CALL TO ORDER

Chair Kehoe called the meeting to order at 8:15 p.m. The Chair announced the exit locations in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes §29-381, after which the Council joined him in the pledge of allegiance.

OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL ON AGENDA ITEMS

Susan Kniep, Olde Roberts Street, (1) believes that the taxpayers have a right to comment on any executive session matters before Council action; (2) inquired if Billy Casper Golf LLC (BCG) is licensed to conduct business in the state of Connecticut; (3) suggest that the town's contract with MDM Golf LLC be referred to the Town Council's Investigation and Audit Committee; (4) asked that the Council send the BCG contract to referendum; and (5) wished Eric Thompson well in his future endeavors.

Mayor Lecterc updated the Council on (1) the town's Parks and Recreation Department is holding registration for its rapidly expanding winter basketball program; (2) the Boo Bash held on Saturday, October 26th was a success with over 300 tickets sold; (3) the Annual Elementary Cross Country run will be held on Saturday, November 2nd at McAuliffe Park: (4) a flu clinic will be held at the south end Senior Center on Friday, November 1st; (5) since October is Fire Prevention month, Fire Chief Oates asked the Mayor to remind all residents to check the operation of their smoke alarms and C.O. detectors; (6) the East Hartford Police Department's K-9 Division was highlighted at the recent Connecticut Pet Expo where they were holding demonstrations; (7) the town's curbside leaf collection will commence on Monday, November 4th, starting at Governor Street and proceeding clockwise throughout town. The Mayor also stated that this year, in addition to the call-in phone number, residents can access an updated map posted to the town's website each Friday, showing progress made and neighborhoods scheduled for upcoming collection; (8) the public information meeting on the expansion of the Hockanum River Linear Trail will be held on Wednesday, October 30th at 7PM in the Welling Conference Room here in Town Hall; and (9) the 2013 Road Improvement Project made significant progress despite a late start - all asphalt apron work started, but some were not completed and will be finished by the end of the year; any tree belt grass restoration might have to wait until the spring.

COMMUNICATIONS AND PETITIONS

East Hartford Golf Course Update

Michael Walsh, Finance Director, summarized the progress the town has made with the BCG contract. Mr. Walsh, along with <u>Tim Bockus</u>, Public Works Director, <u>Rich Gentile</u>, Assistant Corporation Counsel, and <u>Gregg Verallis</u>, Facilities Manager, met with three employees of BCG at the East Hartford Golf Course to review what needed to be done during the transition phase of the management of the course. Below is an excerpt from the October 28th memo from Mike Walsh which highlights the proposed changes to the course:

- On October 18th, BCG sent three of their staff to walk the golf course. BCG were pleased with the size and layout of the pro-shop as well as the equipment located in the kitchen, the bar area, and restaurant.
- 2. BCG recommends removing the drop ceiling in the basement area and treating for mold growth. Once treated, a new drop ceiling should be reinstalled.
- The restaurant is planned to reopen on March 15, 2014. BCG likes the exposure of the restaurant to the traffic on Longhill Street.
- 4. The Golf Course will be renamed East Hartford Golf Course.
- 5. Coffee and a cooler full of beverages will be made available from the pro shop.
- 6. BCG, once under contract, will "blitz" the course cutting greens, fairways, and rough. They will apply winter fertilizer and other chemical applications to prevent winter mold growth, and they will operate the sprinkler system before they close it to understand how it works.
- 7. Former Superintendent Steve Foran will lend his expertise to BCG as needed.
- The course will remain open into November (walking only), weather permitting, to allow BCG to begin the process of setting up marketing, a website, and to conduct meet and greets to publicize the new operators and to sell season passes.
- 9. No investment in golf carts or maintenance equipment will be made until early 2014.

- 10. The house along the first fairway will be used as the home for the new superintendent, a BCG employee. An onsite employee will reduce the opportunities for vandalism and theft at the course. It also provides a more stable environment for that employee.
- 11. BCG remarked that the gas system, the butter building storage, and the three bay maintenance shed were all positive attributes of the course.
- 12. Items in need of immediate attention include:
 - o Mold remediation in the basement
 - o New drop ceiling in the basement
 - Fencing around the dumpster
 - Dig out the stump behind the 9th green and curb/landscape the island
 - o Install the flag pole on the newly renovated island
 - Cart away all the brush (and red stockade fencing) behind the red stockade fencing behind the first green
 - Add a white split rail fence along Longhill Street
- BCG has priced out the value of the existing restaurant equipment for the Town for negotiation purposes.
- 14. The Town and BCG continue to work through contract negotiations. The Council's resolution set the acceptable framework and the negotiations are going well with a resolution expected shortly.
- 15. BCG will have an agronomist onsite Wednesday (10/30) making a list of chemicals needed to be applied to close the course for the winter so that it can be properly opened in the spring.
- 16. MDM is vacating the course effective with the end of the business day on October 31, 2013.

Rochambeau Senior Apartments - Senior Safety

<u>Chair Kehoe</u> announced that a thank-you letter was received by Chief of Police Mark Sirois from the Rochambeau residents who attended a presentation given by Sargent Peter Vanek on safety issues that seniors face in their own homes.

2013 Leaf Collection Schedule

<u>Chair Kehoe</u> reiterated what the Mayor reported: the town will begin collection of curbside leaf collection on Monday, November 4th at the Governor Street neighborhood and proceed clockwise throughout town. There will only be one curbside collection, but the town will continue to pick up bagged leaves until December 13th, weather permitting.

CT Veterans' Day Parade

<u>Chair Kehoe</u> stated that this year's Veterans' Day Parade will be held on Sunday, November 3rd in Hartford. He urged residents to attend this event to honor all veterans, especially those who have paid the ultimate price for our freedom. Councillor Clarke announced that the town's Patriotic Commission will be placing American flags at gravesites on Saturday, November 1st, starting at 8AM in Hillside Cemetery. Volunteers are welcomed.

Resignation of Gloria Visgilio-Lupi from the Historic District Commission

<u>Chair Kehoe</u> announced that Ms. Visgilio-Lupi is resigning from the Historic District Commission and thanked her for her participation in that commission and for her commitment to the town.

Bernie, I am sure I will see you today. Adding Marcia to this email as well. Sorry for the delay, but I need to look up the statute and compare it to the charge of the Veterans Commission. Most of the public act's duties and responsibilities mirror what is expected of the East Hartford Veterans Commission but I would feel more comfortable making it explicit in the ordinance. Further, the ordinance has the mayor designate a veterans' agent. I don't know who that is. So, the interrelationship between the commission and the designated agent should be clarified. For reference, below is the public act and the town ordinance. Angela, please put this on the agenda for the next council meeting as a referral to Ordinance:

Public Act:

Sec. 2. Section 27-135 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2013*):

- (a) Any city or town, either separately or with one or more other cities and towns, may, by ordinance, establish a local veterans' advisory committee which shall have the responsibility of carrying out locally the duties and purposes of this section and, within their charter powers and as otherwise provided by law, may make available to such local committees the necessary funds to carry out their duties and responsibilities. The committee may [(a)] (1) act as the coordinating agency in all matters concerning veterans and their dependents, coordinating the activities of public and private facilities concerned with veterans' reemployment, education, rehabilitation and adjustment to peacetime living; [(b)] (2) cooperate with all national, state and local governmental and private agencies in securing services and benefits to which a veteran or his dependents may be entitled; [(c)] (3) use the services and facilities of the veterans organizations so far as possible to carry out the purposes of this section; and [(d)] (4) encourage and coordinate vocational training services for veterans.
- (b) Any city or town that (1) has not established a local veterans' advisory committee pursuant to subsection (a) of this section, and (2) does not otherwise provide funding for a veterans' service officer shall designate a city or town employee to serve as a veterans' service contact person in such city or town. Any city or town employee designated as a veterans' service contact person shall carry out the duties described in subsection (a) of this section and may complete an annual training course conducted by the veterans' advocacy and assistance unit, as described in subsection (b) of section 27-102*l*, as amended by this act.

Approved May 24, 2013

Town Ordinance:

Section 2-113a. Veterans' Affairs Agent

The mayor shall designate a town employee as the agent for veterans' affairs. The designated employee may collect relevant information concerning veterans' issues, refer veterans to the commission on veterans' affairs as appropriate, and provide such other assistance to veterans as the mayor shall require.

Section 2-113b. Veteran's Affairs Commission

- (a) There is established a commission on veterans' affairs. The commission shall consist of nine members. At least six members shall be residents of East Hartford. Such members shall be appointed for a two year term. In addition, the agent for veterans' affairs designated pursuant to Section one, shall serve as an ex-officio member of the commission on veterans' affairs.
- (b) The commission shall serve as a resource for information concerning federal, state and local benefits and services for veterans, active duty personnel and their families. The commission shall compile contact information from federal and state veterans' affairs agencies and veterans' advocacy groups. The commission may coordinate the scheduling of regular hours for veterans' advocates to meet with veterans at town hall or other town facilities. The commission may assist the mayor and the agent for veterans' affairs in communicating matters of interest to veterans, active duty personnel and their families in the town of East Hartford.

Recently, (10/21/13) the above Board received a written opinion, which mirrored a previously given oral presentation (7/24/13) from Corporation Counsel. This opinion changed the Board's procedure and here-to-fore assumed authority based on years of routine and practice.

This opinion gives only the administration the authority to accept letters from employees seeking to retire, as well as to mathematically prepare the retirement calculations for that employee and to send out the funds to that employee at its pleasure. Somehow though, the Pension and Retirement Board, at least at this time, still seems to have authority and is continuing to send these calculations to an outside firm to have the mathematics of the numbers, reviewed.

In view of the change in procedure caused by this legal opinion recently received by the Board, as well as the previously thought reduction of authority to accept and approve retirements, I would ask that the Town Council refer this matter to the Ordinance Committee to review the matter in order to verify that the Council's intentions and authority previously assumed given to the Pension and Retirement Board is in agreement with the Council's wishes and balance of power.

Acquisition of 355 Maple Street

The State of Connecticut, Department of Transportation (DOT) has offered the property at 355 Maple Street to the Town of East Hartford. This property is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Maple Street and Forbes Street. The DOT acquired the parcel for the now defunct I-491 project in 1967 and the dwelling on the property was subsequently demolished. Currently, Public Works employees maintain the vacant property including mowing and maintaining the trees.

The terms of the acquisition are outlined in the attached correspondence from the Property Management Section of the DOT Division of Right of Way. The DOT has set a release price of \$1,000.00 for the 0.41 acre parcel. Your signature is required on the *Release Negotiation and Closing Report*. When the report and release monies are forwarded to the DOT, they will forward the original of the quit claim deed, endorsed on May 29, 2013, so it can be recorded on the Town's land records.

In order for the Town to acquire the parcel, a request must be submitted to the Town Council per Town Ordinance Section 10-18 (a) & (b). As indicated in Rich Gentile's July 8, 2013 memorandum (attached), environmental information in the form of a phase one environmental assessment was needed for the property. Our consultant Milone and MacBroom has completed an assessment and concluded that "the Phase I ESA did not reveal the presence of recognized environmental conditions at the subject site." The main body of the report is also attached to this memorandum.

At this time, the acquisition of this property should be referred to the Real Estate Acquisition and Disposition Committee of the Town Council.





OPM Regional Performance Incentive Grants 2013 Round CRCOG Policy Board Approved October 23, 2013

1. Regional Nutmeg Network Connections (estimate will depend on participating towns) – new for 2013 CRCOG would submit a regional Nutmeg Network connection grant application on behalf of CRCOG towns who do not wish to submit an individual application. Given that regional projects are a legislative priority, CRCOG staff believes this will make the connection applications stronger by submitting them jointly. In addition, CRCOG would bear the relative burden of negotiating the OPM grant process on behalf of the participating towns. Staff Contact: Pauline Yoder: pyoder@crcog.org, (860) 522-2217 x245.

2. Regional Data / Disaster Recovery Center (estimated \$500K) - new for 2013

Taking advantage of the Nutmeg Network, CRCOG would establish a self service Data / Disaster Recovery Center for towns to use either via self-service servers, or with consultant and implementation assistance. The Data Center would operate out of two locations for backup purposes. Towns could use the data center for disaster recovery, replacement of aging servers, new applications and replacement of existing applications. In addition, CRCOG would use this as a platform to create additional shared regional applications, as well as moving existing applications, such as Regional Permitting and GIS to the Nutmeg Network, giving quicker access for towns and removing dependence on the Internet. 3. Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory (estimated \$250K) – revised from 2012

CRCOG staff is working in conjunction with the Capitol Region Chiefs of Police Association to further the concept of a regional forensics laboratory dedicated to computer crimes. With the increase in computer crimes (including online fraud and financial crimes, digital production and dissemination of child pornography, online predators seeking child victims, stalking, harassment, and threatening) there is an overload at the State Laboratory and municipalities are often doing this work on their own. This project proposes to provide equipment, software licenses and training. Participating municipalities would assign investigators to the lab who in turn would receive and maintain the training necessary to successfully resolve these complex investigations for their agencies. 4. <u>Human Resources On-line Clearinghouse and Templates (estimated \$65,000) — revised from 2012</u>

The Planning and Zoning Commission (PZC) approval of the Connecticut River Academy (CTRA) required Goodwin College to provide sidewalk and drainage easements to the Town of East Hartford. The easements are illustrated on the attached plan (EMT-1 "Proposed Easement Map", dated November 3, 2013).


The sidewalk easements were initially required to accommodate the CTRA development. One easement is necessary to account for a drop-off area along Riverside Drive that shifts part of the sidewalk onto the CRTA property (Sidewalk Easement #2). A second easement is needed because the curb line at the southwest corner of the intersection of Riverside Drive and Colt Street #2 was coincident with the right-of-way line, making it impossible to install sidewalk in the right-of-way at that location (Sidewalk Easement #1).

Unrelated to the CTRA development, at an October 10, 2013, meeting the Connecticut Department of Transportation (DOT) asked for permanent easements related to the reconstruction of Riverside Drive, which is a federally funded project currently in the last stages of design. The permanent easements are at two locations where small portions of the sidewalk that need to be built with permanent materials by the road reconstruction are on the CTRA property (Sidewalk Easements #3 & #4). In order to expedite the easement process and not delay reconstruction of Riverside Drive, which is scheduled for 2014, the Town requested these two additional easement areas from Goodwin College.

Drainage easements were required by the PZC at locations where the storm drainage system on Riverside Drive discharged into the storm drainage system on the CTRA property. The construction of the CTRA required that a portion of Riverside Drive was raised to keep the road out of the 500-year flood zone. In making that change, the storm drainage on Riverside Drive was re-routed onto the CTRA property. The three drainage easements shown on the attached plan encompass the first storm drainage structure on the CTRA property, allowing the Town access for maintenance purposes. The written easement will provide for the right to drain across the balance of the CTRA property.

Since the easements are needed prior to Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) approval to bid the reconstruction of Riverside Drive and the approval may take 2 to 3 months, we request that the easements be considered by the full Town Council at the next meeting and not referred to the Real Estate Acquisition and Disposition Subcommittee. The reconstruction of Riverside Drive cannot be delayed without potentially losing \$1.15M in grant monies from the Economic Development Administration since the funding carries an April 14, 2014, deadline for the construction to commence.

Please request that the resolution is placed on the upcoming Town Council agenda.

I am a grade one teacher at Pitkin school. On Wednesday, October 9, 2013 at about 1:40pm I was informed that my car, which was parked legally in the lot, was hit by one of the maintenance workers as he mowed the lawn. Please refer to the police report case number 2013-27899 taken by East Hartford Police Officer Piacenta #189.

I am requesting full payment for the damages caused by the accident as well as the rental car charge while my car is being repaired. United Auto Body located in East Hartford assessed the repair at \$2538,05 and estimated the time for repair would be one week, see attached. The car rental will be from Enterprise Rental located on Williams Street in Glastonbury. The estimated cost for the mid-size 4-door car rental is \$241.26 for the week.
