticut Boulevard approximately 300 feet west of South Prospect Street (approximately 10.6' by 22.9', or 242.74 square feet);
 - c. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard on Connecticut Boulevard approximately 150 feet west of South Prospect Street (approximately 10.6' b 22.9', or approximately 242.74 square feet);
 - d. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard on Connecticut Boulevard approximately 150 feet west of South Prospect Street (10.6' by 22.9', or approximately 242.74 square feet).

Such documentation shall include, but not be limited to, a written declaration executed by Martin Motors, LLC, The O'Meara Foundation, Inc., The 1900 Corporation and all other parties that have or may claim any interest in outdoor advertising rights at the above locations permanently extinguishing any and all outdoor advertising rights with respect to the above locations (the "Declaration"). The Declaration will affirm that all state and local licenses or permits with respect to the above locations have been terminated and that all necessary summary process proceedings have been successfully concluded with respect to any and all parties claiming an interest in such locations. The Declaration shall become effective only upon the completion of all required local and state permitting of the New Billboards at which time the Declaration shall be recorded in the land records of the Town. The form of the Declaration is attached as Exhibit B.

- 3. <u>Prohibition on Contract</u>: 1900 Corp agrees that it will not allow any advertisements of adult-oriented establishments or adult cabarets as defined in section 200 of the East Hartford Zoning Regulations, as the same may be amended from time to time or of any sexually oriented business as defined in Section 8-61 of the Town of East Hartford Ordinances, as the same may be amended from time to time, on the New Billboards or any other billboards it may own or control in any fashion in East Hartford.
- 4. Amendment: This Agreement can only be modified by a written agreement duly signed by the persons authorized to sign agreements on behalf of the Town and 1900 Corp.

- 5. Severability: The invalidity or unenforceability of one or more provisions of this Agreement shall not affect any other provision of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Governing Law</u>: This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Connecticut. The parties agree to the jurisdiction and venue of the courts located in Hartford Superior Court.
- 7. <u>Complete Agreement</u>: This Agreement is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties as to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all communications between the parties related to the subject matter of this Agreement. Each party represents and warrants to the other that it has full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement.
- 8. Waiver and Default: A waiver of a breach or default under this Agreement shall not be a waiver of any other or subsequent breach of default. The failure or delay in enforcing compliance with any term or condition of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of such term or condition.
- 9. <u>Transfer and Assignment</u>: This Agreement and rights, duties and obligations accruing to 1900 Corp under this Agreement are not transferable or assignable. Any attempt by 1900 Corp to transfer or assign this Agreement or any of its rights, duties or obligations under this Agreement is void. Notwithstanding the foregoing, 1900 Corp or its successor may, upon written notice and consent of the Town which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, assign its rights and obligations, to an entity which acquires all or substantially all of its assets or which acquires voting control through a purchase or merger.
- 10. Removal of Existing billboards: 1900 Corp agrees that the billboards listed in paragraph 2, above, will be removed, the existing gas station and asphalt parking area demolished, the underlying properly cleared and landscaped to the reasonable satisfaction of the town, and the underlying property's use as offsite parking lot abandoned, within one year of the granting of all permits required by the Town and the State of Connecticut for the construction of the New Billboards and prior to the erection of the New Billboards. In the event that said conditions are not met within said time this Agreement shall, at the option of the Town of East Hartford, be null and void upon thirty (30) days written notice.
- 11. <u>Indemnification</u>: 1900 Corp will indemnify, defend and hold the town and its officials, officers, agents, and employees harmless from and against any and all cost, expenses, losses, attorney's fees, and liabilities resulting in any way from this Agreement, including but not limited to the claim of the current or future owner(s) of the property where the billboards listed in Paragraph 2 are located any third parties that leasehold, license or property rights have not been extinguished or that there had been an interference with contractual rights.
- 12. <u>Town Use</u>: The 1900 Corp agrees to allow the Town to use one electronic billboard turn on each New Billboard facing for at least fourteen (14) calendar days each year for public

service announcements. The dates of such use shall vary from year to year based upon availability. The 1900 Corp will bear the reasonable costs for the artwork and installation of such billboard advertising, and there will be no fee for the use of such billboard facing by the Town.

13. <u>Duration</u>: Pursuant to Section 3-30(c)(iii) of Town Ordinances, 1900 Corp agrees to remove the New Billboards no later than forty (40) years from the date of the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for the erection of the new billboard following the granting of permits required for the New Billboards by the Town and State of Connecticut.




EXHIBIT B DECLARATION OF TERMINATION OF BILLBOARD RIGHTS

Martin Motors, LLC, The O'Meara Foundation, Inc., and The 1900 Corporation, as successor to the interests of Martin Motors, LLC and the O'Meara Foundation, Inc.(the "Declarants") hereby declare their intent to forever extinguish, abandon and terminate the Billboard Rights existing at the following locations:

- 1. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard (approximately 14' by 48', or 672 square feet);
- 2. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard on Connecticut Boulevard approximately 300 feet west of South Prospect Street (approximately 10.6' by 22.9', or 242.74 square feet);
- 3. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard on Connecticut Boulevard approximately 150 feet west of South Prospect Street (approximately 10.6' by 22.9', or approximately 242.74 square feet);
- 4. One billboard located at 275 Connecticut Boulevard on Connecticut Boulevard approximately 150 feet west of South Prospect Street (10.6' by 22.9', or approximately 242.74 square feet).

As employed herein, the term "Billboard Rights" is defined as the exclusive authority, subject to federal, state and municipal legislative regulatory constraints, to lease, own, maintain and operate billboard structures at specific geographic locations for the purpose of exhibiting signs as a medium to communicate information, publicity, and advertising to the general public.

The Declarants affirm that all municipal, state and federal license and/or permits with respect to the above-listed locations have been terminated and that all necessary summary process proceedings have been successfully concluded with respect to any and all parties known to claim an interest in or possession of outdoor advertising rights at the above-identified locations.

Nothing contained in this declaration shall be construed to limit the rights of the Declarants, their successors and assigns, with respect to the erection, maintenance, repair and replacement of business signs announcing or advertising any business or activity taking place on the premises where the sign is located.

Tax Liens - Mobile Homes

As you know, there are a substantial number of outstanding tax liens on various mobile homes in East Hartford. The Town finds it increasingly difficult to collect these taxes. First, the taxes owed are often substantially in excess of the value of the homes. Second, even if the Town were to foreclose on the homes (and collect a portion of what is owed), it would have to immediately remove the homes (at an estimated expense of \$1,000. - \$1,500. per unit) and thereby lose more money. As a result, taxes continue to grow and are carried for up to 15 years as uncollectible on our tax "suspense" tax list.

The town has tried to sell these liens at full value numerous times through the years. The most recent tax lien sale brought a full value bid that was later withdrawn. The bid was withdrawn based on the fact that the owner of a mobile home park in Connecticut has substantial power under state law to evict tenants and completely wipe out a tax lien. Accordingly, purchasing liens at full value is risky and could lead to substantial (or complete) losses for the bidder.

VMF TL1, LLC, which withdrew its original bid, has come back to the Town with a new offer. They will purchase all the outstanding tax liens on the attached list for a flat \$5,000.00. All risk of collection would be on the bidder. The Town would be able to resolve all outstanding taxes on these mobile homes in one step.

If the Town Council wishes to accept this bid, it may do so through the following motion:

MOVE: That the Town Council waive the bidding requirements set forth in the Town of East Hartford Code of Ordinances §10-7 and, pursuant to C.G.S. §12-195, assign tax liens as set forth on Exhibit A of a letter from VMF TL1, LLC to Michael Walsh, Finance Director dated August 8, 2013, to VMF TL1, LLC for the total sum of \$5,000.00.






